## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 40 and 60 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 66/40)

Sec. 40. Non-resident license applications.

8 (a) For the purposes of this Section, "non-resident" means 9 a person who has not resided within this State for more than 30 10 days and resides in another state or territory.

(b) The Department shall by rule allow for non-resident license applications from any state or territory of the United States with laws related to firearm ownership, possession, and carrying, that are substantially similar to the requirements to obtain a license under this Act.

16 (c) A resident of a state or territory approved by the Department under subsection (b) of this Section may apply for a 17 non-resident license. The applicant shall apply to the 18 19 Department and must meet all of the qualifications established in Section 25 of this Act, except for the Illinois residency 20 21 requirement in item (xiv) of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. The 22 applicant shall submit: 23

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(1) the application and documentation required under
 Section 30 of this Act and the applicable fee;

3

(2) a notarized document stating that the applicant:

4 (A) is eligible under federal law and the laws of
5 his or her state or territory of residence to own or
6 possess a firearm;

(B) if applicable, has a license or permit to carry
a firearm or concealed firearm issued by his or her
state or territory of residence and attach a copy of
the license or permit to the application;

(C) understands Illinois laws pertaining to the
 possession and transport of firearms; and

(D) acknowledges that the applicant is subject to
the jurisdiction of the Department and Illinois courts
for any violation of this Act;

16 (3) a photocopy of any certificates or other evidence
17 of compliance with the training requirements under Section
18 75 of this Act; and

(4) a head and shoulder color photograph in a size
specified by the Department taken within the 30 days
preceding the date of the application.

(d) In lieu of an Illinois driver's license or Illinois
identification card, a non-resident applicant shall provide
similar documentation from his or her state or territory of
residence. In lieu of a valid Firearm Owner's Identification
Card, the applicant shall submit documentation and information

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1 required by the Department to obtain a Firearm Owner's 2 Identification Card, including an affidavit that the 3 non-resident meets the mental health standards to obtain a 4 firearm under Illinois law, and the Department shall ensure 5 that the applicant would meet the eligibility criteria to 6 obtain a Firearm Owner's Identification card if he or she was a 7 resident of this State.

8 (e) Nothing in this Act shall prohibit a non-resident from 9 transporting a concealed firearm within his or her vehicle in 10 Illinois, if the concealed firearm remains within his or her 11 vehicle and the non-resident:

12 (1) is not prohibited from owning or possessing a 13 firearm under federal law;

14 (2) is eligible to carry a firearm in public under the
15 laws of his or her state or territory of residence, as
16 evidenced by the possession of a concealed carry license or
17 permit issued by his or her state of residence, if
18 applicable; and

19 (3) is not in possession of a license under this Act.

If the non-resident leaves his or her vehicle unattended, he or she shall store the firearm within a locked vehicle or locked container within the vehicle in accordance with subsection (b) of Section 65 of this Act.

(f) Notwithstanding whether the laws of the state or
 territory where the non-resident resides related to firearm
 ownership, possession, and carrying, are substantially similar

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1	to the requirements to obtain a license under this Act, the
2	Department shall, no later than 120 days after the effective
3	date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly, allow
4	for a non-resident license application if the applicant is an
5	active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States who
6	is stationed in this State and lives in this State. A
7	non-resident active duty member of the Armed Forces of the
8	United States who is stationed in this State and lives in this
9	State shall apply to the Department and must meet all of the
10	qualifications established in Section 25 of this Act and shall
11	submit:
12	(1) the application and documentation required under
13	subsection (b) of Section 30 of this Act and the applicable
14	fee;
15	(2) a photocopy of a valid military identification card
16	or Official Proof of Service Letter; and
17	(3) a photocopy of permanent change-of-station orders
18	to an assignment in this State.
19	<u>In lieu of an Illinois driver's license or Illinois</u>
20	identification card, a non-resident applicant under this
21	subsection (f) shall provide similar documentation from his or
22	her state or territory of residence. A non-resident licensee
23	approved under this subsection (f) shall notify the Department
24	30 days following a permanent change of station move to an
25	assignment outside of this State and shall surrender his or her
26	license to the Department. A license issued under this

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subsection (f) shall expire on the earlier date of: (i) 5 years 1 2 from the date of issuance; or (ii) the date the licensee's 3 assignment in this State terminates. The Department may adopt rules necessary to implement the provisions of this amendatory 4 5 Act of the 99th General Assembly through the use of emergency rulemaking in accordance with Section 5-45 of the Illinois 6 7 Administrative Procedure Act for a period not to exceed 180 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 8 9 99th General Assembly. 10 (Source: P.A. 98-63, eff. 7-9-13; 98-600, eff. 12-6-13; 99-78,

(a) All fees collected under this Act shall be deposited as
provided in this Section. Application, renewal, and
replacement fees shall be non-refundable.

(b) An applicant for a new license or a renewal shall submit \$150 with the application, of which \$120 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$20 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

(c) A non-resident applicant for a new license or renewal shall submit \$300 with the application, of which \$250 shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$40 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and SB0553 Engrossed - 6 - LRB099 03304 MGM 23312 b

1 \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

(d) A licensee requesting a new license in accordance with
Section 55 shall submit \$75, of which \$60 shall be apportioned
to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$5 shall be
apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall
be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

7 <u>(e) An applicant for a new license or a renewal who is a</u> 8 <u>non-resident active duty member of the Armed Forces of the</u> 9 <u>United States stationed in this State shall submit \$150 with</u> 10 <u>the application, of which \$120 shall be apportioned to the</u> 11 <u>State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$20 shall be apportioned to</u> 12 <u>the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall be apportioned</u> 13 <u>to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.</u>

## Section 10. The Wildlife Code is amended by adding Section 3.4b as follows:

17 (520 ILCS 5/3.4b new)

Sec. 3.4b. Exemption. Persons licensed to possess a concealed firearm under the Firearm Concealed Carry Act and current or retired police officers authorized by law to possess a concealed firearm shall be exempt from provisions of this Code prohibiting possession of those firearms.
