1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Sections 4-203 and 18a-300 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/4-203) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 4-203)

Sec. 4-203. Removal of motor vehicles or other vehicles;
Towing or hauling away.

9 (a) When a vehicle is abandoned, or left unattended, on a 10 toll highway, interstate highway, or expressway for 2 hours or 11 more, its removal by a towing service may be authorized by a 12 law enforcement agency having jurisdiction.

(b) When a vehicle is abandoned on a highway in an urban district 10 hours or more, its removal by a towing service may be authorized by a law enforcement agency having jurisdiction.

(c) When a vehicle is abandoned or left unattended on a highway other than a toll highway, interstate highway, or expressway, outside of an urban district for 24 hours or more, its removal by a towing service may be authorized by a law enforcement agency having jurisdiction.

(d) When an abandoned, unattended, wrecked, burned or partially dismantled vehicle is creating a traffic hazard because of its position in relation to the highway or its SB0674 Engrossed - 2 - LRB099 06602 RJF 26675 b

physical appearance is causing the impeding of traffic, its immediate removal from the highway or private property adjacent to the highway by a towing service may be authorized by a law enforcement agency having jurisdiction.

5 (e) Whenever a peace officer reasonably believes that a person under arrest for a violation of Section 11-501 of this 6 Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance is likely, 7 8 upon release, to commit a subsequent violation of Section 9 11-501, or a similar provision of a local ordinance, the 10 arresting officer shall have the vehicle which the person was 11 operating at the time of the arrest impounded for a period of 12 not more than 12 hours after the time of arrest. However, such vehicle may be released by the arresting law enforcement agency 13 14 prior to the end of the impoundment period if:

15 (1) the vehicle was not owned by the person under 16 arrest, and the lawful owner requesting such release 17 possesses a valid operator's license, proof of ownership, and would not, as determined by the arresting law 18 19 enforcement agency, indicate a lack of ability to operate a 20 motor vehicle in a safe manner, or who would otherwise, by 21 operating such motor vehicle, be in violation of this Code; 22 or

(2) the vehicle is owned by the person under arrest,
 and the person under arrest gives permission to another
 person to operate such vehicle, provided however, that the
 other person possesses a valid operator's license and would

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not, as determined by the arresting law enforcement agency, indicate a lack of ability to operate a motor vehicle in a safe manner or who would otherwise, by operating such motor vehicle, be in violation of this Code.

5 (e-5) Whenever a registered owner of a vehicle is taken 6 into custody for operating the vehicle in violation of Section 7 11-501 of this Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance 8 or Section 6-303 of this Code, a law enforcement officer may 9 have the vehicle immediately impounded for a period not less 10 than:

(1) 24 hours for a second violation of Section 11-501 of this Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance or Section 6-303 of this Code or a combination of these offenses; or

15 (2) 48 hours for a third violation of Section 11-501 of 16 this Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance or 17 Section 6-303 of this Code or a combination of these 18 offenses.

19 The vehicle may be released sooner if the vehicle is owned 20 by the person under arrest and the person under arrest gives 21 permission to another person to operate the vehicle and that 22 other person possesses a valid operator's license and would 23 not, as determined by the arresting law enforcement agency, 24 indicate a lack of ability to operate a motor vehicle in a safe 25 manner or would otherwise, by operating the motor vehicle, be in violation of this Code. 26

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(f) Except as provided in Chapter 18a of this Code, the 1 2 owner or lessor of privately owned real property within this 3 State, or any person authorized by such owner or lessor, or any law enforcement agency in the case of publicly owned real 4 property may cause any motor vehicle abandoned or left 5 6 unattended upon such property without permission to be removed 7 by a towing service without liability for the costs of removal, 8 transportation or storage or damage caused by such removal, 9 transportation or storage. The towing or removal of any vehicle 10 from private property without the consent of the registered 11 owner or other legally authorized person in control of the 12 vehicle is subject to compliance with the following conditions 13 and restrictions:

14 1. Any towed or removed vehicle must be stored at the 15 site of the towing service's place of business. The site 16 must be open during business hours, and for the purpose of 17 redemption of vehicles, during the time that the person or 18 firm towing such vehicle is open for towing purposes.

2. The towing service shall within 30 minutes of 20 completion of such towing or removal, notify the law 21 enforcement agency having jurisdiction of such towing or 22 removal, and the make, model, color and license plate 23 number of the vehicle, and shall obtain and record the name 24 of the person at the law enforcement agency to whom such 25 information was reported.

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3. If the registered owner or legally authorized person

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entitled to possession of the vehicle shall arrive at the 1 2 scene prior to actual removal or towing of the vehicle, the 3 vehicle shall be disconnected from the tow truck and that person shall be allowed to remove the vehicle without 4 5 interference, upon the payment of a reasonable service fee 6 of not more than one half the posted rate of the towing 7 service as provided in paragraph 6 of this subsection, for 8 which a receipt shall be given.

9 4. The rebate or payment of money or any other valuable 10 consideration from the towing service or its owners, 11 managers or employees to the owners or operators of the 12 premises from which the vehicles are towed or removed, for 13 the privilege of removing or towing those vehicles, is 14 prohibited. Any individual who violates this paragraph 15 shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

16 5. Except for property appurtenant to and obviously a 17 part of a single family residence, and except for instances where notice is personally given to the owner or other 18 19 legally authorized person in control of the vehicle that 20 the area in which that vehicle is parked is reserved or otherwise unavailable to unauthorized vehicles and they 21 22 are subject to being removed at the owner or operator's 23 expense, any property owner or lessor, prior to towing or 24 removing any vehicle from private property without the 25 consent of the owner or other legally authorized person in 26 control of that vehicle, must post a notice meeting the SB0674 Engrossed - 6 - LRB099 06602 RJF 26675 b

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following requirements:

a. Except as otherwise provided in subparagraph a.1 of this subdivision (f)5, the notice must be prominently placed at each driveway access or curb cut allowing vehicular access to the property within 5 feet from the public right-of-way line. If there are no curbs or access barriers, the sign must be posted not less than one sign each 100 feet of lot frontage.

9 a.1. In a municipality with a population of less 10 than 250,000, as an alternative to the requirement of 11 subparagraph a of this subdivision (f)5, the notice for 12 a parking lot contained within property used solely for 13 a 2-family, 3-family, or 4-family residence may be 14 prominently placed at the perimeter of the parking lot, 15 in a position where the notice is visible to the 16 occupants of vehicles entering the lot.

b. The notice must indicate clearly, in not less than 2 inch high light-reflective letters on a contrasting background, that unauthorized vehicles will be towed away at the owner's expense.

21 c. The notice must also provide the name and 22 current telephone number of the towing service towing 23 or removing the vehicle.

d. The sign structure containing the required
notices must be permanently installed with the bottom
of the sign not less than 4 feet above ground level,

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and must be continuously maintained on the property for
 not less than 24 hours prior to the towing or removing
 of any vehicle.

6. Any towing service that tows or removes vehicles and 4 5 proposes to require the owner, operator, or person in 6 control of the vehicle to pay the costs of towing and 7 storage prior to redemption of the vehicle must file and 8 keep on record with the local law enforcement agency a 9 complete copy of the current rates to be charged for such 10 services, and post at the storage site an identical rate 11 schedule and any written contracts with property owners, 12 lessors, or persons in control of property which authorize them to remove vehicles as provided in this Section. The 13 14 towing and storage charges, however, shall not exceed the 15 maximum allowed by the Illinois Commerce Commission under 16 Section 18a-200.

17 7. No person shall engage in the removal of vehicles 18 from private property as described in this Section without 19 filing a notice of intent in each community where he 20 intends to do such removal, and such notice shall be filed 21 at least 7 days before commencing such towing.

8. No removal of a vehicle from private property shall be done except upon express written instructions of the owners or persons in charge of the private property upon which the vehicle is said to be trespassing.

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9. Vehicle entry for the purpose of removal shall be

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allowed with reasonable care on the part of the person or firm towing the vehicle. Such person or firm shall be liable for any damages occasioned to the vehicle if such entry is not in accordance with the standards of reasonable care.

6 <u>9.5. Except as authorized by a law enforcement officer,</u> 7 <u>no towing service shall engage in the removal of a</u> 8 <u>commercial motor vehicle that requires a commercial</u> 9 <u>driver's license to operate by operating the vehicle under</u> 10 <u>its own power on a highway.</u>

11 10. When a vehicle has been towed or removed pursuant 12 to this Section, it must be released to its owner or 13 custodian within one half hour after requested, if such 14 request is made during business hours. Any vehicle owner or 15 custodian or agent shall have the right to inspect the 16 vehicle before accepting its return, and no release or 17 waiver of any kind which would release the towing service from liability for damages incurred during the towing and 18 19 storage may be required from any vehicle owner or other 20 legally authorized person as a condition of release of the 21 vehicle. A detailed, signed receipt showing the legal name 22 of the towing service must be given to the person paying 23 towing or storage charges at the time of payment, whether 24 requested or not.

This Section shall not apply to law enforcement, firefighting, rescue, ambulance, or other emergency vehicles SB0674 Engrossed - 9 - LRB099 06602 RJF 26675 b

1 which are marked as such or to property owned by any 2 governmental entity.

When an authorized person improperly causes a motor vehicle to be removed, such person shall be liable to the owner or lessee of the vehicle for the cost or removal, transportation and storage, any damages resulting from the removal, transportation and storage, attorney's fee and court costs.

8 Any towing or storage charges accrued shall be payable by 9 the use of any major credit card, in addition to being payable 10 in cash.

11 11. Towing companies shall also provide insurance 12 coverage for areas where vehicles towed under the 13 provisions of this Chapter will be impounded or otherwise 14 stored, and shall adequately cover loss by fire, theft or 15 other risks.

Any person who fails to comply with the conditions and restrictions of this subsection shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$500.

(g) (1) When a vehicle is determined to be a hazardous dilapidated motor vehicle pursuant to Section 11-40-3.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code or Section 5-12002.1 of the Counties Code, its removal and impoundment by a towing service may be authorized by a law enforcement agency with appropriate jurisdiction.

26 (2) When a vehicle removal from either public or private

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property is authorized by a law enforcement agency, the owner of the vehicle shall be responsible for all towing and storage charges.

(3) Vehicles removed from public or private property and 4 5 stored by a commercial vehicle relocator or any other towing service authorized by a law enforcement agency in compliance 6 7 with this Section and Sections 4-201 and 4-202 of this Code, or 8 at the request of the vehicle owner or operator, shall be 9 subject to a possessor lien for services pursuant to the Labor 10 and Storage Lien (Small Amount) Act. The provisions of Section 11 1 of that Act relating to notice and implied consent shall be 12 deemed satisfied by compliance with Section 18a-302 and 13 subsection (6) of Section 18a-300. In no event shall such lien 14 be greater than the rate or rates established in accordance with subsection (6) of Section 18a-200 of this Code. In no 15 16 event shall such lien be increased or altered to reflect any 17 charge for services or materials rendered in addition to those authorized by this Act. Every such lien shall be payable by use 18 19 of any major credit card, in addition to being payable in cash.

20 (4) Any personal property belonging to the vehicle owner in a vehicle subject to a lien under this subsection (g) shall 21 22 likewise be subject to that lien, excepting only: child 23 restraint systems as defined in Section 4 of the Child Passenger Protection Act and other child booster seats; 24 25 eyeglasses; food; medicine; perishable property; any 26 operator's licenses; any cash, credit cards, or checks or

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1 checkbooks; any wallet, purse, or other property containing any other 2 operator's license or identifying documents or materials, cash, credit cards, checks, or checkbooks; and any 3 personal property belonging to a person other than the vehicle 4 5 owner if that person provides adequate proof that the personal property belongs to that person. The spouse, child, mother, 6 7 father, brother, or sister of the vehicle owner may claim 8 personal property excepted under this paragraph (4) if the 9 person claiming the personal property provides the commercial 10 vehicle relocator or towing service with the authorization of 11 the vehicle owner.

12 (5) This paragraph (5) applies only in the case of a 13 vehicle that is towed as a result of being involved in an 14 accident. In addition to the personal property excepted under 15 paragraph (4), all other personal property in a vehicle subject 16 to a lien under this subsection (q) is exempt from that lien 17 and may be claimed by the vehicle owner if the vehicle owner provides the commercial vehicle relocator or towing service 18 with proof that the vehicle owner has an insurance policy 19 20 covering towing and storage fees. The spouse, child, mother, father, brother, or sister of the vehicle owner may claim 21 22 personal property in a vehicle subject to a lien under this 23 subsection (q) if the person claiming the personal property provides the commercial vehicle relocator or towing service 24 25 with the authorization of the vehicle owner and proof that the vehicle owner has an insurance policy covering towing and 26

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storage fees. The regulation of liens on personal property and 1 2 exceptions to those liens in the case of vehicles towed as a 3 result of being involved in an accident are exclusive powers and functions of the State. A home rule unit may not regulate 4 5 liens on personal property and exceptions to those liens in the case of vehicles towed as a result of being involved in an 6 accident. This paragraph (5) is a denial and limitation of home 7 rule powers and functions under subsection (h) of Section 6 of 8 9 Article VII of the Illinois Constitution.

10 (6) No lien under this subsection (g) shall: exceed \$2,000 11 in its total amount; or be increased or altered to reflect any 12 charge for services or materials rendered in addition to those 13 authorized by this Act.

(h) Whenever a peace officer issues a citation to a driver 14 15 for a violation of subsection (a) of Section 11-506 of this 16 Code, the arresting officer may have the vehicle which the 17 person was operating at the time of the arrest impounded for a period of 5 days after the time of arrest. An impounding agency 18 shall release a motor vehicle impounded under this subsection 19 20 (h) to the registered owner of the vehicle under any of the following circumstances: 21

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(1) If the vehicle is a stolen vehicle; or

(2) If the person ticketed for a violation of
subsection (a) of Section 11-506 of this Code was not
authorized by the registered owner of the vehicle to
operate the vehicle at the time of the violation; or

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1 (3) If the registered owner of the vehicle was neither 2 the driver nor a passenger in the vehicle at the time of 3 the violation or was unaware that the driver was using the 4 vehicle to engage in street racing; or

5 (4) If the legal owner or registered owner of the 6 vehicle is a rental car agency; or

7 (5) If, prior to the expiration of the impoundment
8 period specified above, the citation is dismissed or the
9 defendant is found not quilty of the offense.

Sec. 18a-300. Commercial vehicle relocators - Unlawful practices. It shall be unlawful for any commercial vehicle relocator:

16 (1) To operate in any county in which this Chapter is
17 applicable without a valid, current relocator's license as
18 provided in Article IV of this Chapter;

19 (2) To employ as an operator, or otherwise so use the 20 services of, any person who does not have at the 21 commencement of employment or service, or at any time 22 during the course of employment or service, a valid, 23 current operator's employment permit, or temporary 24 operator's employment permit issued in accordance with Sections 18a-403 or 18a-405 of this Chapter; or to fail to 25

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notify the Commission, in writing, of any known criminal
 conviction of any employee occurring at any time before or
 during the course of employment or service;

(3) To employ as a dispatcher, or otherwise so use the 4 services of, any person who does not have at 5 the commencement of employment or service, or at any time 6 7 during the course of employment or service, a valid, 8 current dispatcher's or operator's employment permit or 9 temporary dispatcher's or operator's employment permit 10 issued in accordance with Sections 18a-403 or 18a-407 of 11 this Chapter; or to fail to notify the Commission, in 12 writing, of any known criminal conviction of any employee 13 occurring at any time before or during the course of 14 employment or service;

15 (4) To operate upon the highways of this State any
16 vehicle used in connection with any commercial vehicle
17 relocation service unless:

There is painted or firmly affixed to the 18 (A) vehicle on both sides of the vehicle in a color or 19 colors vividly contrasting to the color of the vehicle 20 21 the name, address and telephone number of the 22 relocator. The Commission shall prescribe reasonable 23 rules and regulations pertaining to insignia to be painted or firmly affixed to vehicles and shall waive 24 25 the requirements of the address on any vehicle in cases where the operator of a vehicle has painted or 26

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otherwise firmly affixed to the vehicle a seal or trade
 mark that clearly identifies the operator of the
 vehicle; and

(B) There is carried in the power unit of the 4 5 vehicle a certified copy of the currently effective 6 relocator's license and operator's employment permit. 7 Copies may be photographed, photocopied, or reproduced or printed by any other legible and durable process. 8 9 Any person quilty of not causing to be displayed a copy 10 of his relocator's license and operator's employment 11 permit may in any hearing concerning the violation be 12 excused from the payment of the penalty hereinafter 13 provided upon a showing that the license was issued by 14 the Commission, but subsequently lost was or 15 destroyed;

16 (5) To operate upon the highways of this State any 17 vehicle used in connection with any commercial vehicle 18 relocation service that bears the name or address and 19 telephone number of any person or entity other than the 20 relocator by which it is owned or to which it is leased;

(6) To advertise in any newspaper, book, list, classified directory or other publication unless there is contained in the advertisement the license number of the relocator;

(7) To remove any vehicle from private property without
 having first obtained the written authorization of the

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1 property owner or other person in lawful possession or 2 control of the property, his authorized agent, or an 3 authorized law enforcement officer. The authorization may 4 be on a contractual basis covering a period of time or 5 limited to a specific removal;

6 (8) To charge the private property owner, who requested 7 that an unauthorized vehicle be removed from his property, with the costs of removing the vehicle contrary to any 8 9 terms that may be a part of the contract between the 10 property owner and the commercial relocator. Nothing in 11 this paragraph shall prevent a relocator from assessing, 12 collecting, or receiving from the property owner, lessee, 13 or their agents any fee prescribed by the Commission;

14 (9) To remove a vehicle when the owner or operator of 15 the vehicle is present or arrives at the vehicle location 16 at any time prior to the completion of removal, and is 17 willing and able to remove the vehicle immediately;

(10) To remove any vehicle from property on which signs are required and on which there are not posted appropriate signs under Section 18a-302;

(11) To fail to notify law enforcement authorities in 21 22 the jurisdiction in which the trespassing vehicle was 23 removed within one hour of the removal. Notification shall 24 include complete description of the vehicle, а 25 registration numbers if possible, the locations from which 26 and to which the vehicle was removed, the time of removal,

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1 and any other information required by regulation, statute 2 or ordinance;

(12) To impose any charge other than in accordance with
the rates set by the Commission as provided in paragraph
(6) of Section 18a-200 of this Chapter;

6 (13) To fail, in the office or location at which 7 relocated vehicles are routinely returned to their owners, 8 to prominently post the name, address and telephone number 9 of the nearest office of the Commission to which inquiries 10 or complaints may be sent;

11 (13.1) To fail to distribute to each owner or operator 12 of a relocated vehicle, in written form as prescribed by 13 Commission rule or regulation, the relevant statutes, 14 regulations and ordinances governing commercial vehicle 15 relocators, including, in at least 12 point boldface type, 16 the name, address and telephone number of the nearest 17 office of the Commission to which inquiries or complaints 18 may be sent;

19 (13.2) To fail, in the office or location at which 20 relocated vehicles are routinely returned to their owners, 21 to ensure that the relocator's representative provides 22 suitable evidence of his or her identity to the owners of 23 relocated vehicles upon request;

(14) To remove any vehicle, otherwise in accordance
with this Chapter, more than 15 air miles from its location
when towed from a location in an unincorporated area of a

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county or more than 10 air miles from its location when towed from any other location;

3 (15) To fail to make a telephone number available to the police department of any municipality in which a 4 5 relocator operates at which the relocator or an employee of 6 the relocator may be contacted at any time during the hours 7 in which the relocator is engaged in the towing of 8 vehicles, or advertised as engaged in the towing of 9 vehicles, for the purpose of effectuating the release of a 10 towed vehicle; or to fail to include the telephone number 11 in any advertisement of the relocator's services published 12 or otherwise appearing on or after the effective date of 13 this amendatory Act; or to fail to have an employee 14 available at any time on the premises owned or controlled 15 by the relocator for the purposes of arranging for the 16 immediate release of the vehicle.

17 Apart from any other penalty or liability authorized under this Act, if after a reasonable effort, the owner of 18 19 the vehicle is unable to make telephone contact with the 20 relocator for a period of one hour from his initial attempt 21 during any time period in which the relocator is required 22 to respond at the number, all fees for towing, storage, or 23 otherwise are to be waived. Proof of 3 attempted phone 24 calls to the number provided to the police department by an 25 officer or employee of the department on behalf of the 26 vehicle owner within the space of one hour, at least 2 of

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which are separated by 45 minutes, shall be deemed sufficient proof of the owner's reasonable effort to make contact with the vehicle relocator. Failure of the relocator to respond to the phone calls is not a criminal violation of this Chapter;

6 (16) To use equipment which the relocator does not own, 7 except in compliance with Section 18a-306 of this Chapter 8 and Commission regulations. No equipment can be leased to 9 more than one relocator at any time. Equipment leases shall 10 be filed with the Commission. If equipment is leased to one 11 relocator, it cannot thereafter be leased to another 12 relocator until a written cancellation of lease is properly 13 filed with the Commission;

14 (17) To use drivers or other personnel who are not
15 employees or contractors of the relocator;

16 (18) To fail to refund any amount charged in excess of
17 the reasonable rate established by the Commission;

18 (19) To violate any other provision of this Chapter, or 19 of Commission regulations or orders adopted under this 20 Chapter; -

21 (20) To engage in the removal of a commercial motor 22 vehicle that requires a commercial driver's license to 23 operate by operating the vehicle under its own power on a 24 highway without authorization by a law enforcement 25 officer.
