AN ACT concerning education. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- Section 5. The School Construction Law is amended by 4 5 changing Section 5-5 as follows:
- (105 ILCS 230/5-5) 6

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- 7 Sec. 5-5. Definitions. As used in this Article:
- "Approved school construction bonds" mean bonds that were 8 9 approved by referendum after January 1, 1996 but prior to 10 January 1, 1998 as provided in Sections 19-2 through 19-7 of the School Code to provide funds for the acquisition, 11 12 development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, 13 improvement, architectural planning, and installation of 14 capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable-equipment, and land for educational purposes.
- 16 "Grant index" means a figure for each school district equal 17 to one minus the ratio of the district's equalized assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance to the 18 19 equalized assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance of the district located at the 90th percentile for 20 21 all districts of the same category. For the purpose of 22 calculating the grant index, school districts are grouped into 2 categories, Category I and Category II. Category I consists 23

of elementary and unit school districts. The equalized assessed 1 2 valuation per pupil in average daily attendance of each school district in Category I shall be computed using its grades 3 kindergarten through 8 average daily attendance figure. A unit 5 school district's Category I grant index shall be used for projects or portions of projects constructed for elementary 6 7 school pupils. Category II consists of high school and unit 8 school districts. The equalized assessed valuation per pupil in 9 average daily attendance of each school district in Category II 10 shall be computed using its grades 9 through 12 average daily 11 attendance figure. A unit school district's Category II grant 12 index shall be used for projects or portions of projects constructed for high school pupils. The changes made by this 13 14 amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly apply to all grants 15 made on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act, 16 provided that for grants not yet made on the effective date of 17 this amendatory Act but made in fiscal year 2001 and for grants made in fiscal year 2002, the grant index for a school district 18 shall be the greater of (i) the grant index as calculated under 19 20 this Law on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act or (ii) the grant index as calculated under this Law before the 21 22 effective date of this amendatory Act. The grant index shall be 23 no less than 0.35 and no greater than 0.75 for each district; provided that the grant index for districts whose equalized 24

assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance is at

the 99th percentile and above for all districts of the same

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1	type shall be 0.00. For school districts that have consolidated
2	or approved a cooperative high school within a prior fiscal
3	year, the grant index shall be calculated for each of those
4	school districts that form the new school district or
5	cooperative high school. Whichever grant index is the highest
6	shall be used as the grant index for the newly consolidated

school district or approved cooperative high school.

The grant index shall be calculated for each of those school districts forming a reorganized school district or cooperative high school if one or more of the following happen within the current or prior 2 fiscal years:

- (1) a new school district is created in accordance with Article 11E of the School Code;
- (2) an existing school district annexes all of the territory of one or more entire other school districts in accordance with Article 7 of the School Code; or
- 17 (3) a cooperative high school is formed in accordance with Section 10-22.22c of the School Code. 18
 - The average grant index of those school districts shall be used as the grant index for the newly reorganized district or cooperative high school.
 - "School construction project" means the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, architectural planning, and installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and land for educational purposes.

- 1 "School district" means a school district or a Type 40 area
- 2 vocational center that is jointly owned if the joint agreement
- 3 includes language that specifies how the debt obligation is to
- 4 be paid, including in the event that an entity withdraws from
- 5 the joint agreement.
- 6 "School district" includes a cooperative high school,
- 7 which shall be considered a high school district for the
- 8 purpose of calculating its grant index.
- 9 "School maintenance project" means a project, other than a
- 10 school construction project, intended to provide for the
- 11 maintenance or upkeep of buildings or structures for
- 12 educational purposes, but does not include ongoing operational
- 13 costs.
