

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named sums, or so much thereof
6 as are available for distribution in accordance with Section 8
7 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law, are appropriated from the Motor Fuel
8 Tax Fund to the Department of Transportation for the purposes
9 stated:

18 Section 10. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Gaming Fund
20 to the Illinois Gaming Board for distributions to local
21 governments for admissions and wagering tax, including prior

1 year costs.

2 Section 15. The sum of \$1,000,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Lottery
4 Fund to the Department of the Lottery for payment of prizes to
5 holders of winning lottery tickets or shares, including prizes
6 related to Multi-State Lottery games, and payment of
7 promotional or incentive prizes associated with the sale of
8 lottery tickets, pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois
9 Lottery Law.

10 Section 20. The sum of \$2,013,600, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of State
12 Police, Division of Administration, from the Wireless Service
13 Emergency Fund for expenses incurred for the Statewide 911
14 Administrator Program.

15 Section 25. The sum of \$75,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Statewide 9-1-1
17 Fund to the Department of State Police for costs pursuant to
18 the Emergency Telephone System Act.

19 Section 30. The sum of \$77,130,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless Service
21 Emergency Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for its

1 administrative costs and for grants to emergency telephone
 2 system boards, qualified government entities, or the Department
 3 of State Police for the design, implementation, operation,
 4 maintenance, or upgrade of wireless 9-1-1 or E9-1-1 emergency
 5 services and public safety answering points.

6 Section 35. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 7 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
 8 hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the ordinary and

6 activities.

7 Section 25. The sum of \$24,500,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the ICCB Adult Education
9 Fund to the Illinois Community College Board for payment of
10 costs associated with education and educational-related
11 services to local eligible providers and to Support Leadership
12 Activities, as Defined by U.S.D.O.E. for adult education and
13 literacy as provided by the United States Department of
14 Education.

1 of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court of Cook
2 County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and enforcement
3 of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act, for the
4 handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other law
5 enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

6 Section 50. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General Sex
8 Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the Office
9 of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT program and to
10 alert and educate the public, victims, and witnesses of their
11 rights under various victim notification laws and for training
12 law enforcement agencies, State's Attorneys, and medical
13 providers regarding their legal duties concerning the

7 Secretary of State from the Ovarian Cancer Awareness Fund for
8 grants to the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, Inc. for
9 ovarian cancer research, education, screening, and treatment.

10 Section 260. The sum of \$6,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
12 Secretary of State from the Sheet Metal Workers International
13 Association of Illinois Fund for grants for charitable purposes
14 sponsored by Illinois chapters of the Sheet Metal Workers
15 International Association.

16 Section 265. The sum of \$90,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
18 Secretary of State from the Illinois Police Association Fund
19 for providing death benefits for the families of police
20 officers killed in the line of duty, and for providing
21 scholarships, for graduate study, undergraduate study, or both,
22 to children and spouses of police officers killed in the line

1 of duty.

2 Section 270. The sum of \$35,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
4 from the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Fund for grants
5 to the Teamsters Joint Council 25 Charitable Trust for
6 religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational
7 purposes.

8 Section 275. The sum of \$0, or so much thereof as may be
9 necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the Secretary of
10 State from the 4-H Fund for grants to the Illinois 4-H
11 foundation for the purpose of funding 4-H programs in Illinois.

12 Section 280. The sum of \$15,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
14 Secretary of State from the Fraternal Order of Police Fund for
15 grants to the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police to increase
16 the efficiency and professionalism of law enforcement officers
17 in Illinois, to educate the public about law enforcement
18 issues, to more firmly establish the public confidence in law
19 enforcement, to create partnerships with the public, and to
20 honor the service of law enforcement officers.

21 Section 285. The sum of \$45,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
2 from the Share the Road Fund for grants to the League of
3 Illinois Bicyclists, a not for profit corporation, for
4 educational programs instructing bicyclists and motorists how
5 to legally and more safely share the roadways.

6 Section 290. The sum of \$3,500, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
8 Secretary of State from the St. Jude Children's Research Fund
9 for grants to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital for
10 pediatric treatment and research.

11 Section 295. The sum of \$10,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
13 Secretary of State from the Ducks Unlimited Fund for grants to
14 Ducks Unlimited, Inc. to fund wetland protection, enhancement,
15 and restoration projects in the State of Illinois, to fund
16 education and outreach for media, volunteers, members, and the
17 general public regarding waterfowl and wetlands conservation in
18 the State of Illinois, and to cover reasonable cost for Ducks
19 Unlimited plate advertising and administration of the wetland
20 conservation projects and education program.

21 Section 300. The sum of \$200,000, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State

1 from the Family Responsibility Fund for all costs associated
2 with enforcement of the Family Financial Responsibility Law.

3 Section 305. The sum of \$0, or so much thereof as may be
4 necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the Secretary of
5 State from the Soil and Water Conservation District Fund for
6 grants to Illinois soil and water conservation districts for
7 projects that conserve and restore soil and water in Illinois.

8 Section 310. The sum of \$5,000, or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the Secretary of
10 State from the Illinois State Police Memorial Park Fund for
11 grants to the Illinois State Police Heritage Foundation, Inc.
12 for building and maintaining a memorial and park, holding an
13 annual memorial commemoration, giving scholarships to children
14 of State police officers killed or catastrophically injured in
15 the line of duty, and providing financial assistance to police
16 officers and their families when a police officer is killed or
17 injured in the line of duty.

18 Section 315. The sum of \$5,000, or so much thereof as may
19 be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the Secretary of
20 State from the Illinois Sheriffs' Association Scholarship and
21 Training Fund for grants to the Illinois Sheriffs' Association
22 for scholarships obtained in a competitive process to attend

1 the Illinois Teen Institute or an accredited college or
2 university, for programs designed to benefit the elderly and
3 teens, and for law enforcement training.

4 ARTICLE 8

5 Section 5. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller from
7 the Comptroller's Administrative Fund for the discharge of
8 duties of the office.

9 ARTICLE 998

Section 5. The appropriation authority granted in this
Act shall be valid for costs incurred July 1, 2015 through
June 30, 2016.

ARTICLE 999

12 Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
13 becoming law.
