

99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2015 and 2016 SB3077

Introduced 2/19/2016, by Sen. Antonio Muñoz

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/24-1.7

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person is also an armed habitual criminal if the person receives, sells, possesses, or transfers any firearm after having been convicted a total of 2 or more times of any combination of offenses that includes a felony violation of the Deadly Weapons Article of the Code (rather than unlawful use of a weapon by a felon; aggravated unlawful use of a weapon; aggravated discharge of a firearm; or gunrunning).

CORRECTIONAL BUDGET AND IMPACT NOTE ACT MAY APPLY 1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing

 Section 24-1.7 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/24-1.7)
- 7 Sec. 24-1.7. Armed habitual criminal.
- 8 (a) A person commits the offense of being an armed habitual 9 criminal if he or she receives, sells, possesses, or transfers 10 any firearm after having been convicted a total of 2 or more 11 times of any combination of the following offenses:
- 12 (1) a forcible felony as defined in Section 2-8 of this Code;
- 14 (2) a felony violation of Article 24 of this Code; 15 unlawful use of a weapon by a felon; aggravated unlawful use of a weapon; aggravated discharge of a firearm; 16 17 vehicular hijacking; aggravated vehicular hijacking; aggravated battery of a child as described in Section 18 19 subdivision (b)(1) of Section 20 intimidation; aggravated intimidation; gunrunning; home 21 invasion; or aggravated battery with a firearm as described 22 in Section 12-4.2 or subdivision (e) (1), (e) (2), (e) (3), or (e) (4) of Section 12-3.05; or 2.3

- 1 (3) any violation of the Illinois Controlled
- 2 Substances Act or the Cannabis Control Act that is
- 3 punishable as a Class 3 felony or higher.
- 4 (b) Sentence. Being an armed habitual criminal is a Class X
- 5 felony.
