11 WHEREAS, Jean Roth retired in 1984 from the Rock 12 Island/Milan School District #41, where she was a school nurse 13 from 1977 to 1984; she previously worked as an instructor of 14 Student Nurses at St. Anthony's Hospital in Rock Island from 15 1966 to 1970 and was a Charge Nurse at St. Anthony's from 1947 16 to 1953; and
