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AN ACT in relation to the regulation of professions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail
Technology Act of 1985 is amended by changing Section 3-3 as
follows:

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7 (225 ILCS 410/3-3) (from Ch. 111, par. 1703-3)
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8 Sec. 3-3. Licensure as a cosmetologist by a barber 9 school graduate; <u>qualifications</u>. A person is qualified to 10 receive a license as a cosmetologist if that person has filed 11 an application on forms provided by the Department, has paid 12 the required fees, and:

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a. Is at least 16 years of age; and

b. Has a certificate of graduation from a school providing secondary education, or the recognized equivalent of such a certificate, or is beyond the age of compulsory school attendance; and

18 c. Has graduated from a school of barbering approved by the Department having completed 1500 hours in the study of 19 20 barbering, and a minimum of 1000 additional hours in the study of cosmetology extending over a period of no less than 21 22 6 months nor more than 2 years. Time spent in such study under the laws of another state or territory of the United 23 States or of a foreign country or province shall be credited 24 toward the period of study required by the provisions of this 25 26 paragraph; and

d. Has passed an examination authorized by the
Department to determine fitness to receive a license as a
cosmetologist; and

e. Has met any other requirements of this Act.
