- 1 AN ACT in relation to legislative printing.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The General Assembly Compensation Act is
- 5 amended by changing Section 4 as follows:
- 6 (25 ILCS 115/4) (from Ch. 63, par. 15.1)
- 7 Sec. 4. Office allowance. Beginning July 1, 1989, each
- 8 member of the House of Representatives is authorized to
- 9 approve the expenditure of not more than \$57,000 per year and
- 10 each member of the Senate is authorized to approve the
- 11 expenditure of not more than \$67,000 per year to pay for
- 12 "personal services", "contractual services", "commodities",
- 13 "printing", "travel", "operation of automotive equipment",
- 14 "telecommunications services", as defined in the State
- 15 Finance Act, and the compensation of one or more legislative
- 16 assistants authorized pursuant to this Section, in connection
- 17 with his or her legislative duties and not in connection with
- 18 any political campaign. A member may purchase office

equipment if the member certifies to the Secretary of the

6 As used in this Section the term "personal services" 7 shall include contributions of the State under the Federal Insurance Contribution Act and under Article 14 of the 8 9 Illinois Pension Code. As used in this Section the term "contractual services" shall not include improvements to real 10 11 property unless those improvements are the obligation of the lessee under the lease agreement. Beginning July 1, 1989, as 12 used in the Section, the term "travel" shall be limited to 13 travel in connection with a member's legislative duties and 14 15 not in connection with any political campaign. 1989, as used in this Section, the term "printing" 16 includes congratulatory mailings, including but not 17 18 to greeting or welcome messages, anniversary or birthday 19 cards, and congratulations for prominent achievement cards. As used in this Section, the term "printing" includes fees 20 21 for non-substantive resolutions charged by the Clerk of the House of Representatives under subsection (c-5) of Section 1 22 23 of the Legislative Materials Act. No constituent newsletter that is paid for, in whole or in part, with funds provided 24 25 under this Section may be printed or distributed on or after 26 July 1 in any year in which a general election will be held. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to authorize 27 expenditures for lodging and meals while a member is in 28 attendance at sessions of the General Assembly. 29

Any utility bill for service provided to a member's district office for a period including portions of 2 consecutive fiscal years may be paid from funds appropriated for such expenditure in either fiscal year.

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34 If a vacancy occurs in the office of Senator or

1 Representative in the General Assembly, any office equipment 2 in the possession of the vacating member shall transfer to the member's successor; if the successor does not want such 3 4 equipment, it shall be transferred to the Secretary of the 5 Senate or Clerk of the House of Representatives, as the case 6 may be, and if not wanted by other members of the General 7 Assembly then to the Department of Central Management 8 Services for treatment as surplus property under the State 9 Property Control Act. Each member, on or before June 30th of each year, shall conduct an inventory of all equipment 10 11 purchased pursuant to this Act. Such inventory shall be filed with the Secretary of the Senate or the Clerk of the 12 13 House, as the case may be. Whenever a vacancy occurs, the Secretary of the Senate or the Clerk of the House, as 14 t.he 15 may be, shall conduct an inventory of equipment 16 purchased. In the event that a member leaves office during his 17 or

In the event that a member leaves office during his or her term, any unexpended or unobligated portion of the allowance granted under this Section shall lapse. The vacating member's successor shall be granted an allowance in an amount, rounded to the nearest dollar, computed by dividing the annual allowance by 365 and multiplying the quotient by the number of days remaining in the fiscal year.

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From any appropriation for the purposes of this Section for a fiscal year which overlaps 2 General Assemblies, no more than 1/2 of the annual allowance per member may be spent or encumbered by any member of either the outgoing or incoming General Assembly, except that any member of the incoming General Assembly who was a member of the outgoing General Assembly may encumber or spend any portion of his annual allowance within the fiscal year.

The appropriation for the annual allowances permitted by this Section shall be included in an appropriation to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House of

- 1 Representatives for their respective members. The President
- of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall voucher for
- 3 payment individual members' expenditures from their annual
- 4 office allowances to the State Comptroller, subject to the
- 5 authority of the Comptroller under Section 9 of the State
