10 <u>"Expanded screening" means screening for all genetic and</u> 11 <u>metabolic disorders, including but not limited to amino acid</u> 12 <u>disorders, organic acid disorders, fatty acid oxidation</u> 13 <u>disorders, and other abnormal profiles, in newborn infants</u> 14 <u>that can be detected through the use of a tandem mass</u> 15 <u>spectrometer.</u>

16 <u>"Tandem mass spectrometer" means an analytical instrument</u>
17 <u>used to detect numerous genetic and metabolic disorders at</u>
18 <u>one time.</u>
