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- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Department of Human Services Act is
- 5 amended by adding Section 10-30 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 1305/10-30 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 10-30. Child care capital investment program.</u>
- 8 (a) The Department shall develop and implement a child
- 9 <u>care capital investment program</u>. The purposes of the program
- 10 <u>are as follows:</u>
- 11 (1) To assess the need for additional licensed child
- 12 <u>care providers in low-income communities.</u>
- 13 (2) To provide planning and technical assistance to
- 14 <u>prepare child care providers for making capital</u>
- investments.
- 16 (3) To provide grants as part of a financing package
- to build new child care capacity in high-need communities
- 18 <u>throughout the State.</u>
- 19 (b) The Department's implementation of the program must
- 20 <u>include the following features:</u>
- 21 (1) Completion of a demographics-based needs
- 22 <u>assessment of subsidized full-day, full-year child care</u>
- in Illinois.
- 24 (2) Issuance of requests for proposals to child care
- 25 <u>providers who are seeking new facilities or seeking</u>
- 26 <u>renovations to expand existing capacity. Proposals must</u>
- 27 <u>be submitted in 2 parts:</u>
- 28 (A) An initial indication of interest,
- 29 <u>including a project description, community benefits</u>
- and cost estimates, and private funding sources.
- 31 (B) Submission of a full application for a

1	grant, including a project budget and timetable,
2	after consideration of the needs assessment
3	completed under paragraph (1) and, if appropriate,
4	after the provision of technical assistance from the
5	Department.
6	(3) Conduct of outreach and training for interested
7	child care providers in Illinois on topics including, but
8	not limited to: property ownership and management;
9	fundraising; construction and development processes; and
10	other pertinent technical assistance. The outreach and
11	training may include the convening of a roundtable on
12	child care facility design.
13	(4) Selection of projects, using the
14	request-for-proposal process, to receive grants. In
15	selecting projects for grants, the Department must
16	<pre>consider at least the following:</pre>
17	(1) Whether a proposed project will address
18	priorities identified in the needs assessment
19	completed under paragraph (1).
20	(2) Whether a proposed project will feature
21	coordinated project management that will maximize
22	economies of scale and minimize costs.
23	(3) How favorably a proposed project's
24	financing structure compares with a standard of 60%
25	equity and 40% debt.
26	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
27	becoming law.
