- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding
- 5 Section 5.545 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 105/5.545 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 5.545. The Illinois Future Teacher Corps</u>
- 8 <u>Scholarship Fund.</u>
- 9 Section 10. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act
- is amended by adding Section 65.65 as follows:
- 11 (110 ILCS 947/65.65 new)
- 12 <u>Sec. 65.65. Illinois Future Teacher Corps Scholarships.</u>
- 13 (a) In this Section:
- 14 <u>"Fees" means matriculation, graduation, activity, term,</u>
- 15 <u>or incidental fees. "Fees" does not include any other</u>
- 16 fees, including book rental, service, laboratory, supply,
- 17 and union building fees, hospital and medical insurance fees,
- 18 and any fees established for the operation and maintenance of
- 19 <u>buildings the income of which is pledged to the payment of</u>
- 20 <u>interest and principal on bonds issued by the governing board</u>
- of an institution of higher learning.
- 22 <u>"Shortage" means an unfilled teaching position or one</u>
- 23 that is filled but is occupied by a person who is not fully
- 24 <u>certified</u> by the State for that teaching position at the
- 25 <u>start of the school year.</u>
- 26 <u>"Scholarship" means an Illinois Future Teacher Corps</u>
- 27 <u>Scholarship.</u>
- 28 <u>"Tuition and other necessary fees" includes the</u>
- 29 <u>customary charge for instruction and use of facilities in</u>

1	general and the additional fixed fees charged for specified
2	purposes that are required generally of non-scholarship
3	recipients for each academic term for which the recipient of
4	a scholarship under this Section actually enrolls. "Tuition
5	and other necessary fees does not include fees payable only
6	once or breakage fees and other contingent deposits that are
7	refundable in whole or in part. "Tuition and other necessary
8	fees" does not include expenses for any sectarian or
9	denominational instruction, for the construction or
10	maintenance of sectarian or denominational facilities, or for
11	any other sectarian or denominational purposes or activity.
12	(b) A program is created to provide new teacher training
13	scholarships, to be known as Illinois Future Teacher Corps
14	Scholarships. The scholarships are for full-time
15	undergraduate and graduate students pursuing studies at
16	qualified institutions of higher learning leading to teacher
17	certification in this State. To receive a scholarship, a
18	graduate student must be seeking retraining, from another
19	field, to enter a teaching career. No more than half of the
20	scholarships shall be awarded to graduate students seeking
21	retraining.
22	(c) The Commission, in accordance with rules adopted for
23	the program created under this Section, shall provide
24	funding, determine the eligibility of applicants, and
25	designate each year's new recipients from among those
26	applicants who qualify for consideration by showing:
27	(1) that he or she is a resident of this State
28	and a citizen or a lawful permanent resident alien of the
29	<u>United States;</u>
30	(2) that he or she (i) has successfully completed
31	the program of instruction at an approved high
32	school or (ii) is a student in good standing at that
33	school and is enrolled in a program of instruction that
34	will be completed by the end of the school year and, in

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1	either event, that his or her cumulative grade point
2	average was or is in the upper one-third of his or her
3	high school class;
4	(3) that he or she has a superior capacity to
5	profit by a higher education; and
6	(4) that he or she intends to teach in an
7	elementary or secondary school in this State.
8	(d) If for any academic year the number of qualified
9	applicants exceeds the number of scholarships to be
10	awarded, the Commission shall prioritize the awarding of
11	scholarships to applicants by considering (i) identified
12	teacher shortage areas established by the State Board of
13	Education and (ii) an applicant's cumulative class rank in
14	high school or, for graduate student applicants, total
15	undergraduate cumulative grade point average.
16	(e) Unless otherwise indicated, scholarships shall be
17	good for a period of up to 4 academic years while the
18	recipient is enrolled for full-time residence credit at a
19	qualified institution of higher learning. Each academic
20	year, the scholarship shall cover tuition and other necessary
21	fees for 2 semesters plus the summer session or 4 quarters;
22	however, the amount of a scholarship in a single academic
23	year may not exceed \$5,000. For purposes of calculating
24	scholarship assistance for recipients attending private
25	institutions of higher learning, tuition and other necessary
26	fees for students at private institutions shall not exceed
27	the average tuition and other necessary fees for students at
28	State universities for the academic year in which the
29	scholarship is made.
30	(f) Before receiving scholarship assistance, a
31	scholarship recipient shall be required by the Commission to
32	sign an agreement under which the recipient pledges that,
33	within the 5-year period following the completion of the

academic program for which the recipient was awarded a

- 1 scholarship, the recipient (i) shall teach for a period of
- 2 <u>not less than one year for each academic year of scholarship</u>
- 3 <u>assistance that he or she was awarded, (ii) shall fulfill</u>
- 4 this teaching obligation at a public or nonprofit private
- 5 preschool, elementary school, or secondary school in this
- 6 State, and (iii) shall, upon request by the Commission,
- 7 provide the Commission with evidence that he or she is
- 8 <u>fulfilling or has fulfilled the terms of the teaching</u>
- 9 agreement provided for in this subsection (f).
- 10 (g) If a scholarship recipient fails to fulfill the
- 11 <u>teaching obligation set forth in subsection (f) of this</u>
- 12 <u>Section, the Commission shall require the recipient to repay</u>
- 13 the amount of the scholarship assistance received, at a rate
- of interest equal to 5%, and, if applicable, reasonable
- 15 <u>collection fees. The Commission may establish rules relating</u>
- 16 to its collection activities for the repayment of
- 17 <u>scholarships</u>. All repayments collected under this Section
- 18 <u>shall be forwarded to the State Comptroller for deposit into</u>
- 19 <u>the General Revenue Fund.</u>
- 20 <u>A scholarship recipient shall not be considered in</u>
- 21 <u>violation of the agreement entered into pursuant to</u>
- 22 <u>subsection (f) of this Section if the recipient (i) enrolls</u>
- 23 <u>on a full-time basis as a graduate student in a course of</u>
- 24 study related to the field of teaching at a qualified
- 25 <u>institution of higher learning, (ii) is serving as a member</u>
- of the armed services of the United States for a period of
- 27 <u>time not to exceed 3 years, (iii) is temporarily totally</u>
- 28 <u>disabled for a period of time not to exceed 3 years, as</u>
- 29 <u>established by sworn affidavit of a qualified physician, (iv)</u>
- 30 <u>is seeking and unable to find full-time employment as a</u>
- 31 <u>teacher at a public or nonprofit private preschool,</u>
- 32 <u>elementary school</u>, or <u>secondary school that satisfies the</u>
- 33 <u>criteria set forth in subsection (f) of this Section and is</u>
- 34 <u>able to provide evidence of that fact, or (v) becomes</u>

- 1 permanently totally disabled, as established by sworn
- 2 <u>affidavit of a qualified physician. No claim for repayment</u>
- 3 may be filed against the estate of a decedent or incompetent.
- 4 <u>Each person applying for a scholarship shall be provided</u>
- 5 with a copy of this subsection (g) at the time he or she
- 6 <u>applies for the scholarship.</u>
- 7 (h) The Commission may prescribe, by rule, detailed
- 8 provisions concerning the computation of tuition and other
- 9 necessary fees, which must not be inconsistent with this
- 10 <u>Section</u>.
- 11 (i) If an applicant for a scholarship under this Section
- 12 <u>accepts another teacher preparation scholarship administered</u>
- 13 by the Commission for the same academic year as the
- 14 scholarship under this Section, that applicant shall not be
- eligible for a scholarship under this Section.
- 16 <u>(j) To continue receiving scholarship assistance, a</u>
- 17 <u>scholarship recipient must remain a full-time student and</u>
- 18 <u>must maintain a cumulative grade point average at the</u>
- 19 postsecondary level of no less than 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- 20 (k) A scholarship shall not be awarded to or continued
- 21 for anyone who has been convicted of a criminal offense that
- 22 would disqualify that person from receiving teacher
- 23 <u>certification in this State.</u>
- 24 (1) If a scholarship recipient satisfies the president
- of the institution of higher learning in which the recipient
- is enrolled (or someone designated by the president) that the
- 27 <u>recipient requires a leave of absence for the purpose of</u>
- 28 <u>earning</u> funds to defray his or her expenses while enrolled
- in the institution, for study abroad or internship study, or
- 30 <u>on account of illness or military service, then leave may be</u>
- 31 granted for a period of time not to exceed 6 years (with time
- 32 spent in the armed forces not included as part of this time
- 33 <u>limit</u>) without violating the agreement entered into pursuant
- 34 to subsection (f) of this Section.

- 1 (m) Scholarship amounts due to an institution of
- 2 <u>higher learning shall be payable by the Comptroller to that</u>
- 3 <u>institution on vouchers approved by the Commission.</u>
- 4 (n) The Commission shall administer the program created
- 5 <u>under this Section and shall adopt all necessary and proper</u>
- 6 rules not inconsistent with this Section for the program's
- 7 <u>effective implementation</u>. All <u>applications for scholarship</u>
- 8 <u>assistance shall be made to the Commission in a form as set</u>
- 9 forth by the Commission. The form of application and the
- 10 <u>information required to be set forth in the application shall</u>
- 11 <u>be determined by the Commission</u>, and the Commission shall
- 12 require applicants to submit with their applications any
- 13 supporting documents that the Commission deems necessary.
- 14 (o) If an appropriation to the Commission for a given
- 15 <u>fiscal year is insufficient to provide scholarships to all</u>
- 16 qualified applicants, then the Commission shall allocate the
- 17 <u>available scholarship funds for that fiscal year on the</u>
- 18 <u>basis of the date the Commission receives a complete</u>
- 19 <u>application form from a qualified applicant.</u>
- 20 Section 15. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 21 adding Section 3-648 as follows:
- 22 (625 ILCS 5/3-648 new)
- Sec. 3-648. Education license plates.
- 24 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made
- 25 <u>in the form prescribed by the Secretary, may issue special</u>
- 26 <u>registration plates designated as Education license plates.</u>
- 27 The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed
- 28 <u>only to passenger vehicles of the first division and motor</u>
- 29 <u>vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000</u>
- 30 pounds. Plates issued under this Section shall expire
- 31 <u>according to the multi-year procedure established by Section</u>
- 32 <u>3-414.1 of this Code.</u>

1 (b) The design and color of the plates shall be 2 determined by a contest that every elementary school pupil in the State of Illinois is eligible to enter. The designs 3 submitted for the contest shall be judged on September 30, 4 2002, and the winning design shall be selected by a committee 5 composed of the Secretary, the Director of State Police, 2 6 7 members of the Senate, one member chosen by the President of the Senate and one member chosen by the Senate Minority 8 9 Leader, and 2 members of the House of Representatives, one member chosen by the Speaker of the House and one member 10 chosen by the House Minority Leader. The Secretary may allow 11 the plates to be issued as vanity or personalized plates 12 under Section 3-405.1 of the Code. The Secretary shall 13 prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412 14 15 of this Code. 16 (c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged 17 \$40 fee for original issuance, in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this \$40 additional original 18 issuance fee, \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of 19 State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary 20 21 to help defray the administrative processing costs, and \$25 22 shall be deposited into the Illinois Future Teacher Corps Scholarship Fund. For each registration renewal period, a 23 24 \$40 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this \$40 additional renewal fee, \$2 25 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special 26 License Plate Fund and \$38 shall be deposited into the 27 Illinois Future Teacher Corps Scholarship Fund. Each fiscal 28 29 year, once deposits from the additional original issuance and renewal fees into the Secretary of State Special License 30 Plate Fund have reached \$500,000, all the amounts received 31 for the additional fees for the balance of the fiscal year 32 shall be deposited into the Illinois Future Teacher Corps 33 34 Scholarship Fund.

- 1 (d) The Illinois Future Teacher Corps Scholarship Fund
- 2 <u>is created as a special fund in the State treasury.</u>
- 3 <u>Ninety-five percent of the moneys in the Illinois Future</u>
- 4 <u>Teacher Corps Scholarship Fund shall be appropriated to the</u>
- 5 <u>Illinois Student Assistance Commission for scholarships under</u>
- 6 Section 65.65 of the Higher Education Student Assistance Act,
- 7 and 5% of the moneys in the Illinois Future Teacher Corps
- 8 Scholarship Fund shall be appropriated to the State Board of
- 9 Education for grants to the Golden Apple Foundation for
- 10 <u>Excellence in Teaching, a recognized charitable organization</u>
- that meets the requirements of Title 26, Section 501(c)(3) of
- 12 <u>the United States Code.</u>
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 14 becoming law.
