The increase in child's disability benefit provided by this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 8 9 Assembly applies beginning January 1, 2000 to all such benefits payable on or after that date, regardless of whether 10
- The occupational disease disability benefit is payable during the period of disability until the police officer attains age 63 or compulsory retirement age, whichever occurs later; thereafter the police officer shall receive the benefits provided under the other provisions of this Article.

 If the police officer ceases to be disabled, the occupational disease disability benefit shall cease.

- The child's disability benefit is payable during the 20 period of disability until the child attains age 18 or 21 22 marries, whichever event occurs first, except that a benefit 23 payable on account of a child under this Section shall not be reduced or terminated by reason of the child's attainment of 24 25 age 18 if he or she is then dependent by reason of a physical or mental disability, but shall continue to be paid as long 26 as the child's dependency and disability continue. 27
