Amends the Election Code. Requires that an otherwise qualified elector subject to the Sex Offender Registration Act whose polling place is in a library or school must vote by absentee or early voting ballot.

Deletes everything after the enacting clause. Amends the Election Code, the Criminal Code of 1961, and the Sex Offender Community Notification Law. Requires that an otherwise qualified elector subject to the registration requirement of the Sex Offender Registration Act whose assigned polling place is in a school must vote by absentee or early voting ballot. Provides that a person subject to the registration requirement of the Sex Offender Registration Act who enters a polling place located in a school commits a Class 4 felony. Thirty days before an election, requires the Department of State Police to provide each election authority with a list of sex offenders registered in the election jurisdiction. Requires each election authority to provide election judges at a polling place in a school with a copy of that list. Requires an election judge who becomes aware that a person required to register as a sex offender has entered a polling place in a school must promptly notify local law enforcement authorities.

Senate Floor Amendment No. 3

Deletes everything after the enacting clause. Amends the Election Code and the Criminal Code of 1961. Requires that an otherwise qualified elector subject to the registration requirement of the Sex Offender Registration Act whose assigned polling place is in a school must vote by absentee or early voting ballot. Provides that a person subject to the registration requirement of the Sex Offender Registration Act who enters a polling place located in a school commits a Class 4 felony. Thirty days before an election, requires the State Board of Elections to notify each election authority of the prohibition against sex offenders subject to the registration requirement voting in polling places located in schools and instructing the authority in the use of the Sex Offender Registration Information website to generate a printed list of sex offenders registered in the authority's jurisdiction. Requires each election authority to provide election judges at a polling place in a school with a copy of that list. Requires an election judge who becomes aware that a person required to register as a sex offender has entered a polling place in a school must promptly notify local law enforcement authorities.

Amends the School Code. Provides that the State Board of Education shall have the necessary powers to promote sound academic management and to continue operation of the public schools. Provides that the State Board, after proper investigation of the school or school district's academic condition, may certify that a school or district is in academic difficulty if (i) the school or district has been placed on academic early warning status and has failed to make adequate yearly progress for a third consecutive year; (ii) the school or district has been placed on academic watch status; (iii) the district has failed to produce an acceptable school improvement plan following placement of the school or district on academic early warning status or academic watch status; (iv) the school or district has failed to provide the required percentage of highly qualified teachers to its students for 2 consecutive years and is determined to be in need of intervention by the State Board; or (v) the school or district has been engaged in documented and substantiated acts of mismanagement in regard to hiring practices that has placed the academic integrity of the school or district in question or has placed students in physical danger and that is determined to be in need of intervention by the State Board. Under certain circumstances, provides for the development of an academic improvement plan, the appointment of an academic oversight panel, and the establishment of a school or district academic authority panel. Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement.

House Amendment No. 1

Provides that nothing in the provisions concerning the powers of the State Board of Education in assisting schools and districts deemed in academic difficulties shall be construed to alter or otherwise affect the rights, remedies, and procedures afforded school district or school employees under federal, State, or local law (including applicable rules, regulations, or court orders) or under the terms of any collective bargaining agreements, memoranda of understanding, or other agreements between school employees and their employers.

House Amendment No. 3

Deletes everything after the enacting clause. Amends the School Code. Provides that the State Board of Education shall have the necessary powers to promote sound management of Illinois public schools. Allows the State Board to certify that a school district, other than the Chicago school district, is in management difficulty if the school district has been engaged in a continuing and repeated pattern of documented and substantiated mismanagement. Under certain circumstances, allows the State Board to require the development of a school district management improvement plan, advise a school district on recommended or suggested methods of improving managerial success, and appoint a Management Oversight Panel for the school district. Sets forth provisions concerning the composition and duties of a Management Oversight Panel and allows for a combined Management Oversight Panel and Financial Oversight Panel in certain circumstances. Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement.

Provides that the legislative purpose of this Act is to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by encouraging the use of renewable resource energy systems to conserve and protect land and resources and prevent measures which will drive the cost of owning residential property beyond the capacity of private owners.

Provides that on and after the effective date of this amendatory Act, no license shall be granted or renewed under the Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act until the applicant seeking the license submits to the Department of Public Health, and the Department approves, a plan for the service of medically underserved populations that details for each of the facility's next 5 years of operation (i) the proportion of its total projected patients in the categories of indigent and Medicaid recipients and (ii) how the facility will serve those patients. Requires the Department to adopt rules for implementing the requirement of a plan for the service of medically underserved populations, including the development of appropriate minimum proportions of facility patients in the categories of indigent and Medicaid recipients. Effective immediately.

Senate Floor Amendment No. 1

Replaces the amendatory provisions of the bill concerning the granting and renewal of licenses under the Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act. Provides that on and after the effective date of this amendatory Act, no license shall be granted or renewed unless the applicant: (i) submits, and the Department of Public Health approves, a plan for providing service to Medicaid recipients and medically underserved populations in its service area; or (ii) submits a plan for charity care that has been approved by the Illinois Attorney General; or (iii) submits a notarized statement signed by the Chief Executive Officer of the organization certifying that the applicant will not refuse service to any patient because the services the patient seeks may be reimbursed under Medicaid. Provides that in addition, no license shall be granted or renewed if the Department determines that the applicant has not complied with a prior plan or notarized statement submitted pursuant to these provisions.

Provides that no provision of the Adolescent Health Care Safety Act impairs a physician, counselor, or other healthcare professional's rights under the Health Care Right of Conscience Act and the Abortion Performance Refusal Act.

Provides that, in order to be eligible for this benefit, a youth must have: (A) at the time wardship terminated, reached the age of 18 years or older; and (B) either (i) at the time wardship terminated, obtained a certificate of graduation from a high school or the recognized equivalent of such a certificate; (ii) within one year after wardship terminated, obtained a certificate of graduation from a high school or the recognized equivalent of such a certificate, or (iii) within one year after wardship terminated, been determined by DCFS to lack the ability to obtain a certificate of graduation from a high school, or the recognized equivalent of such a certificate, due to an impairment or disability. Provides that the Department shall establish by rule (i) procedures for verifying eligibility for the receipt of the stipend and for determining the amount of the stipend to be awarded and (ii) a process for disseminating the payments.

Provides that the Illinois Commerce Commission shall require certain electric utilities or alternative retail electric suppliers to submit certain data concerning non-supervisory employees. Requires Commission rules to set forth (i) standards for inspecting, maintaining, and repairing certain electric generation facilities and electric transmission or distribution facilities and (ii) safety and reliability standards for certain electric generation facilities and electric transmission and distribution facilities. Provides that the Commission shall be authorized to levy financial penalties upon any entity that fails to meet the service quality and reliability standards of certain provisions. Makes other changes. Effective immediately.

House Amendment No. 1

Provides that an electric utility shall offer net metering to eligible customers until the load of its net energy metering customers equals 0.1% of the total peak demand supplied by the electric utility during the previous year. Electric utilities are authorized to offer net energy metering beyond 0.1% of peak load if they so choose. Effective immediately.

Provides that none of the provisions of the amendatory Act shall affect the right of an electricity provider, to continue to provide or the right of a retail customer to continue to receive, service pursuant to a contract for electric service between the electricity provide and the retail customer, in accordance with the prices, terms, and conditions provided for in that contract, and that either the electricity provider or the customer may require compliance with the prices, terms, and conditions of that contract. Makes technical changes. Effective immediately.

Adds language providing that any person or entity licensed under specified provisions shall file with the Commission a verified report detailing (1) any and all contractual relationships that it has with the certified electricity suppliers in the State regarding retail electric service in Illinois (rather than not specifying that the report be in regards to retail electric service in Illinois), and (2) the distribution of its customers with the various certified electricity suppliers during the prior calendar year in Illinois (rather than not specifying Illinois). Provides that the Commission shall have jurisdiction over disciplinary proceedings and complaints (instead of exclusive jurisdiction over all disciplinary proceedings and complaints) for violations of specified provisions. Provides that a physical fitness facility must ensure that there is a trained AED user present during all physical fitness activities. Requires the Department of Public Health to adopt rules that encourage any non-employee coach, non-employee instructor, or other similarly situated non-employee anticipated rescuer who uses a physical fitness facility in conjunction with the supervision of physical fitness activities to complete a course of instruction that would qualify such a person as a trained AED user. Provides that in the case of an outdoor physical fitness facility, the AED must be housed in a building, if any, that is within 300 feet of (instead of closest to) the outdoor facility where an event or activity is being conducted. Provides that if there is such a building within the required distance, the building must provide unimpeded and open access to the housed AED, and the building's entrances shall further provide marked directions to the housed AED. Makes other changes.
