HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 28

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois recognizes certain dates of the year for honoring specific patriotic, civic, cultural, and historical persons, activities, or events; and

WHEREAS, March 31 is the birthday of Cesar E. Chavez, (1927-1993); and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez steadfastly believed that ordinary people can make extraordinary social change when they are individually guided by, and bound together by, universal values and a common vision for a better world; the values he strove for include: service to others, sacrifice, a preference to help the most needy, determination, non-violence, tolerance, respect for life, celebrating community, knowledge and innovation; and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez began his labor career in the early 1950s as an organizer for the Community Service Organization (CSO); his work for the CSO included coordinating voter registration drives, battling racial and economic discrimination against Chicano residents, and organizing new

WHEREAS, After failing to convince the CSO to help migrant farm workers in their union organizing efforts, he quit his job with the CSO and founded the National Farm Workers Association (NFWA); in 1965, the NFWA, with 1,200 member families, joined an AFL-CIO-sponsored union in a strike against Delano growers; in 1966, the two unions merged to form the United Farm Workers (UFW); in 1968, he conducted a 25-day fast to reaffirm the UFW's commitment to non-violence; the NFW's boycott against grape growers persuaded the growers to sign contracts with the UFW in 1970; however, after contract renegotiations in 1973, the growers signed contracts with the Teamsters; the farm workers objected to the Teamster contract, and more that 10,000 of them walked off their jobs; and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez then called for a world-wide boycott of grapes; by 1975, a poll showed that 17 million Americans supported the boycott; the boycott persuaded growers to support the 1975 California Agricultural Labor Relations Act; and

WHEREAS, In 1982, Republican George Deukmajian was elected Governor of California; under Governor Deukmajian's leadership, the California Agricultural Labor Relations Board ceased to enforce the Agricultural Labor Relations Act; in 1988, Cesar Chavez conducted a 36-day "Fast for Life" to protest the pesticide poisoning of farm workers; and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez died in 1993; in 1994, President Clinton posthumously awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom; he became the second Mexican-American to receive this award; and

WHEREAS, In 1994, the family of Cesar Chavez and the officers of the United Farm Workers created the Cesar E. Chavez Foundation to "inspire current and future generations by promoting the ideals of Cesar Chavez's life"; and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez spent 31 years forging a legacy of service, conviction and principled leadership that served as a beacon for Americans; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we recognize March 31 as Cesar Chavez Day in Illinois and encourage public and private entities throughout the State to celebrate the birthday of this great man.

This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 10. The Southern Illinois University Management Act is amended by adding Section 15 as follows:

(110 ILCS 520/15 new)

Sec. 15. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 15. The Chicago State University Law is amended by adding Section 5-120 as follows: (110 ILCS 660/5-120 new)

Sec. 5-120. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 20. The Eastern Illinois University Law is amended by adding Section 10-120 as follows: (110 ILCS 665/10-120 new)

Sec. 10-120. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 25. The Governors State University Law is amended by adding Section 15-120 as follows: (110 ILCS 670/15-120 new)

Sec. 15-120. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 30. The Illinois State University Law is amended by adding Section 20-125 as follows: (110 ILCS 675/20-125 new)

Sec. 20-125. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 35. The Northeastern Illinois University Law is amended by adding Section 25-120 as follows:

(110 ILCS 680/25-120 new)

Sec. 25-120. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 40. The Northern Illinois University Law is amended by adding Section 30-130 as follows: (110 ILCS 685/30-130 new)

Sec. 30-130. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years.

Section 45. The Western Illinois University Law is amended by adding Section 35-125 as follows: (110 ILCS 690/35-125 new)

Sec. 35-125. Limitation on tuition increase. Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University. This Section constitutes a binding and irrevocable tuition guarantee for 4 academic years."

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendments Numbered 1 and 2 were ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Demuzio, Senate Bill No. 13 having been printed, was taken up, read by title a second time.

Senator Demuzio offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 13 on page 3, by replacing lines 24 through 31 with the following:

"with the exception of subsection (c) and with the exception of records of a labor organization authorized and recognized under the Illinois Public Labor Relations Act to be the exclusive bargaining representative of employees of the Secretary of State, including, but not limited to, records of representation of employees and the negotiation of collective bargaining agreements. A subpoena may be"

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted and ordered printed.

Floor Amendment No. 2 was held in the Committee on Executive.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Obama, **Senate Bill No. 30** having been printed, was taken up, read by title a second time.

Senator Obama offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. <u>1</u>. Amend Senate Bill 30 on page 1, after line 3, by inserting the following: "Section 3. The Freedom of Information Act is amended by changing Section 7 as follows:

(5 ILCS 140/7) (from Ch. 116, par. 207)

Sec. 7. Exemptions. (1) The following shall be exempt from inspection and copying:

(a) Information specifically prohibited from disclosure by federal or State law or rules and regulations adopted under federal or State law.

(b) Information that, if disclosed, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless the disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information. The disclosure of information that bears on the public duties of public employees and officials shall not be considered an invasion of personal privacy. Information exempted under this subsection (b) shall include but is not limited to:

(i) files and personal information maintained with respect to clients, patients, residents, students or other individuals receiving social, medical, educational, vocational, financial, supervisory or custodial care or services directly or indirectly from federal agencies or public bodies;

(ii) personnel files and personal information maintained with respect to employees, appointees or elected officials of any public body or applicants for those positions;

(iii) files and personal information maintained with respect to any applicant, registrant or licensee by any public body cooperating with or engaged in professional or occupational registration, licensure or discipline;

(iv) information required of any taxpayer in connection with the assessment or collection of any tax unless disclosure is otherwise required by State statute; and

(v) information revealing the identity of persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement or penal agencies; provided, however, that identification of witnesses to traffic accidents, traffic accident reports, and rescue reports may be provided by agencies of local government, except in a case for which a criminal investigation is ongoing, without constituting a clearly unwarranted per se invasion of personal privacy under this subsection.

(c) Records compiled by any public body for administrative enforcement proceedings and any law enforcement or correctional agency for law enforcement purposes or for internal matters of a public body, but only to the extent that disclosure would:

(i) interfere with pending or actually and reasonably contemplated law enforcement proceedings conducted by any law enforcement or correctional agency;

(ii) interfere with pending administrative enforcement proceedings conducted by any public body;

(iii) deprive a person of a fair trial or an impartial hearing;

(iv) unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source or confidential information furnished only by the confidential source;

(v) disclose unique or specialized investigative techniques other than those generally used and known or disclose internal documents of correctional agencies related to detection, observation or investigation of incidents of crime or misconduct;

(vi) constitute an invasion of personal privacy under subsection (b) of this Section;

(vii) endanger the life or physical safety of law enforcement personnel or any other person; or (viii) obstruct an ongoing criminal investigation.

(d) Criminal history record information maintained by State or local criminal justice agencies, except the following which shall be open for public inspection and copying:

(i) chronologically maintained arrest information, such as traditional arrest logs or blotters;

(ii) the name of a person in the custody of a law enforcement agency and the charges for which that person is being held;

(iii) court records that are public;

(iv) records that are otherwise available under State or local law; or

(v) records in which the requesting party is the individual identified, except as provided under part (vii) of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of this Section.

"Criminal history record information" means data identifiable to an individual and consisting of descriptions or notations of arrests, detentions, indictments, informations, pre-trial proceedings, trials, or other formal events in the criminal justice system or descriptions or notations of criminal charges (including criminal violations of local municipal ordinances) and the nature of any disposition arising therefrom, including sentencing, court or correctional supervision, rehabilitation and release. The term does not apply to statistical records and reports in which individuals are not identified and from which their identities are not ascertainable, or to information that is for criminal investigative or intelligence purposes.

(e) Records that relate to or affect the security of correctional institutions and detention facilities.

(f) Preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, memoranda and other records in which opinions are expressed, or policies or actions are formulated, except that a specific record or relevant portion of a record shall not be exempt when the record is publicly cited and identified by the head of the public body. The exemption provided in this paragraph (f) extends to all those records of officers and agencies of the General Assembly that pertain to the preparation of legislative documents.

(g) Trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person or business where the trade secrets or information are proprietary, privileged or confidential, or where disclosure of the trade secrets or information may cause competitive harm, including all information determined to be confidential under Section 4002 of the Technology Advancement and Development Act. Nothing contained in this paragraph (g) shall be construed to prevent a person or business from consenting to disclosure.

(h) Proposals and bids for any contract, grant, or agreement, including information which if it were disclosed would frustrate procurement or give an advantage to any person proposing to enter into a contractor agreement with the body, until an award or final selection is made. Information prepared by or for the body in preparation of a bid solicitation shall be exempt until an award or final selection is made.

(i) Valuable formulae, computer geographic systems, designs, drawings and research data obtained or produced by any public body when disclosure could reasonably be expected to produce private gain or public loss.

(j) Test questions, scoring keys and other examination data used to administer an academic examination or determined the qualifications of an applicant for a license or employment.

(k) Architects' plans and engineers' technical submissions for projects not constructed or

developed in whole or in part with public funds and for projects constructed or developed with public funds, to the extent that disclosure would compromise security.

(1) Library circulation and order records identifying library users with specific materials.

(m) Minutes of meetings of public bodies closed to the public as provided in the Open Meetings Act until the public body makes the minutes available to the public under Section 2.06 of the Open Meetings Act.

(n) Communications between a public body and an attorney or auditor representing the public body that would not be subject to discovery in litigation, and materials prepared or compiled by or for a public body in anticipation of a criminal, civil or administrative proceeding upon the request of an attorney advising the public body, and materials prepared or compiled with respect to internal audits of public bodies.

(o) Information received by a primary or secondary school, college or university under its procedures for the evaluation of faculty members by their academic peers.

(p) Administrative or technical information associated with automated data processing operations, including but not limited to software, operating protocols, computer program abstracts, file layouts, source listings, object modules, load modules, user guides, documentation pertaining to all logical and physical design of computerized systems, employee manuals, and any other information that, if disclosed, would jeopardize the security of the system or its data or the security of materials exempt under this Section.

(q) Documents or materials relating to collective negotiating matters between public bodies and their employees or representatives, except that any final contract or agreement shall be subject to inspection and copying.

(r) Drafts, notes, recommendations and memoranda pertaining to the financing and marketing transactions of the public body. The records of ownership, registration, transfer, and exchange of municipal debt obligations, and of persons to whom payment with respect to these obligations is made.

(s) The records, documents and information relating to real estate purchase negotiations until those negotiations have been completed or otherwise terminated. With regard to a parcel involved in a pending or actually and reasonably contemplated eminent domain proceeding under Article VII of the Code of Civil Procedure, records, documents and information relating to that parcel shall be exempt except as may be allowed under discovery rules adopted by the Illinois Supreme Court. The records, documents and information relating to a real estate sale shall be exempt until a sale is consummated.

(t) Any and all proprietary information and records related to the operation of an intergovernmental risk management association or self-insurance pool or jointly self-administered health and accident cooperative or pool.

(u) Information concerning a university's adjudication of student or employee grievance or disciplinary cases, to the extent that disclosure would reveal the identity of the student or employee and information concerning any public body's adjudication of student or employee grievances or disciplinary cases, except for the final outcome of the cases.

(v) Course materials or research materials used by faculty members.

(w) Information related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of a public body.

(x) Information contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of a public body responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions or insurance companies, unless disclosure is otherwise required by State law.

(y) Information the disclosure of which is restricted under Section 5-108 of the Public Utilities Act.

(z) Manuals or instruction to staff that relate to establishment or collection of liability for any State tax or that relate to investigations by a public body to determine violation of any criminal law.

(aa) Applications, related documents, and medical records received by the Experimental Organ Transplantation Procedures Board and any and all documents or other records prepared by the Experimental Organ Transplantation Procedures Board or its staff relating to applications it has received.

(bb) Insurance or self insurance (including any intergovernmental risk management association or self insurance pool) claims, loss or risk management information, records, data, advice or communications.

(cc) Information and records held by the Department of Public Health and its authorized representatives relating to known or suspected cases of sexually transmissible disease or any information the disclosure of which is restricted under the Illinois Sexually Transmissible Disease

Control Act.

(dd) Information the disclosure of which is exempted under Section 30 of the Radon Industry Licensing Act.

(ee) Firm performance evaluations under Section 55 of the Architectural, Engineering, and Land Surveying Qualifications Based Selection Act.

(ff) Security portions of system safety program plans, investigation reports, surveys, schedules, lists, data, or information compiled, collected, or prepared by or for the Regional Transportation Authority under Section 2.11 of the Regional Transportation Authority Act or the St. Clair County Transit District under the Bi-State Transit Safety Act.

(gg) Information the disclosure of which is restricted and exempted under Section 50 of the Illinois Prepaid Tuition Act.

(hh) Information the disclosure of which is exempted under Section 80 of the State Gift Ban Act.

(ii) Beginning July 1, 1999, information that would disclose or might lead to the disclosure of secret or confidential information, codes, algorithms, programs, or private keys intended to be used to create electronic or digital signatures under the Electronic Commerce Security Act.

(jj) Information contained in a local emergency energy plan submitted to a municipality in accordance with a local emergency energy plan ordinance that is adopted under Section 11-21.5-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

(kk) Information and data concerning the distribution of surcharge moneys collected and remitted by wireless carriers under the Wireless Emergency Telephone Safety Act.

(II) Law enforcement officer identification information or driver identification information compiled by a law enforcement agency or the Department of Transportation under Section 11-212 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

(2) This Section does not authorize withholding of information or limit the availability of records to the public, except as stated in this Section or otherwise provided in this Act. (Source: P.A. 91-137, eff. 7-16-99; 91-357, eff. 7-29-99; 91-660, eff. 12-22-99; 92-16, eff. 6-28-01; 92-241, eff. 8-3-01; 92-281, eff. 8-7-01; 92-645, eff. 7-11-02; 92-651, eff. 7-11-02.)

"; and

by replacing lines 15 through 32 on page 4, all of page 5, and lines 1 through 21 on page 6 with the following:

"Section 15. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by adding Section 11-212 as follows:

(625 ILCS 5/11-212 new)

Sec. 11-212. Traffic stop statistical study.

(a) From January 1, 2004 until December 31, 2007, whenever a State or local law enforcement officer issues a uniform traffic citation or warning citation for an alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall record at least the following:

(1) the name, address, gender, and the officer's subjective determination of the race of the person stopped; the person's race shall be selected from the following list: Caucasian, African-American, Hispanic, Native American/Alaska Native, or Asian/Pacific Islander;

(2) the alleged traffic violation that led to the stop of the motorist;

(3) the make and year of the vehicle stopped;

(4) the date and time of the stop;

(5) the location of the traffic stop;

(6) whether or not a search contemporaneous to the stop was conducted of the vehicle, driver, passenger, or passengers; and, if so, whether it was with consent or by other means; and

(7) the name and badge number of the issuing officer.

(b) From January 1, 2004 until December 31, 2007, whenever a State or local law enforcement officer stops a motorist for an alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code and does not issue a uniform traffic citation or warning citation for an alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall complete a uniform stop card, which includes field contact cards, or any other existing form currently used by law enforcement containing information required pursuant to this Act, that records at least the following:

(1) the name, address, gender, and the officer's subjective determination of the race of the person stopped; the person's race shall be selected from the following list: Caucasian, African-American, Hispanic, Native American/Alaska Native, or Asian/Pacific Islander;

(2) the reason that led to the stop of the motorist;

(3) the make and year of the vehicle stopped;

(4) the date and time of the stop;

(5) the location of the traffic stop;

(6) whether or not a search contemporaneous to the stop was conducted of the vehicle, driver, passenger, or passengers; and, if so, whether it was with consent or by other means; and

(7) the name and badge number of the issuing officer.

(c) Every law enforcement agency shall collect and transmit the data as described in subsections (a) and (b) to the Illinois Department of Transportation, in such a manner and at such times as the Department may require.

(d) The Illinois Department of Transportation shall analyze the data provided by law enforcement agencies required by this Section and submit a report of the findings to the Governor, the General Assembly, and each law enforcement agency no later than March 1 in each of the years 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008. The Illinois Department of Transportation may contract with an outside entity for the analysis of the data provided. In analyzing the data collected under this Section, the analyzing entity shall scrutinize the data for evidence of statistically significant aberrations. The following list, which is illustrative, and not exclusive, contains examples of areas in which statistically significant aberrations may be found:

(1) The percentage of minority drivers or passengers being stopped in a given area is substantially higher than the proportion of the overall population in or traveling through the area that the minority constitutes.

(2) A substantial number of false stops including stops not resulting in the issuance of a traffic ticket or the making of an arrest.

(3) A disparity between the proportion of citations issued to minorities and proportion of minorities in the population.

(4) A disparity among the officers of the same law enforcement agency with regard to the number of minority drivers or passengers being stopped in a given area.

(5) A disparity between the frequency of searches performed on minority drivers and the frequency of searches performed on non-minority drivers.

(e) Any law enforcement officer identification information or driver identification information that is compiled by any law enforcement agency or the Illinois Department of Transportation pursuant to this Act for the purposes of fulfilling the requirements of this Section shall be confidential and exempt from public inspection and copying, as provided under Section 7 of the Freedom of Information Act, and the information shall not be transmitted to anyone except as needed to comply with this Section. This Section shall not exempt those materials that, prior to the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, were available under the Freedom of Information Act.

(f) Funding to implement this Section shall come from federal funds available to Illinois or from State and community grants or highway safety grants, as directed by the Governor.".

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator del Valle, Senate Bill No. 67 having been printed, was taken up, read by title a second time.

Senator del Valle offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 67 on page 1, line 5, replacing "Section 6-106" with "Sections 6-106 and 6-110"; and

on page 1, by replacing lines 30 and 31 with the following:

"State <u>shall require the use of an individual tax identification number</u> may in his discretion substitute a federal tax number in lieu of a social security number <u>and</u>, or he may <u>also</u> instead assign an additional distinctive number. The Secretary of State shall also require any other proof of State residency <u>established by rule</u> in lieu thereof, where an"; and

on page 2, by deleting line 1; and

on page 3, below line 6, by inserting the following:

"(625 ILCS 5/6-110) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-110)

Sec. 6-110. Licenses issued to drivers. (a) The Secretary of State shall issue to every qualifying applicant a driver's license as applied for, which license shall bear a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, the name, social security number, zip code, date of birth, address, and a brief description of the licensee, and a space where the licensee may write his usual signature.

If the licensee is less than 17 years of age, the license shall, as a matter of law, be invalid for the operation of any motor vehicle during any time the licensee is prohibited from being on any street or highway under the provisions of the Child Curfew Act.

Licenses issued shall also indicate the classification and the restrictions under Section 6-104 of this Code.

In lieu of the social security number, the Secretary <u>shall require the use of an individual tax number</u> and may also assign an additional may in his discretion substitute a federal tax number or other distinctive number.

A driver's license issued may, in the discretion of the Secretary, include a suitable photograph of a type prescribed by the Secretary.

(b) The Secretary of State shall provide a format on the reverse of each driver's license issued which the licensee may use to execute a document of gift conforming to the provisions of the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. The format shall allow the licensee to indicate the gift intended, whether specific organs, any organ, or the entire body, and shall accommodate the signatures of the donor and 2 witnesses. The Secretary shall also inform each applicant or licensee of this format, describe the procedure for its execution, and may offer the necessary witnesses; provided that in so doing, the Secretary shall advise the applicant or licensee that he or she is under no compulsion to execute a document of gift. A brochure explaining this method of executing an anatomical gift document shall be given to each applicant or licensee. The brochure shall advise the applicant or licensee that he or she is under no consult with family, friends or clergy before doing so. The Secretary of State may undertake additional efforts, including education and awareness activities, to promote organ and tissue donation.

(c) The Secretary of State shall designate on each driver's license issued a space where the licensee may place a sticker or decal of the uniform size as the Secretary may specify, which sticker or decal may indicate in appropriate language that the owner of the license carries an Emergency Medical Information Card.

The sticker may be provided by any person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested in assisting in implementing the Emergency Medical Information Card, but shall meet the specifications as the Secretary may by rule or regulation require.

(d) The Secretary of State shall designate on each driver's license issued a space where the licensee may indicate his blood type and RH factor.

(e) The Secretary of State shall provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee under 21 years of age shall be of a distinct nature from those driver's licenses issued to individuals 21 years of age and older. The color designated for driver's licenses for licensees under 21 years of age shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

(e-1) The Secretary shall provide that each driver's license issued to a person under the age of 21 displays the date upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon which the person becomes 21 years of age.

(f) The Secretary of State shall inform all Illinois licensed commercial motor vehicle operators of the requirements of the Uniform Commercial Driver License Act, Article V of this Chapter, and shall make provisions to insure that all drivers, seeking to obtain a commercial driver's license, be afforded an opportunity prior to April 1, 1992, to obtain the license. The Secretary is authorized to extend driver's license expiration dates, and assign specific times, dates and locations where these commercial driver's tests shall be conducted. Any applicant, regardless of the current expiration date of the applicant's driver's license, may be subject to any assignment by the Secretary. Failure to comply with the Secretary's license prior to April 1, 1992.

(g) The Secretary of State shall designate on a driver's license issued, a space where the licensee may indicate that he or she has drafted a living will in accordance with the Illinois Living Will Act or a durable power of attorney for health care in accordance with the Illinois Power of Attorney Act.

(g-1) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may designate on each driver's license issued a space where the licensee may place a sticker or decal, issued by the Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the owner of the license has renewed his or her driver's license.

(h) A person who acts in good faith in accordance with the terms of this Section is not liable for damages in any civil action or subject to prosecution in any criminal proceeding for his or her act. (Source: P.A. 91-357, eff. 7-29-99; 92-689, eff. 1-1-03.)".

Sec. 10. State Board of Pharmacy. There is created in the Department the State Board of Pharmacy. It shall consist of 9 members, 7 of whom shall be licensed pharmacists. Each of those 7 members must be a licensed pharmacist in good standing in this State, a graduate of an accredited college of pharmacy or hold a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy and have at least 5 years' practical experience in the practice of pharmacy subsequent to the date of his licensure as a licensed pharmacist in the State of Illinois. There shall be 2 public members, who shall be voting members, who shall not be licensed pharmacists in this State or any other state.

Each member shall be appointed by the Governor.

The terms of all members serving as of March 31, 1999 shall expire on that date. The Governor shall appoint 3 persons to serve one-year terms, 3 persons to serve 3-year terms, and 3 persons to serve 5-year terms to begin April 1, 1999. Otherwise, members shall be appointed to 5 year terms. No member shall be eligible to serve more than 12 consecutive years.

In making the appointment of members on the Board, the Governor shall give due consideration to recommendations by the members of the profession of pharmacy and by pharmaceutical organizations therein. The Governor shall notify the pharmaceutical organizations promptly of any vacancy of members on the Board and in appointing members shall give consideration to individuals engaged in all types and settings of pharmacy practice. In filling the first vacancy to occur after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, the Governor shall appoint a pharmacist who serves as a hospital pharmacist.

The Governor may remove any member of the Board for misconduct, incapacity or neglect of duty and he shall be the sole judge of the sufficiency of the cause for removal.

The Director shall, in conformity with the Personnel Code, employ not less than 7 pharmacy investigators and 2 pharmacy supervisors. Each pharmacy investigator and each supervisor shall be a registered pharmacist in good standing in this State, and shall be a graduate of an accredited college of pharmacy and have at least 5 years of experience in the practice of pharmacy. The Department shall also employ at least one attorney who is a pharmacist to prosecute violations of this Act and its rules. The Department may, in conformity with the Personnel Code, employ such clerical and other employees as are necessary to carry out the duties of the Board.

The duly authorized pharmacy investigators of the Department shall have the right to enter and inspect during business hours any pharmacy or any other place in the State of Illinois holding itself out to be a pharmacy where medicines or drugs or drug products or proprietary medicines are sold, offered for sale, exposed for sale, or kept for sale. AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 552 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Discriminatory Pricing Act

Section 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Charge" means the uniform price for a specific service charged by a hospital.

"Cost of providing services" means a hospital's published charges at the time of billing of an uninsured patient, multiplied by the hospital's most recent relationship of costs to charges as taken from the Medicaid cost report.

"Hospital" means a health care facility licensed under the Hospital Licensing Act. "Hospital" does not include health care facilities whose most recent relationship of costs to charges as taken from the Medicaid cost report is one or greater.

"Income" means income defined as federal adjusted gross income from the previous year. Patients who are unemployed may request a determination based on an estimate of their current year income.

"Medically needy patient" means any person or household with total medical bills for medically necessary medical services that were not covered by any medical or health coverage that exceed 20% of their income in the previous year and who (A) have previously applied and been denied eligibility for any medical or health care coverage provided under the general assistance program or the Medicaid program due to failure to satisfy income or other eligibility requirements, and (B) are not eligible for coverage for hospital services under the Medicare or under any Medicaid or health insurance program of any other nation, state, territory, or commonwealth, or under any other governmental or privately sponsored health or accident insurance or benefit program including, but not limited to, workers' compensation and awards, settlements, or judgments arising from claims, suits, or proceedings involving motor vehicle accidents or alleged negligence.

"Uninsured patient" means a person whose income is at or below 300% of the poverty income guidelines who (A) has previously applied and been denied eligibility for any medical or health care coverage provided under the general assistance program or the Medicaid program due to failure to satisfy income or other eligibility requirements, and (B) is not eligible for coverage for hospital services under the Medicare or under any Medicaid or health insurance program of any other nation, state, territory, or commonwealth, or under any other governmental or privately sponsored health or accident insurance or benefit program including, but not limited to, workers' compensation and awards, settlements, or judgments arising from claims, suits, or proceedings involving motor vehicle accidents or alleged negligence.

"Medically necessary service" means a service that is reasonably expected to prevent, diagnose, prevent the worsening of, alleviate, correct, or cure conditions that endanger life, cause suffering or pain, cause physical deformity or malfunction, threaten to cause or to aggravate a handicap, or result in illness or infirmity. "Medically necessary service" shall include inpatient and outpatient services as mandated under Title XIX of the Federal Social Security Act. "Medically necessary service" shall not include non-medical services, such as social, educational, and vocational services, or cosmetic surgery.

Section 10. Uninsured or medically needy patients. No hospital that has provided health care services to an uninsured patient or medically needy patient may collect from the uninsured or medically needy patient more than the cost of providing services.

Section 15. Debt collection activities prohibited. No hospital may initiate debt collection activities against a patient until a determination has been made as to whether the patient qualifies as an uninsured

or medically needy patient.

Section 20. Compliance. The Department of Public Health must develop appropriate reporting mechanisms to enforce the provisions of this Act.

Section 25. Penalties. A determination that a hospital has violated the provisions of this Act may result in the termination of licensure under the Hospital Licensing Act.

Section 90. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by changing Section 7 as follows:

(210 ILCS 85/7) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 148)

Sec. 7. (a) The Director after notice and opportunity for hearing to the applicant or licensee may deny, suspend, or revoke a permit to establish a hospital or deny, suspend, or revoke a license to open, conduct, operate, and maintain a hospital in any case in which he finds that there has been a substantial failure to comply with the provisions of this Act or the standards, rules, and regulations established by virtue thereof or the Discriminatory Pricing Act or the rules established by virtue thereof.

(b) Such notice shall be effected by registered mail or by personal service setting forth the particular reasons for the proposed action and fixing a date, not less than 15 days from the date of such mailing or service, at which time the applicant or licensee shall be given an opportunity for a hearing. Such hearing shall be conducted by the Director or by an employee of the Department designated in writing by the Director as Hearing Officer to conduct the hearing. On the basis of any such hearing, or upon default of the applicant or licensee, the Director shall make a determination specifying his findings and conclusions. In case of a denial to an applicant of a permit to establish a hospital, such determination shall specify the subsection of Section 6 under which the permit was denied and shall contain findings of fact forming the basis of such denial. A copy of such determination shall be sent by registered mail or a licensee shall become final 35 days after it is so mailed or served, unless the applicant or licensee, within such 35 day period, petitions for review pursuant to Section 13.

(c) The procedure governing hearings authorized by this Section shall be in accordance with rules promulgated by the Department and approved by the Hospital Licensing Board. A full and complete record shall be kept of all proceedings, including the notice of hearing, complaint, and all other documents in the nature of pleadings, written motions filed in the proceedings, and the report and orders of the Director and Hearing Officer. All testimony shall be reported but need not be transcribed unless the decision is appealed pursuant to Section 13. A copy or copies of the transcript may be obtained by any interested party on payment of the cost of preparing such copy or copies.

(d) The Director or Hearing Officer shall upon his own motion, or on the written request of any party to the proceeding, issue subpoenas requiring the attendance and the giving of testimony by witnesses, and subpoenas duces tecum requiring the production of books, papers, records, or memoranda. All subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum issued under the terms of this Act may be served by any person of full age. The fees of witnesses for attendance and travel shall be the same as the fees of witnesses before the Circuit Court of this State, such fees to be paid when the witness is excused from further attendance. When the witness is subpoenaed at the instance of the Director, or Hearing Officer, such fees shall be paid in the same manner as other expenses of the Department, and when the witness is subpoenaed at the instance of any other party to any such proceeding the Department may require that the cost of service of the subpoena or subpoena duces tecum and the fee of the witness be borne by the party at whose instance the witness is summoned. In such case, the Department in its discretion, may require a deposit to cover the cost of such service and witness fees. A subpoena or subpoena duces tecum issued out of a court.

(e) Any Circuit Court of this State upon the application of the Director, or upon the application of any other party to the proceeding, may, in its discretion, compel the attendance of witnesses, the production of books, papers, records, or memoranda and the giving of testimony before the Director or Hearing Officer conducting an investigation or holding a hearing authorized by this Act, by an attachment for contempt, or otherwise, in the same manner as production of evidence may be compelled before the court.

(f) The Director or Hearing Officer, or any party in an investigation or hearing before the Department, may cause the depositions of witnesses within the State to be taken in the manner prescribed by law for like depositions in civil actions in courts of this State, and to that end compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, papers, records, or memoranda. (Source: Laws 1967, p. 3969.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".

"Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing Section 12-55 as follows: (35 ILCS 200/12-55)

Sec. 12-55. Notice requirement if assessment is increased; counties of 3,000,000 or more.

(a) In counties with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants, a revision by the county assessor, except where such revision is made on complaint of the owner, shall not increase an assessment without notice to the person to whom the most recent tax bill was mailed and an opportunity to be heard before the assessment is verified. If the revision by the county assessor causes a change in all assessments in a particular major class of property in any township or assessment district within the county, the notice to the person to whom the most recent tax bill was mailed shall include a general statement indicating that all assessments in a particular major class in the township or assessment district have been changed because of an application of a factor and shall state the factor. When a notice is mailed by the county assessor to the address of a mortgagee, the mortgagee, within 7 business days after the mortgage receives the notice, shall forward a copy of the notice to each mortgagor of the property referred to in the notice at the last known address of each mortgage to forward the notice to each mortgagor. The assessor may

provide for the filing of complaints and make revisions at times other than those dates published under Section 14-35. When the county assessor has completed the revision and correction and entered the changes and revision in the assessment books, an affidavit shall be attached to the assessment books in the form required by law, signed by the county assessor.

(b) In counties with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants, for parcels, other than parcels in the class that includes the majority of the single-family residential parcels under a county ordinance adopted in accordance with Section 4 of Article IX of the Illinois Constitution, located in the assessment district for which the current assessment year is a general assessment year, within 30 days after sending the required notices under this Section, the county assessor shall file with the board of appeals (until the first Monday in December 1998, and the board of review beginning the first Monday in December 1998 and thereafter) a list of the parcels for which the notices under this Section were sent, showing the following information for each such parcel: the parcel index number, the township in which the parcel is located, the class for the current year, the previous year's final total assessed value, the total assessed value proposed by the county assessor, and the name of the person to whom the notice required under this Section was sent. The list shall be available for public inspection at the office of the board during the regular office hours of the board. The list shall be retained by the board for at least 10 years after the date it is initially filed by the county assessor.

(c) The provisions of subsection (b) of this Section shall be applicable beginning with the assessment for the 1997 tax year. (Source: P.A. 90-4, eff. 3-7-97; 91-751, eff. 6-2-00.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".
