SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 19

WHEREAS, The State's objective is to establish an efficient system of high quality public educational institutions and services at the elementary and secondary school levels; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there is created the School Code Review Committee consisting of one member of the House appointed by the Speaker of the House, one member of the House appointed by the Minority Leader of the House, one member of the Senate appointed by the President of the

Senate, one member of the Senate appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, and a chairperson appointed by the Governor, all of whom shall be appointed within 30 days after adoption of this resolution and shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses from funds available for that purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee may meet at the call of the chairperson or by a vote of the majority of the members at any time after the appointment of a majority of the members, shall receive the assistance of the State Board of Education, including the provision of staff, shall undertake a comprehensive and thorough review of every Article of the School Code and related laws, rules, and regulations impacting Illinois K-12 schools with the intent of eliminating unnecessary and burdensome mandates on school districts, increasing accountability and efficiency in schools, returning control of school districts to locally-elected school officials, teachers, administrators, and parents, and improving the educational performance of students, and shall issue a report detailing specific recommended changes to the School Code to the General Assembly and the Governor on or before April 1, 2001; and that upon issuing its report the committee is dissolved.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 49

WHEREAS, Industrial hemp is a valuable product in the commercial marketplace, creating jobs and opening up new markets and fields for employment and revenue; and

WHEREAS, Several states have begun the process of enacting legislation that would legalize industrial hemp production and sales in those states; and

WHEREAS, Hawaii, Vermont, Colorado, Minnesota, North Dakota, New Mexico, Virginia, Montana, and Missouri have all introduced legislation regarding industrial hemp in their 1999 legislatures; and

WHEREAS, An investigation into the merits and values of industrial hemp is needed to consider whether the State of Illinois should consider passing legislation to implement the production of industrial hemp; and

WHEREAS, An investigative task force would be able to take the time and facilitate the necessary research to examine the hemp issue; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created the Industrial Hemp Investigative and Advisory Task Force consisting of the Director of Agriculture or his or her designee, who shall be chairperson, and 12 additional members, 6 each, selected by the President of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the Senate, representing expertise in the fields of plant science, food processing science, law enforcement, herbology, manufacturing, and the Illinois Specialty Growers Association; members of the Task Force shall serve without

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compensation but shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses from funds appropriated for that purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED, The Task Force shall study the economic viability of industrial hemp production in this State, shall identify any legal or other obstacles to industrial hemp production, shall make any recommendations it deems appropriate, and shall report its findings and recommendations to the Illinois Senate by January 1, 2000; and upon reporting to the Senate, the Task Force shall be dissolved; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall meet initially at the call of the chairperson, shall hold public hearings, and shall receive the assistance of legislative staff; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the University of Illinois College of ACES (Agricultural, Consumer, and Environmental Sciences) is requested to work with the Task Force and cooperate in undertaking the study; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, the President of the University of Illinois, and the Illinois Director of Agriculture.

Senator Rauschenberger offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Rules:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 50

WHEREAS, The Department of Labor Advisory Board has been created by Section 6.02 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.02 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois provides that the Advisory Board shall be composed of 13 members, including 5 representatives of employees, 5 representatives of employers, and 3 public members; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Labor Advisory Board currently has no appointed members; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Governor to appoint members to fill all vacancies on the Department of Labor Advisory Board; and be it further
