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## **Applications to be Transmitted to the General Assembly**

### Content of Evaluation Plans

Hononegah CHSD 207 - Winnebago / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1353 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 24A-5) allows the district to modify the following: under subsection (a), use of teacher portfolios and "critical friends group" instead of the required personal observation of the teacher by an administrator; subsection (b), all areas (attendance, planning, instructional methods, classroom management, and competency in the subject matter) may not be considered/developed during each evaluation cycle; subsection (c), change the rating scale from "excellent, satisfactory and unsatisfactory" to "satisfactory and unsatisfactory" for the teacher evaluation program; and subsection (d), procedures may change if peer evaluation is used for teacher evaluations.

### Debt Limitations

Round Lake Area SD 116 - Lake / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1428 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 19-1) request to allow the district to increase its debt limit from 13.8 percent to up to 17.5 percent of the equalized assessed valuation in order to issue bonds to fund current and projected construction costs.

### Driver Education

Lake Park CHSD 108 - DuPage / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1338 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-23) request to allow the district to charge a reasonable fee not to exceed \$200 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Rich THSD 227 - Cook / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1344 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-23) request to allow the district to charge a reasonable fee not to exceed \$75 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Round Lake Area SD 116 - Lake / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1427 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-23) request to allow the district to charge a reasonable fee not to exceed \$100 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Lockport THSD 205 - Will / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1442 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-23) request to allow the district to charge a reasonable fee not to exceed \$75 of students who participate in driver education courses.

### Educational Service Centers

City of Chicago SD 299 - Cook / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1445 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 2-3.62) request to allow the district to assume responsibility for administering the programs under the purview of the Chicago Educational Service Center by transferring governance of that center to the district's board of

education.

General State Aid and Average Daily Attendance Calculations

Granite City CUSD 9 - Madison / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1422 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(1)) request to

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allow the district to count an individual student for a full day of attendance for the purpose of calculating state aid when the student is in school for five or more clock hours, provided that students regularly enrolled in a public school for a full day (i.e., 300 minutes or more) may be counted on the basis of 1/6 day for every class period of 50 minutes pursuant to such enrollment. Students who exceed 300 minutes of instruction (i.e., attend 7 class periods of 50 minutes) would be counted for a full day of instruction.

Granite City CUSD 9 - Madison / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1423 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(1)) request to allow the district to count an individual student for a full day of attendance for the purpose of calculating state aid when the student is excluded for lack of obtaining a physical examination required under Section 27-8.1 of the School Code or for the infestation of head lice.

Regional Office of Education - Carroll/Jo Daviess/Stephenson / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1440 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(1)) request to allow the regional office to count as a full day of pupil attendance sessions of three and one-half clock hours for the purpose of calculating state aid for students enrolled in schools established under Article 13A.

Length of the School Term

Granite City CUSD 9 - Madison / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1421 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-19) request to allow the district to adopt a school calendar that is shorter than the required 185 days specified in Section 10-19 of the School Code. This would be accomplished by eliminating emergency days and lengthening the remaining school days proportionate to the number of emergency days the district used during the school year, regardless of whether all five emergency days have been taken.

Limitation of Administrative Costs

Elgin SD U-46 - Kane / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM199-1301 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district has experienced a steady growth in enrollment, averaging more than 1,000 pupils a year over the last six years. Because of this, the district has had to hire three additional full-time employees and one on a part-time basis.

Pleasant Valley SD 62 - Peoria / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM199-1303 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs. The renewal would allow the district to continue implementation of a policy enacted in 1993 that provides for raises of 10 percent each year for up to three years preceding the retirement of a full-time staff member who has been employed by the district a minimum of 25 consecutive years. This will affect the salary of the district superintendent for the next year. The district maintains that since this is a contractual issue, it creates circumstances beyond the control of the district and prevents it from staying within the 5 percent limitation. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2000-01 school year.

Park Forest-Chicago Heights SD 163 - Cook / **Expiration: 1999-00**

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**school year WM199-1316 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to an increase in administrative salaries, which the district maintains were below statewide averages. In addition, the district filled the business manager position, which had been vacant.

Paris Crestwood CUSD 4 - Edgar / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM199-1318 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district superintendent unexpectedly resigned before the end of the 1998-99 school year, and the district was unable to fill the position; therefore the district spent less for administrative expenses than was budgeted for that school year.

Leland CUSD 1 - LaSalle / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM199-1324 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district will be replacing some equipment in the superintendent's office. In addition, supplies that are purchased in bulk and charged to the superintendent's account are also used in the high school.

Midwest Central CUSD 191 - Mason / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1332 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. During the 1998-99 school year, the superintendent resigned his position and an interim superintendent was hired for three months on a per diem basis. A permanent superintendent was hired in January 1999, but the overall expenses for the position remained less than what was budgeted.

Winnetka SD 36 - Cook / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1333 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstance beyond its

control. This request is being made to cover the costs associated with the hiring of additional support staff, an increase of 7 to 10 percent in health insurance costs, and upgrades to equipment necessary to address Y2K compliance.

Tower Hill CUSD 6 - Shelby / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1334 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The 1998-99 salary for the permanent superintendent hired for the newly reorganized school district was for only an 11-month period, and the board approved an increase in that salary that exceeded the 5 percent limit in order to stay competitive with neighboring districts.

Herscher CUSD 2 - Kankakee / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1347 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district expanded programs aimed at improving instructional practices, resulting in increases for benefits and purchased services that exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Crete-Monee SD 201-U - Will / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1356 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond

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its control. During the FY99 school year, the district eliminated a \$3 million deficit, making severe cuts in programming and the number of employees (55 were laid off). Since that time the district has passed an education fund referendum, allowing it to reinstate the programs and services for FY00 that had been cut the previous year.

Greenfield CUSD 10 - Greene / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1365 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district employed an interim superintendent on a per diem basis during the 1998-99 school year, resulting in lower expenditures for salary and benefits than those being paid for the permanent superintendent in the 1999-00 school year.

Huntley CSD 158 - McHenry / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1383 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district has experienced a steady growth in enrollment (132.8 percent over the last four years) that has necessitated construction of two new facilities (to open in August 2000) and the hiring of 80 new employees for the 2000-01 school year. If approved, the waiver would take effect in the 2000-01 school year.

Dongola USD 66 - Union / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1403 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In 1998-99, the district hired two interim superintendents,

both of whom were retired superintendents. During this time, the district was not required to contribute to the teachers' retirement fund or pay life and health insurance benefits; therefore administrative expenses were significantly lower than what would have been needed for a permanent superintendent.

Argo-Summit Bedford Park 104 - Cook / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1407 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to the employment of a full-time secretary and an overall increase of 40 percent in health care costs.

Richmond-Burton CHSD 157 - McHenry/Lake / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1414 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. Prior to the 2000-01 school year, the salary for the superintendent was shared with Spring Grove SD 11.

Chester-East Lincoln SD 61 - Logan / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1417 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. During the 1998-99 school year, the superintendent resigned and the district hired an interim superintendent on a per diem basis from December through the end of the 1998-99 school year. Because of this, the administrative expenditures were significantly lower in the 1998-99 school year than they would have been had there been a permanent superintendent.

Ramsey CUSD 204 - Fayette / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1418 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In order for the district to attract a qualified superintendent, the annual salary was increased by \$7,000. The

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district also determined that an executive secretary was required for 12 months instead of 10 and increased that annual salary by \$3,000.

East Moline SD 37 - Rock Island / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1431 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district has experienced an increase in the cost of health insurance for employees and supplies and materials (instructional and non-instructional). In addition, it needed to replace outdated and broken equipment and meet other technical needs for both district operations and instructional programming.

Miller Township CCSD 210 - LaSalle / **Expiration: 1999-00 school year WM100-1453 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. During FY 99 the district will be replacing some equipment in the superintendent's office. In addition, the bookkeeper's position was expanded from part-time to a full-time.

Non-Resident Tuition

Hollis CCSD 328 - Peoria / **Expiration: 2005-06 school year WM199-1321 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-20.12a) request to allow the district to charge non-resident pupil tuition in an amount that is less than 110% of the preceding year's per capita tuition cost. If approved, this waiver becomes effective in the 2001-02 school year.

Parent-Teacher Conferences

Mahomet-Seymour CUSD 3 - Champaign / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM199-1296-3 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district to schedule a parent-teacher conference in the evening following a day when students are in attendance for at least five clock hours, and to count those evening conferences as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required under Section 10-19 of the School Code. The day following the scheduled evening conference would be a non-attendance day for students and staff.

Herrin CUSD 4 - Williamson / **Expiration: 2002-03 school year WM100-1342 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district to schedule parent-teacher conferences in the evening following a full day of student attendance twice in a five-day period, and to count those evening conferences as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required under Section 10-19 of the School Code. One day during that week would be a non-attendance day for students and staff.

Hononegah CHSD 207 - Winnebago / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1355 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district to schedule four, three-and-one-half-hour evening parent-teacher conferences in lieu of two full days for parent-teacher conferences. Each evening conference would be scheduled after a full day of pupil attendance, and two evening conferences would be counted as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required under Section 10-19 of the School Code.

Warren CUSD 205 - JoDaviess / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1359 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1))

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request to allow the district to schedule a three-hour student attendance day followed by a two-hour parent-teacher conference four times a year in lieu of two full days for parent-teacher conferences. It is the intent of the district to count the first day of parent-teacher conferences as a student attendance day to be included in the average daily attendance calculation. The second day will be counted as a parent-teacher conference day and as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required under Section 10-19 of the School Code.

Monticello CUSD 25 - Piatt / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM200-1438 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district to schedule parent-teacher conferences in the evening following a full day of student attendance twice in a five-day period, and to count those evening conferences as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required under Section 10-19 of the School Code. One day during that week would be a non-attendance day for students and staff.

#### Physical Education

Sullivan CUSD 300 - Moultrie / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM199-1290 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to exempt students in grades 9 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement, if they participate in interscholastic activities, marching band or show choir, so that they can take additional academic classes or repeat coursework needed for graduation.

Brimfield CUSD 309 - Peoria / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM199-1299 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 7 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement if they participate in extracurricular physical activities that meet their physical education needs or if they enroll in additional academic coursework.

Morrison CUSD 6 - Whiteside / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM199-1306 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 5 twice a week due to space limitations. In addition, the district would provide 30 minutes of supervised activity time each day.

Warren THSD 121 - Lake / **Expiration: 2003-04 school code WM199-1310 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to offer physical education courses for credit to students in grades 11 and 12 during summer school due to increased enrollment and safety concerns regarding class size during the regular school year. In addition, the district requests to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 who participate in cheerleading and pompons from the daily physical education requirement so that they can enroll in additional academic coursework.

Rock Falls THSD 301 - Whiteside-Lee / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM199-1325 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to exempt students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement if they participate in marching band (not for credit), cheerleading or pompons.

Pontiac THSD 90 - Livingston / **Expiration: 2004-05 school district WM300-1339 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request

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to allow the district to exempt students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement if they participate in cheerleading.

Waukegan SD 60 - Lake / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1343 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 5 two days per week in order to attend extended periods of math three days a week.

Beach Park CCSD 3 - Lake / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1346-1 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 1 through 8 three days per week due to inadequate facilities. Students will participate in longer periods of health, social development, study skills and/or academic discipline.

Rochester CUSD 3A - Sangamon / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1348-2 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 6 three days per week due to inadequate facilities.

Crete-Monee SD 201-U - Will / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1358 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to enroll fewer students in grades 9 through 12 in daily physical education activities and exempt students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement due to inadequate facilities. Students not enrolled in physical education classes will be allowed to enroll in other coursework. Students who elect not to participate in physical education activities during the regular school year will be allowed, if they choose, to take physical education courses in summer school.

Palatine CCSD 15 - Cook / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1362 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 1 through 5 two days per week for 30-minute periods and for students in grade 6 three days per week for 30-minute periods due to inadequate facilities.

Thornton Fractional THSD 215 - Cook / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM100-1364 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to enroll students in grades 9 through 12 in physical education classes during the summer months due to inadequate facilities.

Antioch CCSD 34 - Lake / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1367 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to exempt students in grades 6 through 8 from the daily physical education requirement for one semester of the school year in order to participate in foreign language classes, band or choir.

Chaney-Monge SD 88 - Will / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1375 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 8 on alternate days for

periods of 42 minutes each. Students will participate in health or sex education classes when they are not participating in physical education.

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Roselle SD 12 - DuPage / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1387 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 5 through 8 on alternate days due to inadequate facilities. This also will allow students to participate in a technology class.

Gillespie CUSD 7 - Macoupin / **Expiration: 2001-02 school year WM300-1388 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 4 one day per week for a 45-minute period and to provide structured supervised play time during daily recess due to inadequate facilities.

Lyons ESD 103 - Cook / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1399 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities on alternate days to students in grades 6 through 8 due to inadequate facilities and student safety concerns.

Dolton SD 148 - Cook / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1405 (renewal) - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 7 and 8 three days a week due to scheduling problems and inadequate facilities.

Woodland SD 50 - Lake / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1408 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in kindergarten one day per week for 20 minutes and students in grades 1 and 2 three days per week for 30 minutes due to inadequate facilities.

Woodland SD 50 - Lake / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1409 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in kindergarten one day per week for 20 minutes and students in grade 1 three days per week for 30 minutes due to inadequate facilities.

Woodland SD 50 - Lake / **Expiration: 2000-01 school year WM100-1410 - Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 2 and 3 three out of seven school days for 40 minutes due to inadequate facilities.

Lockport THSD 205 - Will / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1441 - Modification of School Code** (Section 24-2) allows the district to recognize the contributions of Abraham Lincoln through instructional activities rather than observing a school holiday in his honor.

Itasca SD 10 - DuPage / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1443 - Modification of School Code** (Section 24-2) allows the district to recognize the contributions of Abraham Lincoln through instructional activities rather than observing a school holiday in his honor.

Will County SD 92 - Will / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1444 - Modification of School Code** (Section 24-2) allows the district to recognize the contributions of Abraham Lincoln through instructional activities rather than observing a school holiday in his honor.

Oak Lawn-Hometown SD 123 - Cook / **Expiration: 2003-04 school year WM100-1385 (renewal) - Modification of School Code** (Section 27-6) allows the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades kindergarten through 6 on alternate days for extended periods of 30 minutes due to inadequate facilities.

Morris HSD 101 - Grundy / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1395 (renewal) - Modification of School Code** (Section 27-6) allows the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 9 through 12 for two, 9-week terms for extended periods of 89 minutes due to a 4-block schedule.

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Oswego CUSD 308 - Kendall / **Expiration: 2004-05 school year WM300-1396 - Modification of School Code** (Section 27-6) allows the district to provide physical education activities to students in grades 9 through 12 for two, 9-week terms for extended periods of 90 minutes due to a 4-block schedule.

"Client" means an individual or entity which has contracted with an employee leasing company to supply it with or assume responsibility for personnel management of one or more workers to perform services on an on-going basis rather than under a temporary help arrangement, as defined in Section 15 of the Employee Leasing Company Act.

2. "Employee leasing company" means an individual or entity which contracts with a client to supply or assume responsibility for personnel management of one or more workers to perform services for the client on an on-going basis rather than under a temporary help arrangement, as defined in Section 15 of the Employee Leasing Company Act.

B. Subject to subsection C, services performed by an individual under a contract between an employee leasing company and client, including but not limited to services performed in the capacity of a corporate officer of the client, are services in "employment" of the employee leasing company and are not services in "employment" of the client if all of the following conditions are met:

1. The employee leasing company pays the individual for the services directly from its own accounts; and

2. The employee leasing company, exclusively or in conjunction with the client, retains the right to direct and control the individual in the performance of the services; and

3. The employee leasing company, exclusively or in conjunction with the client, retains the right to hire and terminate the individual; and

4. The employee leasing company reports each client in the manner the Director prescribes by regulation.

C. Notwithstanding subsection B, services performed by an individual under a contract between an employee leasing company and client, including but not limited to services performed in the capacity of a corporate officer of the client, are services in "employment" of the client and are not services in "employment" of the employee leasing company if:

1. The contribution rate, or, where applicable, the amended contribution rate, of the client is greater than the sum of the fund building rate established for the year pursuant to Section

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1506.3 of this Act plus the greater of 2.7% or 2.7% times the adjusted state experience factor for the year; and

2. The contribution rate, or, where applicable, the amended contribution rate, of the employee leasing company is less than the contribution rate, or, where applicable, the amended contribution rate of the client by more than 1.5% absolute.

D. Except as provided in this Section and notwithstanding any other provision of this Act to the contrary, services performed by an individual under a contract between an employee leasing company and

client, including but not limited to services performed in the capacity of a corporate officer of the client, are services in "employment" of the client and are not services in "employment" of the employee leasing company.

E. Nothing in this Section shall be construed or used to effect the existence of an employment relationship other than for purposes of this Act.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."
