November 13, 1973

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

2. The Senate will now come to order on the Regular  
3. Session. Reading of the Journal. Senator Soper.

4. SENATOR SOPER:

5. ...Mr. President, I move that we...I move that we  
6. postpone the reading of the Journals of November 6th,  
7. November 7th, November 8th and the approval of these  
8. Journals pending the arrival of the printed Journal.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

10. You have heard the motion of Senator Soper. All  
11. in favor will signify by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes  
12. have it and the motion carries. There are motions...  
13. filed on concurrence in House action. I see that Senator  
14. Wooten is not on the Floor and Senator Johns is on the  
15. Floor. Do you want to call yours or do you want...  
16. The Senate will be at ease temporarily. Sergeant at Arms  
17. will continue to try to attract our members. For the  
18. benefit of the Senators that may be in the New Office  
19. Building we are soon going to be on the order of business  
20. that will require a roll call. Senator Walker. Ring  
21. the bell again will you Sergeant at Arms? Sweeney.  
22. Senator Hall will you let Sweeney ring the bell? We will  
23. ...been a request for leave of the Body that we will  
24. proceed on the order of Resolutions while Sweeney rings  
25. the bell. And could we have some order? We might.

26. SECRETARY:

27. ...Senate Resolution 289 by Senator Vadalabene and  
28. it's congratulatory.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

30. Do you have a motion Senator?

31. SENATOR VADALABENE:

32. Yes. This is a congratulatory resolution. I would  
33. like to make a proper motion at this time to suspend the

1. rules.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

3. You have heard the motion of the Senator from  
4. Edwardsville that we suspend the rules for immediate  
5. consideration. All in favor signify by saying aye.  
6. Opposed. We seem not to have unanimous consent. Leave  
7. is granted. Senator Vadalabene now moves that the  
8. Senate do adopt Senate Resolution 289. All in favor  
9. of the Motion of Senator Vadalabene signify by saying  
10. aye. Opposed. The ayes have it. The resolution is  
11. adopted. Senator Wooten. You want to move on HB 1533?  
12. Order of Concurrences and House Action on Amendatory  
13. vetoes. Order please.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Motion. (Secretary reads Motion of HB 1533)

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

17. Senator Wooten.

18. SENATOR WOOTEN:

19. Mr. President and colleagues, we inadvertently in  
20. applying the Home Rule Amendment eliminated Cook County  
21. from the provision of obtaining urine as well as blood  
22. specimens in certain cases of accidental death. This is  
23. something that Cook County greatly desires to be included into.  
24. I have a letter here from the Coroner of Cook County urging  
25. that we adopt the Governor's recommended changes. I know  
26. of no opposition on either side of the aisle and if there  
27. are no questions I would move for a favorable roll call.

28. PPRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. Discussion? Senator Dougherty.

30. SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

31. Mr. President, I am going to vote for this bill for  
32. this amendatory veto, however, I will like to have permission  
33. of this Body to file a dissent.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

2. Senator Dougherty has requested permission to file  
3. dissent. I think you could do that without permission  
4. Senator. All in favor of Senator Dougherty being allowed  
5. to file dissent with regard to HB 1533 will signify by  
6. saying aye. Opposed. Senator Sours.

7. SENATOR SOURS:

8. Could we get a specific discussion on this bill  
9. Senator Wooten so we'll know what we're...what the problem  
10. was with the Governor's Office?

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

12. Discussion is in order Senator? Senator Wooten.

13. SENATOR WOOTEN:

14. Yes. When we applied the Home Rule Amendment...

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

16. Just a minute. We can get a little order it'd be  
17. helpful. Just a moment Senator.

18. SENATOR WOOTEN:

19. When we applied the Home Rule Amendment in toto it  
20. really meant that the...that Cook County would not be sub-  
21. mitting urine as well as blood samples in cases of accidental  
22. death to the Department of Public Health. This really would  
23. defeat the whole purpose of the bill because it is a State-  
24. wide program in which we're beginning to compile important  
25. data relating to for example the incidence of...accidents  
26. in which drugs are involved and so on. It is a very important  
27. program and as I say the...the Coroner of Cook County has  
28. sent a letter which I think has been generally been circulated  
29. asking that we adopt the Governor's language which exempt  
30. that specific provision from the Home Rule Amendment...I...  
31. this bill also carries a...an amendment which provides for  
32. the replacement of a coroner - this was at President Harris'  
33. request - it carried several things with it but by just

1. changing the Home Rule provisions so that it only applies  
2. to section 1 then we are able to get Cook County included  
3. in this broad program of blood and urine samplings in the  
4. case of accidental deaths. And really if we leave them  
5. out the program loses much of its impact. It's been a  
6. very successful program by the way.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

8. Senator Sours.

9. SENATOR SOURS:

10. Does Cook County want to be in the purview of the law  
11. now?

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

13. Senator Wooten.

14. SENATOR WOOTEN:

15. As I say I have a letter from the Coroner of Cook  
16. County requesting that we accept the Governor's language  
17. and I do not believe there's any opposition on this side.  
18. I...I would assume that Senator Dougherty's opposition  
19. is on general principles of the Home Rule...well let's  
20. say the Home Rule principle. But in practical terms I  
21. believe we simply must have this all over the State.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. Have you completed your interrogation Senator Sours?

24. SENATOR SOURS:

25. Other than finding out from Senator Dougherty the  
26. purpose of his dissent what...what arouses my curiosity  
27. here we have a Cook County Legislator being the primary  
28. sponsor of this bill and it excludes Home...Home units  
29. ...Home Rule units now they're putting them back in. So  
30. I wonder why - the eternal question why?

31. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

32. Senator Dougherty can you explain why.

33. SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

1. eternal answer, partial preemption of Home Rule. That's  
2. why I'm filing a dissent although I'm going to vote for  
3. the bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

5. The Chair would like to inquire Senator Dougherty  
6. of your request is it your intention that you will file  
7. a written dissent and file it with the Secretary? Any  
8. further discussion? Senator Rock.

9. SENATOR ROCK:

10. For...for the sake of consistency if nothing else  
11. Mr. President, I would ask a parliamentary inquiry and a  
12. ruling from the Chair. This bill did pass in fact ex-  
13. cluding Home Rule Units. Apparently now the Governor  
14. amendatorily has put Home Rule Units back in. It seems  
15. to me in order to preempt a Home Rule Unit it takes  
16. three-fifth's vote. May I have a ruling from the Chair?

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

18. I just checked with Senator Weaver and the ruling  
19. is it takes 30 votes.

20. SENATOR WOOTEN:

21. ...I would say that I...I understand Senator Dougherty's  
22. reservation on this, the Home Rule principle, but I believe  
23. there is general consent to this. It's a practical matter  
24. that simply must be settled and this bill is the only  
25. instrument at hand to keep this particular very important  
26. law enforcement program going and I would if there are no further  
27. questions I would ask for a favorable roll call.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. If there is no further question...questions the main  
30. question shall be put. And that question is shall the  
31. Senate accept the specific recommendations of the Governor  
32. as to HB 1533 in the manner and form just read and explained  
33. by Senator Wooten. Upon that question the Secretary will

1. call the roll.

2. SECRETARY:

13. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

14. Howard Mohr, aye. Mitchler, aye. Roe, aye.  
15. Saperstein, aye. Hynes, aye...Hynes, aye. ...Question  
16. the yeas were 35. The nays were none. The specific  
17. recommendations of the Governor as to HB 1533 having  
18. received the required 30 vote majority is therefore de-  
19. clared accepted. Senator Johns.

20. SENATOR JOHNS:

21. Mr. President, members of the Senate, I have filed  
22. a motion that we concur in the amendatory veto by the  
23. Governor of HB 1943. It is a bill designed to make a  
24. loan to the Shawneetown Regional Port Authority. The  
25. original bill was in the amount of \$2,000,000. The loan  
26. and the Governor cut that in one-half and with further  
27. stipulations which I'd be glad to discuss with you but  
28. I would appreciate a favorable roll call on concurring  
29. in the Governor's Amendatory Veto. I might tell you that  
30. in the House on this particular bill to concur with the  
31. Governor's veto the yeas were 124, the nays were zero.  
32. It is a bi-partisan bill. Representative Choate and  
33. C. L. McCormick sponsored this bill in the House. I'm  
pleased to sponsor it in the Senate. Thank you very much.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

2. Questions? Any discussion? Senator Mitchler.

3. SENATOR MITCHLER:

4. Mr. President, members of the Senate, I'd like to  
5. ask Senator Johns just what does the Governor's Amendatory  
6. Veto do? I don't have the Amendatory Veto if you could  
7. explain the Governor's Amendatory Veto?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

9. Senator Johns, he would like to have you explain that  
10. again.

11. SENATOR JOHNS:

12. Senator Mitchler, I think your question is in order.  
13. Let me read it if I might to you.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. If we could have some order it would be helpful.  
16. Just a moment, Senator. As soon as we get the attention  
17. of the Senate we will continue.

18. SENATOR JOHNS:

19. Basically Senator Mitchler the loan was in the amount  
20. of \$2,000,000 but here's...here's the way the veto reads.  
21. I'll take a minute, Mr. President.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. May the...will the Senate please be in order?

24. Senator Johns.

25. SENATOR JOHNS:

26. The Governor said in his veto message of September the  
27. 8th 1973: Some of the conditions of the loan in their pre-  
28. sent form would prevent the Shawneetown Regional Port Dis-  
29. trict from marketing revenue bonds and from having sufficient  
30. revenue and resources to undertake and complete the projects.  
31. Therefore I specifically recommend that page 2 line 13 after  
32. the word year the following phrase be inserted. Or the amount  
33. required per year to amortize revenue bonds issued by the

1. Shawneetown Regional Port District, whichever is greater.  
2. Then he goes on to say: Also the amount of the loan authorized  
3. is more than can be utilized by the Shawneetown Regional  
4. Port Authority. Am I getting through to you Senator Mitchler?  
5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

6. Just a moment Senator I'm not sure he can hear be-  
7. cause I can't.

8. SENATOR JOHNS:

9. All right, sir, I'll be glad to wait.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

11. Gentlemen, the Senator is entitled to your attention.  
12. Please gentlemen. Continue Senator Johns.

13. SENATOR JOHNS:

14. Thank you Mr. President. As I've said before this...  
15. this money is a loan to be repaid from revenues derived from the  
16. operation of the port. The Governor's reduced the amount  
17. allocated or desired in one-half. He has reduced it from  
18. \$2,000,000 to \$1,000,000. And this amount...the original  
19. amount was more than could be utilized by the Shawneetown  
20. Regional Port District in the fiscal year. Therefore he  
21. reduced it from \$2,000,000 to \$1,000,000 and I would  
22. appreciate a favorable roll call.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

24. Any further discussion? Senator Don Moore. Do  
25. you have a question?

26. SENATOR DON MOORE:

27. No questions Mr. President.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. If there's no further discussion the question before  
30. the Senate is shall the Senate accept the specific recommendations  
31. of the Governor as to HB 1943 in the manner and form just read  
32. and discussed by Senator Johns. Upon that question the  
33. Secretary will call the roll. Senator Soper.

1. SENATOR SOPER:

2. I...would the Senator answer a few question on this?  
3. ...Is this...part of the Governor...Governor have this in  
4. his budget? Or is it necessary for him to have it in  
5. his budget?

6. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

7. Senator Johns. I thought the discussion was closed  
8. but can you answer that?

9. SENATOR JOHNS:

10. The discussion was closed but Senator Soper's asking  
11. a question that I feel is pertinent. It was in the Department  
12. of Business budget and it is a loan from...through that  
13. Department sir to be repaid back to the State.

14. SENATOR SOPER:

15. Now you say that the Governor did have this in his  
16. budget for \$2,000,000?

17. SENATOR JOHNS:

18. No. The budget...he didn't have but \$1,000,000 that we  
19. could actually utilize in this fiscal year from the Department  
20. of Business and Economic Development.

21. SENATOR SOPER:

22. Well, in his original budget did he have this million  
23. dollars set up for this purpose, for this loan?

24. SENATOR JOHNS:

25. It's my understanding that this bill was prepared with  
26. this in mind and thereby the actual \$2,000,000 was in mind  
27. but we could not utilize this so it will save the State  
28. the dispensing of \$1,000,000 in a loan for that fiscal year.

29. SENATOR SOPER:

30. ...Is this a line item in his budget or...or...

31. SENATOR JOHNS:

32. It is not in...in the specific budget of the Governor  
33. it is in the specific budget of the Department of Business...

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
2. Please gentlemen.  
3. SENATOR JOHNS:  
4. It is in the budget of Department of Business sir.  
5. SENATOR SOPER:  
6. Yeah but it's not in the Governor's specific budget?  
7. SENATOR JOHNS:  
8. Well, I would hope that the Department's budget was  
9. in the Governor's budget.  
10. SENATOR SOPER:  
11. All right.  
12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
13. It's confirmed maybe. Now, is the discussion closed? I  
14. don't want to violate the rules again. Any further dis-  
15. cussion? We will renew the main question which was just  
16. put by the Chair and the Secretary will call the roll.  
17. SECRETARY:  
18. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
29. Absentees. Senator Johns. Netsch, aye.  
30. SENATOR JOHNS:  
31. Mr. President, I'd like to move to postpone consideration  
32. please.  
33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

1. Senator Johns moves to...Senator Savickas, aye.  
2. We've postponed consideration it really doesn't matter.  
3. Today is the final...if the Senate could be in order...  
4. I think Senator Johns would be interested in knowing  
5. that this the final day to consider this motion. He  
6. knows that. ...It will be put on the order of consideration  
7. postponed. I...I can't hear you Senator Walker.  
8. Senator Walker.  
9. SENATOR WALKER:

10. I was just going to...to tell Senator Johns that I  
11. thought perhaps he'd caught himself in the same position  
12. I've caught myself in on a few occasions playing with a  
13. short deck.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. I think he realizes that. Any further business  
16. to be brought before the Regular Session at this time? Senator  
17. Rock.

18. SENATOR ROCK:

19. The matter that was just put on consideration post-  
20. poned is it the intention of the Chair that we will in fact  
21. get another shot at it today?

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. That would depend upon the motion of whether or not  
24. this Senate do adjourn.

25. SENATOR ROCK:

26. Okay.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

28. If the Senate adjourns until tomorrow of course we  
29. will not. Any further business? Senator Weaver.

30. SENATOR WEAVER:

31. Mr. President, I don't want to preclude Senator Johns  
32. but I was prepared to make a motion that we adjourn until  
33. 10:15 in the morning.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

2. Senator Rock.

3. SENATOR ROCK:

4. Well, let me suggest to Senator Weaver and the  
5. Chair that I think that we have four other specials that  
6. we can go into. Might we just recess and come back to  
7. that order of business when we have some bodies on the  
8. Floor?

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

10. It has been suggested that the Second Special  
11. Session do stand in recess...Regular Session, I'm sorry  
12. ...that the Regular Session do stand in recess until...  
13. until the call of the Chair and that motion was made now  
14. by Senator Weaver. All in favor will signify by saying  
15. aye. Opposed? The ayes have it and the Regular Session  
16. will stand in recess until the call of the Chair.

17. AFTER THE RECESS

18. PRESIDENT:

19. The Regular Session will reconvene on the order  
20. of consideration postponed. Senator Johns has HB 1943.

21. SENATOR JOHNS:

22. Mr. Chairman. I mean Mr. President, members of  
23. the Assembly, I made an error this morning, an honest  
24. error. I thought that this million dollars that I was  
25. seeking was in the budget. It was not set in the budget  
26. but the million dollars that I seek in this loan form for  
27. ...from the Department of Business and Economic Development  
28. to the Shawneetown Regional Port Authority is an appropriation  
29. for the purpose of making a loan to that Board for the  
30. development of facilities necessary to provide public coal  
31. loading devices and services. Now we have a tremendous amount  
32. of coal in southern Illinois, we do not have a fort as we  
33. need on that particular river from Pittsburg to Paducah...

1.       Pittsburg to Paducah, Kentucky. This million dollars as  
2.       I told you will be repaid. Representative Choate and  
3.       Representative C. L. McCormick sponsored this bill in the  
4.       House and the move to concur with the Governor's Amend-  
5.       atory Veto had 124 yeas, no nays, one present. As I told  
6.       you it is a loan gentlemen. We've sat here many times  
7.       and appropriated money for many things but I don't want it  
8.       as a gift we would like to repay it. I would appreciate  
9.       a favorable roll call. You have the explanation of the  
10.      Governor's Veto on your desks I do believe.

11.      PRESIDENT:

12.             Senator Dougherty.

13.      SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

14.             The fact that the Governor refers to it as Amendatory  
15.      Veto is this. I discussed this with the Governor some time  
16.      ago because I have a similar situation in Chicago Regional  
17.      Port District where the amount requested was five million  
18.      and we reduced it to three and a half million and it's  
19.      probably the same subject matter. These facilities are  
20.      already existing in Shawneetown but they are privately  
21.      owned. This will permit the Department to...the Port  
22.      Districts will require these and add thereto and as a con-  
23.      dition of the loan provide agreements that have been executed  
24.      whereby the Shawneetown Regional Port District repays the  
25.      loan made by the State in amounts equal to one-half of all  
26.      revenues received in the operation in excess of \$500,000 a  
27.      year. Now, what this bill does it just raises it...does not  
28.      mention 500,000 but in an amount needed to do it. It takes away  
29.      the amount particularly. It's a very good amendment, these  
30.      facilities are very badly needed down there. I've been aware  
31.      of it for some time and I would ask that we go along with the  
32.      Amendatory Veto as...

33.      PRESIDENT:

1. Is there further discussion? The question is shall  
2. the Senate accept the specific recommendations of the  
3. Governor as to HB 1943 in the manner and form just indicated  
4. by Senator Johns and on that question the Secretary will  
5. call the roll.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. On that question the yeas are 29. The nays are 5.  
27. The specific recommendations of the Governor as to HB 1943  
28. having failed to receive the required majority votes of  
29. Senators elected are declared rejected...Message from  
30. the Governor.

31. SECRETARY:

32. November 13, 1973. A Message from the Governor by  
33. Michael P. Duncan, Assistant to the Governor. Mr. President...

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Executive. Senator Ozinga.

3. SENATOR OZINGA:

4. Mr. Chairman...Mr. President, this Message has  
5. come in today and at this late hour I would request  
6. leave that the Executive Committee be excused from  
7. the Six-Day Notice required under the rules for  
8. hearing of these people tomorrow at 2:15. If there's...  
9. I have...

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator...Senator Ozinga moves to suspend the  
12. rules with respect to the Governor's Message dated  
13. November 13th for the purpose of posting the nominations  
14. in that Message for consideration by the Executive Com-  
15. mittee at the Executive Committee meeting tomorrow at  
16. 2:15. On that question all in favor signify by saying  
17. aye. Contrary no. The motion carries. Rules are sus-  
18. pended for that purpose. Is there further business to  
19. come before the Regular Session. Senator Mitchler.

20. SENATOR MITCHLER:

21. We have an announcement Mr. President, members of  
22. the Senate Industry and Labor Committee that was scheduled  
23. to meet tomorrow following adjournment, that meeting will  
24. be cancelled.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Is there further business to come before the  
27. Regular Session? Senator Shapiro.

28. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

29. Mr. President, I would like to ask leave of the Senate  
30. to postpone the reporting date for the Currency Exchange  
31. Law Study Commission from November 30th 1973 to May 1st 1974.
