15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Well, we will technically...we will accept your motion to
17. discharge the committees. What committee is it, Senator?

18. SENATOR VADALABENE:

19. I'll have to go back and see, there's four of them and
20. ...I'll have to check it back out.

22. Well, will you consult the Clerk and we will make the
23. appropriate...entry. Senator...McLendon.

16. Why, thank you, Mr. President...Ladies and Gentlemen
17. of the Senate. A point of personal privilege. We have in
18. the gallery with us today, the Police Commander of the 20th
19. District, Foster Avenue Station in Chicago, Commander Howard
20. Patinkin and his wife Fern and daughter Stacey. We would like to
21. welcome them to the Senate.

8. Heard the motion. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye.
9. Those opposed. The Ayes have it, the bills are discharged from
10. those committees. Senator Vadalabene now moves that those bills

12. The Ayes have it, the bills are Tabled. Senator Geo-Karis, for
