29. Senator Chew, for what purpose do you arise?
30. SENATOR CHEW:
31. Mr. President, I would rise to ask leave of the Senate
32. to waive the Six Day Posting Notice on two bills, Senate Bill
33. 125 and Senate Bill 126 to be heard in Committee on Transportation

1. on Friday, May 1, sponsored by Senator Sangmeister.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. All right. Senator Chew has moved to waive the Six Day  
4. Posting Notice with respect to Senate Bills 125 and 126 sponsored  
5. by Senator Sangmeister and asks that they be heard on this Friday's  
6. committee meeting on Transportation. Is there any objection?  
7. These are R...Senator Walsh.

8. SENATOR WALSH:

9. ...This is the first we've heard of this, Mr. President.  
10. I wonder if the gentleman would just hold the motion for a  
11. minute or two.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Collins, for what purpose do you arise?

14. SENATOR COLLINS:

15. Thank you, Mr. President. I would like leave from the Body  
16. to waive the Six Day Posting requirement for Senate Bills 70,  
17. 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 200, 201, 258, 383, 392, 393, 394, 395,  
18. 400, 615, 627 and House Bill 99 so that they can be heard in  
19. subcommittee today. Also to correct an error in the Calendar  
20. today. The Subcommittee on Minimum Wage is meeting today rather  
21. than tomorrow. I do have a...I've consulted with the Minority  
22. Spokesman and he is in agreement to this.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. All right. Senator...Senator Collins has moved that  
25. those bills that were...or set for to be heard in subcommittee,  
26. that the Six Day Posting Notice be waived and that the bills  
27. be allowed to be heard in subcommittee this afternoon as per last week's  
28. Labor and Commerce Committee. Any discussion? Senator Walsh.

29. SENATOR WALSH:

30. ...Mr. President, just once again...for the benefit of the  
31. membership, I thought we had somewhat of an understanding that...  
32. that any requests such as this would...would...would go to  
33. leadership on both sides of the aisle. We had a Republican

1. request for a...a re-referral and it was conveyed to the  
2. Democrat Leadership as, of course, it should and likewise,  
3. I would think if there's a Democrat request it would come to  
4. the Republican Leadership. I understand Senator Collins said  
5. she had spoken to Senator Keats and he, for some reason, hasn't  
6. gotten to me, at any rate. So I can understand what the  
7. situation is here. Did...did...you want to suspend the Six  
8. Day Posting requirement and it's a case of the...you had...you  
9. had mentioned it in committee that this would take place, but  
10. just didn't get around to making a...posting the notice in  
11. the...if you can tell me when you're going to make the posting  
12. and when the hearing will be held.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Collins.

15. SENATOR COLLINS:

16. Yes, I can respond. It was announced in committee that  
17. these bills would be heard in subcommittee today. There was  
18. a technical error in the posting and these bills didn't get  
19. posted, but the two other subcommittee bills was posted, these  
20. numbers didn't get posted.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Walsh.

23. SENATOR WALSH:

24. I...I would have no objection to Senator Collins' motion.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. All right. Senator Collins has moved to waive the Six  
27. Day Posting Notice with respect to those aforementioned bills  
28. to be heard in subcommittee this afternoon. Leave granted?  
29. Leave is granted. Senator Joyce.

30. SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

31. I've got one of these, too. It's...I want to waive the Six  
32. Day Rule on...

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Well, why don't...why...have you mentioned it to Senator  
2. Walsh? Why don't we walk over and mention it to Senator Walsh.  
3. Senator Nedza.

4. SENATOR NEDZA:

5. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I'd ask for leave of  
6. the Body at this time to be listed as a hyphenated cosponsor  
7. to Senate Bill 501 and 502, which are bills that Senator Donnewald  
8. is sponsoring. And because of his incapacity I would like to  
9. leave...ask leave to be listed as a hyphenated cosponsor for  
10. the purpose of moving the bills.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. All right. Senator Nedza asks leave of the Body to be  
13. shown as the hyphenated cosponsor of Senate Bills 501 and 502  
14. in lieu of Senator Donnewald's presence. Leave is granted.  
15. On that order, I might just let the membership know that  
16. Senator Donnewald is doing exceptionally well. He expects  
17. to be released from the hospital early this week and will  
18. then have to recuperate at home for a period of about  
19. two to three weeks. Senator Chew, for what purpose do you  
20. arise?

21. SENATOR CHEW:

22. Yeah, there seem to be some objections...because...

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Let's...let's hold it till tomorrow. You've got time  
25. to work it out.

26. SENATOR CHEW:

27. Yeah, we'll hold it until...let's set them for next week.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Well, we can...let's just hold it till tomorrow...okay.

30. SENATOR CHEW:

31. Okay...all right.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Any further business to come before the Senate? Senator

1. Johns.

2. SENATOR JOHNS:

3. Mr. President and all Democratic Senators, there will  
4. be a Democratic caucus immediately upon adjournment today in  
5. Room 212. Room 212, immediately.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Ozinga.

8. SENATOR OZINGA:

9. Rather than let the wayward wander off, there will be  
10. a Republican caucus in Shapiro's office, Senator Shapiro's  
11. office, immediately. Immediately after adjournment.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. All right. Senator Davidson.

14. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

15. Mr. President and members of the Senate. To those Senators  
16. who have not got their tickets for the Governor's Prayer Break-  
17. fast please see me, 'cause we are sold out and I'm only going  
18. to hold the few tickets we have...were reserved for you people  
19. till this Thursday morning. If you're going, please see me  
20. today or tomorrow, they're six dollars. Thursday morning,  
21. May the 7th.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Joyce.

24. SENATOR JOYCE:

25. Mr. President, I would like...permission to waive the  
26. Six Day Rule on Senate Bill 721 for the purpose of hearing  
27. in Ag Committee this afternoon. We have talked to the...royalty.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. All right. Senator Joyce has moved to waive the Six Day  
30. Posting requirement for Senate Bill 721 so that...may be heard  
31. in today's committee meeting of Agriculture, Conservation and  
32. Utilities. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered.  
33. Senator Walsh.

1. SENATOR WALSH:

2. Mr. President, I request that the Journal show that  
3. Senator Bowers is absent because of illness and Senator Bloom  
4. is absent because of a death in the family.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. All right. The Journal will so reflect and I'm sure it  
7. will also reflect the fact that Senator Donnewald is still  
8. hospitalized. Further business or further announcements?  
9. Democratic caucus immediately in Room 212, Republican caucus  
10. immediately in Senator Shapiro's office. Senator Carroll stands...  
11. moves that the Senate stand adjourned until Wednesday, April  
12. 29th at the hour of noon. The Senate stands adjourned.

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
