It also tells that if the accident do occur, the follow-up and the costs to the State, and to the agencies, Public Aid and et cetera to the State of Illinois is just tremendous. So we're not just talking about if death occur, we're talking also if there is an injury and if there's an accident. And this applies to the total State of Illinois. Accidents don't just occur in Chicago; they occur throughout the State of Illinois, and the cost is spread over to everyone in the State of Illinois. So I ask for a favorable roll call on this amendment.
