WHEREAS, The mission of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society is to cure MS while empowering people affected by MS to live their best lives, a mission that all Americans and Illinoisans should support; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare March 12 through March 18, 2023 as MS Awareness Week in the State of Illinois and recognize the importance of finding the cause and cure of MS; and be it further
