1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1706

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 1706 on page 1, by
3 replacing lines 4 and 5 with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Nurse Practice Act is amended by changing
5 Section 50-26 and by adding Article 85 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 65/50-26)

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2028)

8 Sec. 50-26. Application for license. Applications for
9 licenses shall be made to the Department on forms prescribed
10 by the Department and accompanied by the required fee. All
11 applications shall contain the information that, in the
12 judgment of the Department, will enable the Department to pass
13 on the qualifications of the applicant for a license under
14 this Act.

15 If an applicant fails to obtain a license under this Act
16 within 3 years after filing his or her application, the

1 application shall be denied. The applicant may make a new
2 application, which shall be accompanied by the required
3 nonrefundable fee. The applicant shall be required to meet the
4 qualifications required for licensure at the time of
5 reapplication.

6 The Department may establish, by rule, fees to be charged
7 for the purpose of implementing and enforcing the provisions
8 of this Act, including the fees necessary to implement the
9 Nurse Licensure Compact under Article 85. On or after the
10 effective date of the Nurse Licensure Compact under Article
11 85, the Department may set the required fees to apply for a
12 multi-state license, upgrade from a single state license to a
13 multi-state license, and renew a multi-state license. The
14 initial application fee for a multi-state license issued under
15 this Section shall be no less than \$150. The biennial
16 multi-state license renewal fee shall be no less than \$125.
