SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 3305/17.8

Amends the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act. Specifies that the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security shall not award grants from the IEMA State Projects Fund to those entities whose primary purpose is to provide reproductive health care services (rather than medical or mental health services). Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act is
5 amended by changing Section 17.8 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 3305/17.8)

7 Sec. 17.8. IEMA State Projects Fund. The IEMA State
8 Projects Fund is created as a trust fund in the State treasury.
9 The Fund shall consist of any moneys appropriated to the
10 Agency for purposes of the Illinois' Not-For-Profit Security
11 Grant Program, a grant program authorized by subsection (g-5)
12 of Section 5 of this Act, to provide funding support for target
13 hardening activities and other physical security enhancements
14 for qualifying not-for-profit organizations that are at high
15 risk of terrorist attack. The Agency is authorized to use
16 moneys appropriated from the Fund to make grants to
17 not-for-profit organizations for target hardening activities,
18 security personnel, and physical security enhancements and for
19 the payment of administrative expenses associated with the
20 Not-For-Profit Security Grant Program, except that, ~~beginning~~
21 ~~July 1, 2024,~~ the Agency shall not award grants under this
22 Section to those entities whose primary purpose is to provide
23 reproductive health care ~~medical or mental health~~ services, as

1 security grants to those entities may be available through the
2 Department of Public Health. As used in this Section, "target
3 hardening activities" include, but are not limited to, the
4 purchase and installation of security equipment on real
5 property owned or leased by the not-for-profit organization.
6 Grants, gifts, and moneys from any other source, public or
7 private, may also be deposited into the Fund and used for the
8 purposes authorized by this Act.
