1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 2380

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 2380, AS AMENDED,
3 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "Section 5. The Electric Vehicle Rebate Act is amended by
6 changing Sections 10, 15, 27, and 40 as follows:

7 (415 ILCS 120/10)

8 Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

9 "Agency" means the Environmental Protection Agency.

10 "Covered Area" means the counties of Cook, DuPage, Kane,
11 Lake, McHenry, and Will, the townships of Aux Sable and Goose
12 Lake in Grundy County, and the township of Oswego in Kendall
13 County.

14 "Electric vehicle" means a vehicle that is exclusively
15 powered by and refueled by electricity, must be plugged in to
16 charge, and is legally permitted ~~licensed~~ to drive on all

1 public roadways, including interstate highways. "Electric
2 Vehicle" does not include ~~electric mopeds~~, electric
3 ~~off-highway~~ vehicles primarily intended to be driven
4 off-highway, including golf carts and electric vehicles with a
5 maximum speed below 45 miles per hour, or hybrid electric
6 vehicles and extended-range electric vehicles that are also
7 equipped with conventional fueled propulsion or auxiliary
8 engines.

9 "Eligible applicant" means persons and families whose
10 income does not exceed 500% of the federal poverty line for the
11 current State fiscal year and who may not be claimed as a
12 dependent.

13 "Eligible vehicle" means an electric vehicle, as defined
14 by this Act, with a selling price not exceeding \$80,000 as
15 shown on the bill of sale, that has not previously received a
16 rebate under this Act. For the purposes of this Act, State and
17 local taxes, license and registration fees, documentary
18 service fees, and aftermarket products, including, but not
19 limited to, extended warranties, service contracts, and other
20 voluntary vehicle protection products, are excluded from the
21 calculation of the selling price if separately itemized on the
22 bill of sale.

23 ~~"Environmental justice community" has the same meaning,~~
24 ~~based on existing methodologies and findings, used and as may~~
25 ~~be updated by the Illinois Power Agency and its Program~~
26 ~~Administrator of the Illinois Solar for All Program.~~

1 "Low-income applicants~~Low-income~~" means persons and
2 families whose income does not exceed 80% of the regional or
3 county State median income for the current State fiscal year,
4 as established by the United States Department of Housing and
5 Urban Development's Illinois Income Limits by metropolitan
6 area and county ~~Health and Human Services~~.

9 Sec. 15. Rulemaking. The Agency shall adopt ~~promulgate~~
10 rules as necessary and dedicate sufficient resources to
11 implement Section 27 of this Act. Such rules shall be
12 consistent with applicable provisions of the Clean Air Act and
13 any regulations promulgated pursuant thereto. The Secretary of
14 State may adopt ~~promulgate~~ rules to implement Section 35 of
15 this Act.

19 Sec. 27. Electric vehicle rebate.

20 (a) Beginning July 1, 2022, and continuing as long as
21 funds are available, each eligible applicant ~~person~~ shall be
22 eligible to apply for a rebate, in the amounts set forth below,
23 following the purchase of an eligible electric vehicle in
24 Illinois. The Agency shall accept applications and issue

1 rebates consistent with the provisions of this Act and any
2 implementing regulations adopted by the Agency. In no event
3 shall a rebate amount exceed the purchase price of the
4 vehicle.

5 (1) Beginning July 1, 2025 ~~2022~~, a \$2,000 ~~\$4,000~~
6 rebate for eligible applicants toward the purchase of a
7 new or used ~~an~~ electric vehicle that is not an electric
8 motorcycle and a \$1,500 rebate for the purchase of an
9 electric vehicle that is an electric motorcycle.
10 Low-income applicants are eligible for an additional
11 \$2,000 rebate for new or used vehicles that are not
12 electric motorcycles.

13 (2) (Blank). ~~Beginning July 1, 2026, a \$2,000 rebate~~
14 ~~for the purchase of an electric vehicle that is not an~~
15 ~~electric motorcycle.~~

16 (3) Beginning July 1, 2028, a \$1,500 rebate for
17 eligible applicants toward the purchase of a new or used
18 ~~an~~ electric vehicle that is not an electric motorcycle and
19 a \$750 rebate for the purchase of an electric vehicle that
20 is an electric motorcycle. Low-income applicants are
21 eligible for an additional \$1,500 for new or used vehicles
22 that are not electric motorcycles.

23 (4) (Blank). ~~Beginning July 1, 2022, a \$1,500 rebate~~
24 ~~for the purchase of an electric vehicle that is an~~
25 ~~electric motorcycle.~~

26 (b) To be eligible to receive a rebate, a purchaser must:

1 (1) Reside in Illinois, both at the time the vehicle
2 was purchased and at the time the rebate is issued.

3 (2) Purchase an electric vehicle in Illinois on or
4 after July 1, 2022 and be the owner of the vehicle at the
5 time the rebate is issued. Rented or leased vehicles,
6 vehicles purchased from an out-of-state dealership, and
7 vehicles delivered to or received by the purchaser
8 out-of-state are not eligible for a rebate under this Act.

9 (3) Apply for the rebate within 180 ~~90~~ days after the
10 vehicle purchase date, and provide to the Agency proof of
11 residence, proof of vehicle ownership, and proof that the
12 vehicle was purchased in Illinois, including a copy of a
13 purchase agreement noting an Illinois seller. The
14 purchaser must notify the Agency of any changes in
15 residency or ownership of the vehicle that occur between
16 application for a rebate and issuance of a rebate.

17 (4) Apply for the rebate during an open rebate cycle,
18 as identified by the Agency.

19 (5) Certify that the purchaser qualifies as an
20 eligible applicant and a low-income applicant, if
21 applicable.

22 (c) The Agency shall make available in application
23 materials methods for purchasers to identify as low-income
24 applicants. The Agency shall prioritize the review of
25 qualified applications from low-income applicant purchasers
26 and award rebates to qualified purchasers accordingly.

1 (d) The purchaser must retain ownership of the vehicle for
2 a minimum of 12 consecutive months immediately after the
3 vehicle purchase date. The purchaser must continue to reside
4 in Illinois during that time frame and register the vehicle in
5 Illinois during that time frame. Rebate recipients who fail to
6 satisfy any of the above criteria will be required to
7 reimburse the Agency all or part of the original rebate amount
8 and shall notify the Agency within 60 days of failing to
9 satisfy the criteria.

10 (e) Rebates administered under this Section shall be
11 available for both new and used electric vehicles.

12 (f) A rebate administered under this Act may only be
13 applied for and awarded one time per vehicle identification
14 number. A rebate may only be applied for and awarded once per
15 purchaser in any 10-year period.

16 (g) For program auditing purposes, the Agency may request
17 from a rebate recipient additional information and
18 documentation evidencing eligibility for a rebate issued on or
19 after July 1, 2025, including copies of income tax returns
20 that corroborate the certification referenced in paragraph (5)
21 of subsection (b). If requested by the Agency, a rebate
22 recipient shall provide the information and documentation
23 within the timeframe specified in the Agency's request. If the
24 rebate recipient fails to provide the information and
25 documentation requested by the Agency by the specified
26 deadline, or if the information and documentation provided

1 evidences that the rebate recipient was not eligible for the
2 rebate or the rebate recipient fails to corroborate the
3 certification referenced in paragraph (5) of subsection (b),
4 the rebate recipient may be required to reimburse the Agency
5 all or part of the original rebate amount.

8 Sec. 40. Appropriations from the Electric Vehicle Rebate
9 Fund.

10 (a) The Agency shall estimate the amount of user fees
11 expected to be collected under Section 35 of this Act for each
12 fiscal year. User fee funds shall be deposited into and
13 distributed from the Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund in the
14 following manner:

15 (1) Through fiscal year 2023, an annual amount not to
16 exceed \$225,000 may be appropriated to the Agency from the
17 Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund to pay its costs of
18 administering the programs authorized by Section 27 of
19 this Act. Beginning in fiscal year 2024 and in each fiscal
20 year thereafter, an annual amount not to exceed \$600,000
21 may be appropriated to the Agency from the Electric
22 Vehicle Rebate Fund to pay its costs of administering the
23 programs authorized by Section 27 of this Act. An amount
24 not to exceed \$225,000 may be appropriated to the
25 Secretary of State from the Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund

1 to pay the Secretary of State's costs of administering the
2 programs authorized under this Act.

3 (2) In fiscal year 2022 and each fiscal year
4 thereafter, after appropriation of the amounts authorized
5 by item (1) of subsection (a) of this Section, the
6 remaining moneys estimated to be collected during each
7 fiscal year shall be appropriated.

8 (3) (Blank).

9 (4) Moneys appropriated to fund the programs
10 authorized in Sections 25 and 30 shall be expended only
11 after they have been collected and deposited into the
12 Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund.

13 (b) Amounts ~~General Revenue Fund amounts~~ appropriated to
14 and deposited into the Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund from the
15 General Revenue Fund, or any other fund, shall be distributed
16 from the Electric Vehicle Rebate Fund to fund the program
17 authorized in Section 27.
