1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4267

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 4267 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Township Code is amended by changing  
5 Sections 30-10 and 80-10 and by adding Section 55-70 as  
6 follows:

7 (60 ILCS 1/30-10)

8 Sec. 30-10. Notice of meeting; agenda.

9 (a) Notice of the time and place of holding the annual and  
10 any special township meetings shall be given by the township  
11 clerk (or, in the clerk's absence, the supervisor, assessor,  
12 or collector) by posting written or printed notices in 3 of the  
13 most public places in the township at least 15 days before the  
14 meeting and, if there is an English language newspaper  
15 published in the township, by at least one publication in that  
16 newspaper before the meeting. The notice shall set forth the

1 agenda for the meeting.

2 A township that has a website that the full-time staff of  
3 the township maintains shall also post on its website the  
4 notice and agenda of the annual and any special township  
5 meetings. A notice and agenda of the annual or a special  
6 township meeting that is posted on a township's website shall  
7 remain posted on the website at least until the annual or  
8 special township meeting is concluded.

9 (b) Agenda. Not less than 15 days before the annual  
10 meeting, the township board shall adopt an agenda for the  
11 annual meeting. Any 15 or more registered voters in the  
12 township may request an agenda item for consideration by the  
13 electors at the annual meeting by giving written notice of a  
14 specific request to the township clerk no later than March 1  
15 prior to the annual meeting. The agenda published by the  
16 township board shall include any such request made by voters  
17 if the request is relevant to powers granted to electors under  
18 the Township Code.

19 (c) Additional agenda items. Any matter or proposal not  
20 set forth in the published agenda shall not be considered at  
21 the annual meeting other than advising that the matter may be  
22 considered at a special meeting of the electors at a later  
23 date.

24 (d) Notice and agenda requirements for an annual township  
25 meeting that has been postponed under subsection (d) of  
26 Section 30-5 shall be the same as provided in this Section.

2 (60 ILCS 1/55-70 new)

3 Sec. 55-70. Simultaneous service on school board.  
4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a supervisor or  
5 trustee of a township with fewer than 2,500 inhabitants may  
6 simultaneously serve as a member of a school board, as defined  
7 by Section 1-3 of the School Code, if otherwise qualified.

8 (60 ILCS 1/80-10)

9 Sec. 80-10. Board meetings; township and road district  
10 accounts.

11 (a) The township board shall meet at the township clerk's  
12 office for the purpose of examining and auditing the township  
13 and road district accounts before any bills (other than  
14 general assistance, obligations for Social Security taxes as  
15 required by the Social Security Enabling Act, and wages that  
16 are subject to the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act,  
17 or other expenses determined by the township board by  
18 resolution) are paid, provided that payments made pursuant to  
19 a board resolution shall be reviewed and verified at the next  
20 meeting. The board may meet at other times as they determine.  
21 The township board may consider and approve bills individually  
22 or in a summary statement of any number of bills.

23 (b) Upon the request of the supervisor or of any 2 board  
24 members, the township clerk shall call a meeting at the time

1 requested and shall furnish to the board members at least 48  
2 hours' notice of the meeting.

3 (c) The township board may declare a vacancy in the office  
4 of township supervisor or trustee if the supervisor or a  
5 trustee has 5 or more consecutive unexcused absences from  
6 regularly scheduled township board meetings.

7 (d) The township board may adopt rules not inconsistent  
8 with this Code to govern its meetings. The rules may provide  
9 for excused absences of the supervisor or trustees from  
10 township board meetings.

11 (e) All meetings of the township board shall be open to the  
12 public as provided in the Open Meetings Act.

13 (f) Except as otherwise provided in Article 35, 3 members  
14 of the township board shall constitute a quorum for the  
15 transaction of business. The affirmative vote of 3 members of  
16 the township board is necessary to adopt any motion,  
17 resolution, or ordinance, unless a greater number is otherwise  
18 required by State law.

20 Section 10. The Park District Code is amended by changing  
21 Section 8-10b as follows:

22 (70 ILCS 1205/8-10b) (from Ch. 105, par. 8-10.2)

23 Sec. 8-10b. Joint recreational programs for persons with  
24 disabilities. Any 2 or more park districts, or in counties

1 with a population of 300,000 or less, a single park district  
2 and another unit of local government, are authorized to take  
3 any action jointly relating to recreational programs for  
4 persons with disabilities that could be taken individually and  
5 to enter into agreements with other park districts, townships,  
6 and recreation boards and the corporate authorities of cities,  
7 villages and incorporated towns specified in Sections 11-95-2  
8 and 11-95-3 of the "Illinois Municipal Code", approved May 29,  
9 1961, as amended, or any combination thereof, for the purpose  
10 of providing for the establishment, maintenance and management  
11 of joint recreational programs for persons with disabilities  
12 of all the participating districts and municipal areas,  
13 including provisions for transportation of participants,  
14 procedures for approval of budgets, authorization of  
15 expenditures and sharing of expenses, location of recreational  
16 areas in the area of any of the participating districts and  
17 municipalities, acquisition of real estate by gift, legacy,  
18 grant, or purchase, employment of a director and other  
19 professional workers for such program who may be employed by  
20 one participating district, municipality or board which shall  
21 be reimbursed on a mutually agreed basis by the other  
22 districts, municipalities and boards that are parties to the  
23 joint agreement, authorization for one municipality, board or  
24 district to supply professional workers for a joint program  
25 conducted in another municipality or district and to provide  
26 other requirements for operation of such joint program as may
