A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
7 purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the
8 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Illinois Law
9 Enforcement Training Standards Board:

10 OPERATIONS

11 Payable from the Law Enforcement Training Fund:

12	For payment of and/or reimbursement of basic training and	
13	basic training services in accordance with statutory	
14	provisions.....	18,500,000
15	For payment of and/or reimbursement of in-service training	
16	services in accordance with statutory	
17	provisions.....	24,191,000

9 Section 10. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Law Enforcement
11 Camera Grant Fund to the Illinois Law Enforcement Training
12 Standards Board for grants to units of local government in
13 Illinois related to installing video cameras in law
14 enforcement vehicles, training law enforcement officers in the
15 operation of the cameras, and expenses related to data storage
16 and related licensing costs, in accordance with statutory
17 provisions of the Law Enforcement Camera Grant Act.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$54,820,010, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2026, from the appropriation heretofore
21 made for such purposes in Article 93, Section 15 of Public Act
22 104-0003, as amended, is reappropriated from the Law
23 Enforcement Camera Grant Fund to the Illinois Law Enforcement
24 Training Standards Board for grants to units of local

1 government in Illinois related to installing video cameras in
 2 law enforcement vehicles, training law enforcement officers in
 3 the operation of the cameras, and expenses related to data
 4 storage and related licensing costs, in accordance with
 5 statutory provisions of the Law Enforcement Camera Grant Act.

6 Section 20. The following named amount, or so much thereof
 7 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
 8 purposes hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Illinois
 9 Law Enforcement Training Standards Board as follows:

10 GRANTS-IN-AID

11 Payable from the Traffic and Criminal
 12 Conviction Surcharge Fund:

- 13 For payment of and/or reimbursement
- 14 of basic training and basic training services
- 15 in accordance with statutory provisions 3,000,000
- 16 For payment of and/or reimbursement
- 17 of in-service training and in-service training services
- 18 in accordance with statutory provisions 5,000,000

19 Section 25. The sum of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof as
 20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Law Enforcement
 21 Officers Training Board Federal Projects Fund to the Illinois
 22 Law Enforcement Training Standards Board for expenses relating
 23 to various federal projects.

24 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
