Perfunctory Session

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2010

At the hour of 1:16 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF BILLS

The following bill was introduced, read by title a first time, ordered reproduced and placed in the Committee on Rules:

HOUSE BILL 6621. Introduced by Representative Coulson, AN ACT concerning the legislature.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 954

Offered by Representative Monique Davis:

WHEREAS, State Representative Monique D. Davis and the members of the Illinois House of Representatives are pleased to welcome the 4-H community to the Illinois State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is the largest youth organization in the State of Illinois, challenging nearly 300,000 Illinois youth to "learn by doing" with fun, hands-on activities teaching skills for living; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is the premier youth educational program of the United States Department of Agriculture and supported by the latest research from Illinois' land grant university, the University of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is part of the University of Illinois Extension and is available to all youth in every county in the State; and

WHEREAS, More than 24,000 caring, nurturing adults volunteer with 4-H youth by creating learning laboratories to practice real world skills needed today and in the future; and

WHEREAS, 4-H enriches the lives of Illinois youth while focusing on the mission mandates of science, engineering, and technology, healthy living, and citizenship/leadership; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is committed nationally to engage One Million New Scientists and One Million New Ideas by the year 2012 through promoting the concepts of science, engineering, and technology in 4-H programs and activities; and

WHEREAS, Research by Tufts University has shown that 4-H members do better in school, are more likely to see themselves going to college, are less likely to engage in risky behaviors, and contribute more to their communities; and

WHEREAS, 4-H offers youth supervised independence, a sense of belonging, a spirit of generosity towards others, and an opportunity to master life challenges; and

WHEREAS, 4-H members pledge their head, heart, hands, and health to making the best better in their clubs, communities, country, and world; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that Tuesday, March 9, 2010 is 4-H Day at the Illinois State Capitol, saluting the rich traditions of Illinois 4-H, the outstanding accomplishments of Illinois 4-H members and leaders and the commitment to science education for our future generations.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 955

Offered by Representative Rose:

WHEREAS, Eastern Illinois University proposes the establishment of a rural campus designation program in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The American Association of State Colleges and Universities supported federal legislation to create a new grant program for rural colleges and universities; and

WHEREAS, Funding will come through the U.S. Department of Education's Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE) program, which made it through in an omnibus bill; and

WHEREAS, At this time, the federal government is working to define the scope and goals of the program; and

WHEREAS, The main points include partnerships between universities and local education authorities, regional employers, or workforce investment boards; and

WHEREAS, In addition, there is an emphasis on economic development through partner-based initiatives; and

WHEREAS, By being given a State designation as "rural", universities may benefit when soliciting grant funding from private or federal entities; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Higher Education has the capability within its rules to establish a partnership with the federal grant program upon its official inception; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we direct the Board of Higher Education to establish a foundation to implement the rural campus designation program in this State in correlation with the federal program; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Board of Higher Education.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 961

Offered by Representative Phelps:

WHEREAS, Energy policy and regulation are vital to Illinois' economy and have a direct impact on Illinois families, farmers, businesses, and employees; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 2454, the American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009, also known as the "Waxman-Markey" and "Cap and Trade", passed by the United States House of Representatives and now pending before the United States Senate, will have a dramatic effect on every American, increase the cost of supplying homes and businesses with electricity, cause job losses, and impose burdensome costs on the poor and families with incomes of less than \$10,000 annually for whom energy costs today make up 60% of their average family expenses, and for families with incomes of \$10,000 to \$25,000 annually, such costs make up 25% of their average family expenses; and

WHEREAS, On December 7, 2009, the Administrator for the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) signed 2 distinct findings regarding greenhouse gases under Section 202(c) of the federal Clean Air Act:

(1) Endangerment Finding: the Administrator finds that the current and projected

concentrations of the 6 key well-mixed greenhouse gases, carbon dioxide (CO2), methane (CH4), nitrous oxide (N2O), hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs), and sulfur hexaflouride (SF6), in the atmosphere threaten the public health and welfare of current and future generations; and

(2) Cause and Contribute Finding: the Administrator finds that the combined emissions of

these well-mixed greenhouse gases from new motor vehicles and new motor vehicle engines contribute to the greenhouse gas pollution which threatens public health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, This finding by the EPA, if implemented, will cost Illinois jobs and raise electric rates on families, farmers, businesses, and employees; and

WHEREAS, The people of Illinois are dependent on coal for their electricity, obtaining approximately 50% of electrical energy from coal for their homes, farms, and businesses; this heavy dependence on coal is common throughout the Midwestern states; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is blessed with an abundance of coal, with coal-bearing rocks under 65% of the State, including all or parts of 86 of the 102 counties; the amount of recoverable coal beneath the surface in Illinois is estimated at 100 billion tons, enough to meet the nation's energy needs for the next 100 years;

there is more energy content in the coal in Illinois than the oil in Saudi Arabia and Kuwait combined; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois coal industry is a critical component of the State's economy, currently providing 4,000 direct jobs, thousands more indirect jobs, with an impact of over \$1 billion to the State's economy; and

WHEREAS, The technology of the 21st Century is providing cleaner, yet still affordable, baseload generation from coal, including Super Critical Pulverized Coal at the Prairie State Energy Campus in Washington County now under construction and scheduled to go online in 2011, and will provide low-cost energy to 2.5 million people in 9 states; and

WHEREAS, In 2009 the Clean Coal Portfolio Standard Act became law, which requires utilities to purchase up to 5% of their electricity from clean coal facilities that capture and store 50% of its carbon emissions, thus providing incentives for further development of coal gasification, coal-to-liquid, and carbon sequestration technologies; the Act also establishes a goal that each public utility obtain 25% of its power from clean coal plants by 2025; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' abundance of coal and incentives for coal gasification has made it the world's center for clean coal technology attracting several projects now in the planning phase, including the FutureGen project in Mattoon, the Taylorville Energy Center, the Power Holdings project in Jefferson County, and the Secure Energy project in Decatur; and

WHEREAS, The focus in Illinois and throughout the Midwest should be on developing and deploying clean coal technologies rather than a punitive system that drives up costs, leads to lower baseload energy production, and inhibits or prevents progress on a fuel that the United States has in abundance within its own borders; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge our elected statewide officials to express their opposition to the further acceptance or approval of the Environmental Protection Agency formal endangerment finding on greenhouse gases; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the United States Environmental Protection Agency to rescind their recent formal endangerment finding on greenhouse gases; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the we urge the Illinois congressional delegation to vote against H.R. 2454, the American Clean Energy Act of 2009, and urge our elected statewide officials express their respective positions on the passage of H.R. 2454 and send a unified message to our congressional delegation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Pat Quinn, President Barack Obama, President of the United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, and each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 104

Offered by Representative William Davis:

WHEREAS, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) is a term used to describe airflow obstruction that is associated mainly with emphysema and chronic bronchitis; and

WHEREAS, COPD affects an estimated 24 million people and kills more than 120,000 Americans every year; on average, one person dies from COPD every 4 minutes, an alarming statistic for a disease many have not learned about; and

WHEREAS, Of the top 5 diseases that kill Americans, including heart disease and cancer, all but COPD are on the decline; and

WHEREAS, Pulmonary experts predict that, by the year 2020, COPD will become the 3rd leading cause of death worldwide; and

WHEREAS, COPD currently accounts for 1.5 million emergency room visits, 726,000 hospitalizations, and 8 million physician office and hospital outpatient visits, all of which are a detriment to the U.S. economy; COPD costs the nation an estimated \$42.6 billion in direct and indirect medical costs annually; and

WHEREAS, COPD affects over 550,000 citizens of the State of Illinois; the Illinois COPD Coalition, convened by the Respiratory Health Association, is implementing the State Plan for Addressing COPD in Illinois, a state-wide effort to increase early detection, improve care and treatment, and prevent and reduce the prevalence of the disease; and

WHEREAS, Research has identified a hereditary protein deficiency called Alpha-1 Antitrypsin; people with this deficiency tend to develop COPD, even without exposure to smoking or environmental triggers; and

WHEREAS, Recently, the death rate for women with COPD has surpassed the death rate of men with COPD; women over the age of 40 are the fastest-growing segment of the population developing this irreversible disease, due in large part to the equalization of opportunities for men and women to smoke over the past several generations; and

WHEREAS, There is currently no cure for COPD; modern medical treatments can only address symptom relief and possibly slow the progression of the disease; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the month of November as COPD Awareness Month in the State of Illinois in recognition of this deadly disease and its effects on the citizens of this State.
