RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Chicago Board of Education to adopt rules that require the signatures of a majority of parents of students in a school and require that 2 public hearings be held at varying times of the day to ensure the maximum attendance by parents before the school may operate on a Track E (year-round) calendar; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be presented to the Chicago Board of Education.

SENATE RESOLUTION

Having been reported out of the Committee on Transportation, Regulation, Roads & Bridges on May 4, 2010, SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 118 was taken up for consideration.

Representative Tracy offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Joint Resolution 118 on page 1, by replacing lines 18 through 20 with the following:

"CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Interstate 290 to Interstate 88, Interstate 88 to Interstate 80, the portions of Interstate 80 from Interstate 88 to Interstate 74, Interstate 74 to Galesburg, U.S. Route 34 to"; and

on page 2, by replacing line 6 with the following:

"and the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority are requested to erect, consistent with"; and

on page 2, line 12, by inserting "the Executive Director of the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority," after "Transportation,".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

Representative Tracy moved the adoption of the resolution.

Pending discussion, Representative Bost moved the previous question.

And the question being, "Shall the main question be now put?" it was decided in the negative and the debate continued.

Pending discussion, Representative McCarthy moved the previous question.

And the question being, "Shall the main question be now put?" it was decided in the affirmative.

And on that motion, a vote was taken resulting as follows:

76, Yeas; 33, Nays; 1, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 2)

The motion prevailed and the Resolution was adopted, as amended.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate.

SENATE BILL ON THIRD READING

The following bill and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. Any amendments still pending upon the passage or defeat of a bill on Third Reading are automatically tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Boland, SENATE BILL 333 was taken up and read by title a third time. And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 70, Yeas; 32, Nays; 8, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 3)

This bill, as amended, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence in the House amendment/s adopted.

ACTION ON MOTIONS

Pursuant to the motion submitted previously, Representative Bradley moved to withdraw his motion to reconsider the vote by which SENATE BILL 3710 passed.

The motion prevailed.

RESOLUTIONS

Having been reported out of the Committee on Environmental Health on May 5, 2010, HOUSE RESOLUTION 1166 was taken up for consideration.

Representative May offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Resolution 1166 by replacing everything after the title with the following:

"WHEREAS, The 1st week of May is designated as National Safe Drinking Water Week; and

WHEREAS, Water is our most valuable natural resource; and

WHEREAS, Tap water provides vital public health and fire protection; tap water also provides support for our economy and sustains the quality of life we enjoy; and

WHEREAS, Americans consume approximately 50-plus gallons of water a day on average; and

WHEREAS, All measures of a successful society, including low mortality rates, economic growth and diversity, productivity, and public safety, are all in some way related to access to safe drinking water; and

WHEREAS, Every citizen is called upon to help protect our source waters from pollution and to promote water conservation; the United States Environmental Protection Agency suggests that if each resident fixed all their household water leaks and put in low-flow shower heads today, they could reduce their water consumption by 25%; and

WHEREAS, True cost pricing of water is an important element in present and future water conservation, in contrast to water rates that are artificially low due to various subsidies; and

WHEREAS, It is critical to the future health and growth of the State of Illinois that both private and public systems continue to invest in our water infrastructure; the U.S. EPA estimates that there is a \$330 billion dollar gap in water infrastructure investment throughout our nation; the State of Illinois should continue to promote investment in its water infrastructure both in public and private systems; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that adequate funding be made available for the State of Illinois to ensure that essential research and analysis of Illinois' current and future water needs can be done by organizations such as the Illinois Water Survey and the State Regional Water Supply Committees; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we join with the rest of the nation in celebrating National Drinking Water Week and applaud the workers who work hard every day to ensure that the citizens of the State of Illinois have safe, fresh, reliable, high-quality drinking water; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commit ourselves over the next year to vigorously raising the consciousness of the public on the importance of safe water resources.".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

Representative May moved the adoption of the resolution.

The motion prevailed and the resolution was adopted, as amended.

Having been reported out of the Committee on Bio-Technology on May 24, 2010, HOUSE RESOLUTION 1240 was taken up for consideration.

Having been reported out of the Committee on Electric Generation & Commerce on May 25, 2010, HOUSE RESOLUTION 1254 was taken up for consideration.

Representative Flider moved the adoption of the resolution.

Having been reported out of the Committee on Environment & Energy on May 25, 2010, HOUSE RESOLUTION 1174 was taken up for consideration.
