AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Highway Code is amended by changing
Section 7-301 as follows:

6 (605 ILCS 5/7-301) (from Ch. 121, par. 7-301)

7 Sec. 7-301.

In order to properly plan the utilization of motor fuel tax 8 9 funds each municipality of over 5,000 population shall be required to develop and update a 20 year long-range highway 10 transportation plan for a period not to exceed 20 years. The 11 plan shall contain an estimate of revenues which will become 12 13 available during that period and a statement of intention with 14 respect to the construction, maintenance, and other related work to be done insofar as it is possible to make such 15 16 estimates. In addition, the long-range plan shall show the 17 location of existing municipal streets and the general corridors of future highways, the projected future traffic 18 19 usage on each street for the duration of the plan a 20 year 20 period, a tabulation showing the design standards and the 21 geometric features associated with different levels of traffic 22 usage, and a listing of the major improvements anticipated with the within 5 years of the date of each plan. 1 shall be <u>made publicly available</u> filed with the County 2 Superintendent of Highways in the county or counties in which 3 the municipality is located and with the Secretary of the 4 Department of Transportation. The initial plan shall be on file 5 with the designated agencies by July 1, 1971 and shall be 6 updated <u>and made publicly available</u> on an annual basis 7 thereafter.
