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1 AN ACT concerning education.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-20 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-20)

Sec. 21B-20. Types of licenses. Before July 1, 2013, the 7 8 State Board of Education shall implement a system of educator 9 licensure, whereby individuals employed in school districts who are required to be licensed must have one of the following 10 (i) a professional educator license; 11 licenses: (ii) a 12 professional educator license with stipulations; or (iii) a 13 substitute teaching license. References in law regarding 14 individuals certified or certificated or required to be certified or certificated under Article 21 of this Code shall 15 16 also include individuals licensed or required to be licensed 17 under this Article. The first year of all licenses ends on June 30 following one full year of the license being issued. 18

19 The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 20 State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, may adopt such 21 rules as may be necessary to govern the requirements for 22 licenses and endorsements under this Section.

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(1) Professional Educator License. Persons who (i)

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1 have successfully completed approved an educator 2 preparation program and are recommended for licensure by 3 the Illinois institution offering the educator preparation program, (ii) have successfully completed the required 4 5 testing under Section 21B-30 of this Code, (iii) have 6 successfully completed coursework on the psychology of, 7 the identification of, and the methods of instruction for exceptional child, including without 8 the limitation 9 children with learning disabilities, (iv) have 10 successfully completed coursework in methods of reading 11 and reading in the content area, and (v) have met all other 12 criteria established by rule of the State Board of Education shall be issued a Professional Educator License. 13 All Professional Educator Licenses are valid until June 30 14 15 immediately following 5 years of the license being issued. 16 The Professional Educator License shall be endorsed with 17 specific areas and grade levels in which the individual is 18 eligible to practice.

Individuals can receive subsequent endorsements on the Professional Educator License. Subsequent endorsements shall require a minimum of 24 semester hours of coursework in the endorsement area, unless otherwise specified by rule, and passage of the applicable content area test.

24 (2) Educator License with Stipulations. An Educator
 25 License with Stipulations shall be issued an endorsement
 26 that limits the license holder to one particular position

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or does not require completion of an approved educator
 program or both.

An individual with an Educator License with Stipulations must not be employed by a school district or any other entity to replace any presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

An Educator License with Stipulations may be issued
with the following endorsements:

9 (A) Provisional educator. A provisional educator 10 endorsement in a specific content area or areas on an 11 Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an 12 applicant who holds an educator license from another 13 state, U.S. territory, or foreign country and who, at 14 the time of applying for an Illinois license, does not 15 meet the minimum requirements under Section 21B-35 of 16 this Code, but does, at a minimum, meet the following 17 requirements:

(i) Holds the equivalent of a minimum of a 18 19 bachelor's degree, unless a master's degree is 20 required for the endorsement, from a regionally 21 accredited college or university or, for 22 individuals educated in a country other than the 23 United States, the equivalent of a minimum of a 24 bachelor's degree issued in the United States, 25 unless a master's degree is required for the 26 endorsement.

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(ii) Has passed or passes a test of basic 1 2 skills and content area test prior to or within one 3 year after issuance of the provisional educator endorsement on the Educator License with 4 5 Stipulations. If an individual who holds an 6 Educator License with Stipulations endorsed for 7 provisional educator has not passed a test of basic 8 skills and applicable content area test or tests 9 within one year after issuance of the endorsement, 10 the endorsement shall expire on June 30 following 11 one full year of the endorsement being issued. If 12 such an individual has passed the test of basic 13 skills and applicable content area test or tests 14 either prior to issuance of the endorsement or 15 within one year after issuance of the endorsement, 16 the endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately 17 following 2 years of the license being issued, 18 during which time any and all coursework 19 deficiencies must be met and any and all additional 20 testing deficiencies must be met.

In addition, a provisional educator endorsement for principals or superintendents may be issued if the individual meets the requirements set forth in subdivisions (1) and (3) of subsection (b-5) of Section 21B-35 of this Code. program at an Illinois institution of higher education shall not receive a provisional educator endorsement if the person completed an alternative licensure program in another state, unless the program has been determined to be equivalent to Illinois program requirements.

7 Notwithstanding any other requirements of this Section, a service member or spouse of a service member 8 may obtain a Professional Educator License with 9 10 Stipulations, and a provisional educator endorsement 11 in a specific content area or areas, if he or she holds 12 a valid teaching certificate or license in good 13 standing from another state, meets the qualifications 14 of educators outlined in Section 21B-15 of this Code, 15 and has not engaged in any misconduct that would 16 prohibit an individual from obtaining a license 17 pursuant to Illinois law, including without limitation any administrative rules of the State Board of 18 19 Education.

In this Section, "service member" means any person 20 21 who, at the time of application under this Section, is 22 an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces 23 or any reserve component of the United States Armed 24 Forces or the National Guard of anv state, 25 commonwealth, or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia. 26

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1 A provisional educator endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately following 2 years of the license 2 3 being issued, provided that any remaining testing and coursework deficiencies are met as set forth in this 4 5 Section. Failure to satisfy all stated deficiencies shall mean the individual, including any service 6 member or spouse who has obtained a Professional 7 Educator License with Stipulations and a provisional 8 9 educator endorsement in a specific content area or areas, is ineligible to receive a Professional 10 11 Educator License at that time. An Educator License with 12 Stipulations endorsed for provisional educator shall 13 not be renewed for individuals who hold an Educator 14 License with Stipulations and who have held a position 15 in a public school or non-public school recognized by 16 the State Board of Education.

17 Alternative provisional (B) educator. An 18 alternative provisional educator endorsement on an 19 Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an 20 applicant who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, has done all of the following: 21

22 (i) Graduated from a regionally accredited 23 college or university with a minimum of а 24 bachelor's degree.

25 (ii) Successfully completed the first phase of 26 the Alternative Educator Licensure Program for 1

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Teachers, as described in Section 21B-50 of this Code.

3 (iii) Passed a test of basic skills and content
4 area test, as required under Section 21B-30 of this
5 Code.

6 The alternative provisional educator endorsement 7 is valid for 2 years of teaching and may be renewed for 8 a third year by an individual meeting the requirements 9 set forth in Section 21B-50 of this Code.

10 (C) Alternative provisional superintendent. An 11 alternative provisional superintendent endorsement on 12 an Educator License with Stipulations entitles the 13 holder to serve only as a superintendent or assistant 14 superintendent in a school district's central office. 15 This endorsement may only be issued to an applicant 16 who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, has 17 done all of the following:

(i) Graduated from a regionally accredited
college or university with a minimum of a master's
degree in a management field other than education.

(ii) Been employed for a period of at least 5
years in a management level position in a field
other than education.

24 (iii) Successfully completed the first phase
25 of an alternative route to superintendent
26 endorsement program, as provided in Section 21B-55

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1 of this Code.
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2 (iv) Passed a test of basic skills and content
3 area tests required under Section 21B-30 of this
4 Code.

5 The endorsement may be registered for 2 fiscal 6 years in order to complete one full year of serving as 7 a superintendent or assistant superintendent.

8 (D) Resident teacher endorsement. A resident 9 teacher endorsement on an Educator License with 10 Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who, at the 11 time of applying for the endorsement, has done all of 12 the following:

13 (i) Graduated from a regionally accredited
14 institution of higher education with a minimum of a
15 bachelor's degree.

16 (ii) Enrolled in an approved Illinois educator17 preparation program.

18 (iii) Passed a test of basic skills and content
19 area test, as required under Section 21B-30 of this
20 Code.

The resident teacher endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for 4 years of teaching and shall not be renewed.

A resident teacher may teach only under the direction of a licensed teacher, who shall act as the resident mentor teacher, and may not teach in place of 1 2

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a licensed teacher. A resident teacher endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations shall no longer be valid after June 30, 2017.

(E) Career and technical educator. A career and 4 5 technical educator endorsement on an Educator License 6 with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who has 7 a minimum of 60 semester hours of coursework from a regionally accredited institution of higher education 8 9 or an accredited trade and technical institution and 10 has a minimum of 2,000 hours of experience outside of 11 education in each area to be taught.

12 The career and technical educator endorsement on 13 an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until 14 30 immediately following 5 years of June the 15 endorsement being issued and may be renewed. For 16 individuals who were issued the career and technical 17 educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations on or after January 1, 2015, the license 18 19 may be renewed if the individual passes a test of basic 20 skills or test of work proficiency, as required under Section 21B-30 of this Code. 21

(F) Part-time provisional career and technical
 educator or provisional career and technical educator.
 A part-time provisional career and technical educator
 endorsement or a provisional career and technical
 educator endorsement on an Educator License with

1 Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who has a minimum of 8,000 hours of work experience in the skill 2 3 for which the applicant is seeking the endorsement. It is the responsibility of each employing school board 4 5 regional office of education to provide and 6 verification, in writing, to the State Superintendent 7 of Education at the time the application is submitted qualified teacher holding a Professional 8 that no License Educator License Educator 9 or an with 10 Stipulations with a career and technical educator 11 endorsement is available and that actual circumstances 12 require such issuance.

provisional career and technical educator 13 The 14 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 15 is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of 16 the endorsement being issued and may be renewed only one time for 5 years. For individuals who were issued 17 18 provisional career and technical educator the 19 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 20 on or after January 1, 2015, the license may be renewed 21 one time if the individual passes a test of basic 22 skills or test of work proficiency, as required under 23 Section 21B-30 of this Code, and has completed a 24 minimum of 20 semester hours from a regionally 25 accredited institution.

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A part-time provisional career and technical

educator endorsement on an Educator License with 1 Stipulations may be issued for teaching no more than 2 2 3 courses of study for grades 6 through 12. The part-time provisional career and technical educator endorsement 4 on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until 5 5 6 June 30 immediately following years of the 7 endorsement being issued and may be renewed for 5 years if the individual makes application for renewal. 8

9 Transitional bilingual (G) educator. А 10 transitional bilingual educator endorsement on an 11 Educator License with Stipulations may be issued for 12 the purpose of providing instruction in accordance 13 with Article 14C of this Code to an applicant who 14 provides satisfactory evidence that he or she meets all 15 of the following requirements:

16 (i) Possesses adequate speaking, reading, and
17 writing ability in the language other than English
18 in which transitional bilingual education is
19 offered.

20 (ii) Has the ability to successfully21 communicate in English.

22 (iii) Either possessed, within 5 years 23 previous to his or her applying for a transitional 24 bilingual educator endorsement, а valid and 25 comparable teaching certificate or comparable 26 authorization issued by a foreign country or holds

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a degree from an institution of higher learning in 1 country that the State 2 а foreign Educator 3 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a 4 5 regionally accredited institution of higher 6 learning in the United States.

A transitional bilingual educator endorsement shall be valid for prekindergarten through grade 12, is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the endorsement being issued, and shall not be renewed.

Persons holding a transitional bilingual educator endorsement shall not be employed to replace any presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

15 (H) Language endorsement. In an effort to 16 alleviate the shortage of teachers speaking a language 17 other than English in the public schools, an individual who holds an Educator License with Stipulations may 18 19 also apply for a language endorsement, provided that 20 the applicant provides satisfactory evidence that he 21 or she meets all of the following requirements:

22 (i) Holds a transitional bilingual23 endorsement.

24 (ii) Has demonstrated proficiency in the
25 language for which the endorsement is to be issued
26 by passing the applicable language content test

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required by the State Board of Education.

2 (iii) Holds a bachelor's degree or higher from 3 a regionally accredited institution of higher education or, for individuals educated in 4 a 5 country other than the United States, holds a degree from an institution of higher learning in a 6 the 7 foreign country that State Educator 8 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be 9 the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution of 10 higher 11 learning in the United States.

(iv) Has passed a test of basic skills, as
 required under Section 21B-30 of this Code.

14 A language endorsement on an Educator License with 15 Stipulations is valid for prekindergarten through 16 grade 12 for the same validity period as the 17 individual's transitional bilingual educator endorsement on the Educator License with Stipulations 18 and shall not be renewed. 19

(I) Visiting international educator. A visiting
international educator endorsement on an Educator
License with Stipulations may be issued to an
individual who is being recruited by a particular
school district that conducts formal recruitment
programs outside of the United States to secure the
services of qualified teachers and who meets all of the

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following requirements:

(i) Holds the equivalent of a minimum of a bachelor's degree issued in the United States.

(ii) Has been prepared as a teacher at the grade level for which he or she will be employed.

6 (iii) Has adequate content knowledge in the 7 subject to be taught.

8 (iv) Has an adequate command of the English 9 language.

10 A holder of a visiting international educator 11 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 12 shall be permitted to teach in bilingual education 13 in the language that was the medium of programs 14 instruction in his or her teacher preparation program, 15 provided that he or she passes the English Language 16 Proficiency Examination or another test of writing 17 skills in English identified by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator 18 19 Preparation and Licensure Board.

20A visiting international educator endorsement on21an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for 322years and shall not be renewed.

(J) Paraprofessional educator. A paraprofessional
 educator endorsement on an Educator License with
 Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who holds a
 high school diploma or its recognized equivalent and

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either holds an associate's degree or a minimum of 60 1 semester hours of credit from a regionally accredited 2 3 institution of higher education or has passed a test of basic skills required under Section 21B-30 of this 4 5 Code. The paraprofessional educator endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of 6 7 the endorsement being issued and may be renewed through application and payment of the appropriate fee, as 8 9 required under Section 21B-40 of this Code. An individual who holds only a paraprofessional educator 10 11 endorsement is not subject to additional requirements 12 in order to renew the endorsement.

13 (K) Chief school business official. A chief school 14 business official endorsement on an Educator License 15 with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who 16 qualifies by having a master's degree or higher, 2 17 years of full-time administrative experience in school business management or 2 years of university-approved 18 19 practical experience, and a minimum of 24 semester 20 hours of graduate credit in a program approved by the 21 State Board of Education for the preparation of school 22 business administrators and by passage of the 23 applicable State tests, including a test of basic 24 skills and applicable content area test.

25The chief school business official endorsement may26also be affixed to the Educator License with

Stipulations of any holder who qualifies by having a 1 2 master's degree in business administration, finance, 3 accounting and who completes an additional 6 or semester hours of internship in school business 4 management from a regionally accredited institution of 5 higher education and passes the applicable State 6 7 tests, including a test of basic skills and applicable 8 content area test. This endorsement shall be required 9 for any individual employed as a chief school business 10 official.

11 The chief school business official endorsement on 12 an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until 13 June immediately following 5 30 years of the 14 endorsement being issued and may be renewed if the 15 license holder completes renewal requirements as 16 required for individuals who hold a Professional 17 Educator License endorsed for chief school business official under Section 21B-45 of this Code and such 18 19 rules as may be adopted by the State Board of 20 Education.

21 (L) Provisional in-state educator. A provisional 22 in-state educator endorsement on an Educator License 23 with Stipulations may be issued to a candidate who has 24 completed an Illinois-approved educator preparation 25 program at an Illinois institution of higher education 26 and who has not successfully completed an

evidence-based assessment of teacher effectiveness but
 who meets all of the following requirements:

(i) Holds at least a bachelor's degree.

4 (ii) Has completed an approved educator
5 preparation program at an Illinois institution.

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6 (iii) Has passed a test of basic skills and 7 applicable content area test, as required by 8 Section 21B-30 of this Code.

9 attempted evidence-based (iv) Has an assessment of teacher effectiveness and received a 10 11 minimum score on that assessment, as established 12 by the State Board of Education in consultation 13 with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure 14 Board.

15 A provisional in-state educator endorsement on an 16 Educator License with Stipulations is valid for one 17 full fiscal year after the date of issuance and may not 18 be renewed.

19 (3) Substitute Teaching License. A Substitute Teaching 20 License may be issued to qualified applicants for 21 substitute teaching in all grades of the public schools, 22 prekindergarten through grade 12. Substitute Teaching 23 Licenses are not eligible for endorsements. Applicants for 24 a Substitute Teaching License must hold a bachelor's degree 25 or higher from a regionally accredited institution of higher education. 26

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Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for 5 years. 1 Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for substitute 2 3 teaching in every county of this State. If an individual has had his or her Professional Educator License or 4 5 Educator License with Stipulations suspended or revoked or 6 has not met the renewal requirements for licensure, then 7 that individual is not eligible to obtain a Substitute 8 Teaching License.

9 A substitute teacher may only teach in the place of a 10 licensed teacher who is under contract with the employing 11 board. If, however, there is no licensed teacher under 12 contract because of an emergency situation, then a district 13 may employ a substitute teacher for no longer than 30 14 calendar days per each vacant position in the district if 15 the district notifies the appropriate regional office of 16 education within 5 business days after the employment of 17 the substitute teacher in the emergency situation. An emergency situation is one in which an unforeseen vacancy 18 19 has occurred and (i) a teacher is unable to fulfill his or 20 her contractual duties or (ii) teacher capacity needs of 21 the district exceed previous indications, and the district 22 is actively engaged in advertising to hire a fully licensed 23 teacher for the vacant position.

There is no limit on the number of days that a substitute teacher may teach in a single school district, provided that no substitute teacher may teach for longer HB2470 Engrossed - 19 - LRB100 08416 MLM 18530 b

than 90 school days for any one licensed teacher under 1 2 contract in the same school year. A substitute teacher who holds a Professional Educator License or Educator License 3 with Stipulations shall not teach for more than 120 school 4 5 days for any one licensed teacher under contract in the same school year. The limitations in this paragraph (3) on 6 7 the number of days a substitute teacher may be employed do 8 not apply to any school district operating under Article 34 9 of this Code.
