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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 0.5

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and reappropriations for State fiscal year 2018. Article 3 6 7 contains reappropriations of certain appropriations as may have been appropriated for State fiscal year 2017 by a Public Act 8 9 of the 100th General Assembly. To the extent that such a Public Act has not been enacted, Article 4 contains appropriations of 10 identical amounts and purposes to those in Article 3 but as new 11 12 appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section 99 of Article 5 sets forth an effective date that causes Article 3 13 14 to become effective if and only if an applicable Public Act of 15 the 100th General Assembly should be enacted; should such not 16 be enacted, the Section causes Article 4 to become effective.

17 ARTICLE 1

Section 40. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the non-federal cost share of a Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program to establish long-term contracts and permanent conservation easements in the Illinois River Basin; to fund cost share assistance to landowners to encourage approved conservation practices in environmentally sensitive and highly erodible areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to fund the monitoring of long-term improvements of these conservation practices as required in the Memorandum of Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United States Department of Agriculture.

Section 41.
