SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

815 ILCS 530/10

Amends the Personal Information Protection Act. Provides that a private entity data collector that owns or licenses personal information concerning an Illinois resident must notify the resident of any security breach of the system data within 14 days after discovery of the breach (rather than requiring notification in the most expedient time possible and without unreasonable delay).

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Personal Information Protection Act is 5 amended by changing Section 10 as follows:

6 (815 ILCS 530/10)

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Sec. 10. Notice of breach.

(a) Any data collector that owns or licenses personal 8 9 information concerning an Illinois resident shall notify the resident at no charge that there has been a breach of the 10 11 security of the system data following discovery or notification of the breach. The disclosure notification shall be made by 12 private entities within 14 days after discovery of the breach 13 14 and by public entities in the most expedient time possible and without unreasonable delay, consistent with any measures 15 necessary to determine the scope of the breach and restore the 16 17 reasonable integrity, security, and confidentiality of the The disclosure notification to an Illinois 18 data system. 19 resident shall include, but need not be limited to, information 20 as follows:

(1) With respect to personal information as defined in
 Section 5 in paragraph (1) of the definition of "personal
 information":

(A) the toll-free numbers and addresses for
 consumer reporting agencies;

3 (B) the toll-free number, address, and website
4 address for the Federal Trade Commission; and

5 (C) a statement that the individual can obtain 6 information from these sources about fraud alerts and 7 security freezes.

(2) With respect to personal information defined in 8 Section 5 in paragraph (2) of the definition of "personal 9 10 information", notice may be provided in electronic or other 11 form directing the Illinois resident whose personal 12 information has been breached to promptly change his or her user name or password and security question or answer, as 13 14 applicable, or to take other steps appropriate to protect all online accounts for which the resident uses the same 15 16 user name or email address and password or security 17 question and answer.

18 The notification shall not, however, include information 19 concerning the number of Illinois residents affected by the 20 breach.

(b) Any data collector that maintains or stores, but does not own or license, computerized data that includes personal information that the data collector does not own or license shall notify the owner or licensee of the information of any breach of the security of the data immediately following discovery, if the personal information was, or is reasonably - 3 - LRB100 16914 JLS 32056 b

believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person. In 1 2 addition to providing such notification to the owner or licensee, the data collector shall cooperate with the owner or 3 licensee in matters relating to the breach. That cooperation 4 5 shall include, but need not be limited to, (i) informing the owner or licensee of the breach, including giving notice of the 6 date or approximate date of the breach and the nature of the 7 8 breach, and (ii) informing the owner or licensee of any steps 9 the data collector has taken or plans to take relating to the 10 breach. The data collector's cooperation shall not, however, be 11 deemed to require either the disclosure of confidential 12 business information or trade secrets or the notification of an 13 Illinois resident who may have been affected by the breach.

14 (b-5) The notification to an Illinois resident required by 15 subsection (a) of this Section may be delayed if an appropriate 16 law enforcement agency determines that notification will 17 interfere with a criminal investigation and provides the data 18 collector with a written request for the delay. However, the 19 data collector must notify the Illinois resident as soon as 12 notification will no longer interfere with the investigation.

(c) For purposes of this Section, notice to consumers maybe provided by one of the following methods:

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(1) written notice;

(2) electronic notice, if the notice provided is
 consistent with the provisions regarding electronic
 records and signatures for notices legally required to be

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in writing as set forth in Section 7001 of Title 15 of the United States Code; or

substitute notice, if 3 the data collector (3) demonstrates that the cost of providing notice would exceed 4 5 \$250,000 or that the affected class of subject persons to be notified exceeds 500,000, or the data collector does not 6 7 have sufficient contact information. Substitute notice shall consist of all of the following: (i) email notice if 8 9 the data collector has an email address for the subject 10 persons; (ii) conspicuous posting of the notice on the data 11 collector's web site page if the data collector maintains 12 one; and (iii) notification to major statewide media or, if the breach impacts residents in one geographic area, to 13 prominent local media in areas where affected individuals 14 likely to reside if such notice is reasonably 15 are 16 calculated to give actual notice to persons whom notice is 17 required.

(d) Notwithstanding any other subsection in this Section, a 18 19 data collector that maintains its own notification procedures 20 as part of an information security policy for the treatment of personal information and is otherwise consistent with the 21 22 timing requirements of this Act, shall be deemed in compliance 23 with the notification requirements of this Section if the data 24 collector notifies subject persons in accordance with its 25 policies in the event of a breach of the security of the system 26 data.
