8	(a) Notwithstanding any ot	her provision of this Article,
9	beginning January 1, 1996, t	he minimum amount of widow's
10	annuity payable to any person	who is entitled to receive a
11	widow's annuity under this Arti	cle is \$700 per month, without
12	regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or	
13	after the effective date of this	amendatory Act of 1995.
14	Notwithstanding any other	provision of this Article,
15	beginning January 1, 1999, t	he minimum amount of widow's
16	annuity payable to any person	who is entitled to receive a

1 widow's annuity under this Article is \$800 per month, without 2 regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or 3 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1998.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, beginning January 1, 2004, the minimum amount of widow's annuity payable to any person who is entitled to receive a widow's annuity under this Article is \$900 per month, without regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, beginning January 1, 2005, the minimum amount of widow's annuity payable to any person who is entitled to receive a widow's annuity under this Article is \$1,000 per month, without regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

(b) Effective January 1, 1994, the minimum amount of 18 widow's annuity shall be \$700 per month for the following 19 20 classes of widows, without regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or after the effective date of this 21 22 amendatory Act of 1993: (1) the widow of a policeman who dies in service with at least 10 years of service credit, or who 23 24 dies in service after June 30, 1981; and (2) the widow of a 25 policeman who withdraws from service with 20 or more years of service credit and does not withdraw a refund, provided that 26

1 the widow is married to the policeman before he withdraws from 2 service.

(b-5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, 3 4 beginning January 1, 2017, the minimum widow's annuity under 5 this Article shall be no less than 125% of the Federal Poverty Level for all persons receiving widow's annuities on or after 6 that date, without regard to whether the deceased policeman is 7 8 in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory 9 Act of the 99th General Assembly. Notwithstanding any other 10 provision of this Article, beginning January 1, 2019, the 11 minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be no less than 150% of the Federal Poverty Level for all persons 12 13 receiving widow's annuities on or after that date, without 14 regard to whether the deceased policeman is in service on or 15 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th 16 General Assembly. For purposes of this Section, "Federal Poverty Level" means the poverty guidelines applicable to an 17 individual in a single-person household located in Illinois, as 18 19 updated periodically in the Federal Register by the United 20 States Department of Health and Human Services under the 21 authority of 42 U.S.C. 9902(2).

(c) The city, in addition to the contributions otherwise made by it under the other provisions of this Article, shall make such contributions as are necessary for the minimum widow's annuities provided under this Section in the manner prescribed in Section 5-175. 10000HB5183ham001

3 Sec. 6-128.2. Minimum retirement annuities.

4 (a) Beginning with the monthly payment due in January, 5 1988, the monthly annuity payment for any person who is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article in 6 January, 1990 and has retired from service at age 50 or over 7 8 with 20 or more years of service, and for any person who 9 retires from service on or after January 24, 1990 at age 50 or 10 over with 20 or more years of service, shall not be less than \$475 per month. The \$475 minimum annuity is exclusive of any 11 12 automatic annual increases provided by Sections 6-164 and 6-164.1, but not exclusive of previous raises in the minimum 13 14 annuity as provided by any Section of this Article.

Beginning January 1, 1992, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be \$650 per month.

Beginning January 1, 1993, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more 1 years of service after that date, shall be \$750 per month.

Beginning January 1, 1994, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be \$850 per month.

Beginning January 1, 2004, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be \$950 per month.

Beginning January 1, 2005, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be \$1,050 per month.

Beginning January 1, 2016, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be no less than 125% of the Federal Poverty Level. 10000HB5183ham001 -6- LRB100 19054 MJP 38750 a

Beginning January 1, 2019, the minimum retirement annuity payable to any person who has retired from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service and is entitled to receive a retirement annuity under this Article on that date, or who retires from service at age 50 or over with 20 or more years of service after that date, shall be no less than 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.

8 For purposes of this Section, the "Federal Poverty Level" 9 shall be determined pursuant to the poverty guidelines updated 10 periodically in the Federal Register by the United States 11 Department of Health and Human Services under the authority of 12 42 U.S.C. 9902(2).

The minimum annuities established by this subsection (a) do include previous raises in the minimum annuity as provided by any Section of this Article, but do not include any sums which have been added or will be added to annuity payments by the automatic annual increases provided by Sections 6-164 and 6-164.1. Such annual increases shall be paid in addition to the minimum amounts specified in this subsection.

20 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, 21 beginning January 1, 1990, the minimum retirement annuity 22 payable to any person who is entitled to receive a retirement 23 annuity under this Article on that date shall be \$475 per 24 month.

(c) The changes made to this Section by this amendatory Act
of the 93rd General Assembly apply to all persons receiving a

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1 retirement annuity under this Article, without regard to 2 whether the retirement of the fireman occurred prior to the 3 effective date of this amendatory Act.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article,
beginning January 1, 1996, the minimum amount of widow's
annuity payable to any person who is entitled to receive a
widow's annuity under this Article is \$700 per month, without
regard to whether the deceased fireman is in service on or
after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1995.

13 (b) Notwithstanding Section 6-128.3, beginning January 1, 14 1994, the minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be \$700 per month for (1) all persons receiving widow's annuities 15 on that date who are survivors of employees who retired at age 16 50 or over with at least 20 years of service, and (2) persons 17 who become eligible for widow's annuities and are survivors of 18 19 employees who retired at age 50 or over with at least 20 years of service. 20

(c) Notwithstanding Section 6-128.3, beginning January 1, 1999, the minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be \$800 per month for (1) all persons receiving widow's annuities on that date who are survivors of employees who retired at age 50 or over with at least 20 years of service, and (2) persons who become eligible for widow's annuities and are survivors of employees who retired at age 50 or over with at least 20 years of service.

(d) Notwithstanding Section 6-128.3, beginning January 1,
2004, the minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be
\$900 per month for all persons receiving widow's annuities on
or after that date, without regard to whether the deceased
fireman is in service on or after the effective date of this
amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

(e) Notwithstanding Section 6-128.3, beginning January 1, 2005, the minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be \$1,000 per month for all persons receiving widow's annuities on or after that date, without regard to whether the deceased fireman is in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

(f) Notwithstanding Section 6-128.3, beginning January 1, 2017, the minimum widow's annuity under this Article shall be no less than 125% of the Federal Poverty Level for all persons receiving widow's annuities on or after that date, without regard to whether the deceased fireman is in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly.
