Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Subsection (a) of Section 28-2 of the Election Code applies 18
- 19 to petitions for the union of contiguous municipalities. A

- on the question for at least 22 months from the date of the 18
- 19 election in which a majority of persons voted against the
- 20 proposition. However, if a majority of persons voting on the
- question in 2 or more, but less than all, municipalities in the 21
- 22 election vote in favor of the proposition, the 22-month
- 23 prohibition does not apply to those municipalities in which a
- 24 majority of persons voted in favor of the proposition.
