7 games for seniors in the residential high rise where she lived;

10 member of the William V. Banks Grand Lodge Order of the Eastern
11 Star for 25 years, where she was the Worthy Matron of the
12 Christ Love Chapter, leading women in bible study groups and

15 State Jesse White; her sister, Cora; seven of her 10 children;
