SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 5/5-530 rep.20 ILCS 205/205-40230 ILCS 5/28was 20 ILCS 205/40.31from Ch. 8, par. 37-28

Amends the General Provisions and Departments of State Government law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Repeals the Agricultural Export Advisory Committee. Amends the Department of Agriculture Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois and the Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975 to make a conforming change. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

5 Section 5. The Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
6 amended by repealing Section 5-530.

Section 10. The Department of Agriculture Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section 205-40 as follows:

10 (20 ILCS 205/205-40) (was 20 ILCS 205/40.31)

11 Sec. 205-40. Export consulting service and standards. The 12 Department, in cooperation with the Department of Commerce and 13 Economic Opportunity and the Agricultural Export Advisory Committee, shall (1) provide a consulting service to those who 14 15 desire to export farm products, commodities, and supplies and 16 quide them in their efforts to improve trade relations; (2) 17 cooperate with agencies and instrumentalities of the federal 18 government to develop export grade standards for farm products, 19 commodities, and supplies produced in Illinois and adopt 20 reasonable rules and regulations to ensure that exports of 21 those products, commodities, and supplies comply with those standards; (3) upon request and after inspection of any such 22

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farm product, commodity, or supplies, certify compliance or 1 2 with those noncompliance standards; (4) provide an 3 informational program to existing and potential foreign importers of farm products, commodities, and supplies; (5) 4 5 qualify for U. S. Department of Agriculture matching funds for 6 overseas promotion of farm products, commodities, and supplies the federal requirements regarding 7 according to State 8 expenditures that are eligible for matching funds; and (6) 9 provide a consulting service to persons who desire to export 10 processed or value-added agricultural products and assist 11 those persons in ascertaining legal and regulatory 12 restrictions and market preferences that affect the sale of 13 value-added agricultural products in foreign markets.

Section 15. The Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975 is amended by changing Section 28 as follows:

17 (230 ILCS 5/28) (from Ch. 8, par. 37-28)

Sec. 28. Except as provided in subsection (g) of Section 27 of this Act, moneys collected shall be distributed according to the provisions of this Section 28.

(a) Thirty per cent of the total of all monies received by
the State as privilege taxes shall be paid into the
Metropolitan Exposition Auditorium and Office Building Fund in
the State Treasury.

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1 (b) In addition, 4.5% of the total of all monies received 2 by the State as privilege taxes shall be paid into the State 3 treasury into a special Fund to be known as the Metropolitan 4 Exposition, Auditorium, and Office Building Fund.

5 (c) Fifty per cent of the total of all monies received by 6 the State as privilege taxes under the provisions of this Act 7 shall be paid into the Agricultural Premium Fund.

8 (d) Seven per cent of the total of all monies received by 9 the State as privilege taxes shall be paid into the Fair and 10 Exposition Fund in the State treasury; provided, however, that 11 when all bonds issued prior to July 1, 1984 by the Metropolitan 12 Fair and Exposition Authority shall have been paid or payment 13 shall have been provided for upon a refunding of those bonds, thereafter 1/12 of \$1,665,662 of such monies shall be paid each 14 month into the Build Illinois Fund, and the remainder into the 15 16 Fair and Exposition Fund. All excess monies shall be allocated 17 to the Department of Agriculture for distribution to county fairs for premiums and rehabilitation as set forth in the 18 19 Agricultural Fair Act.

(e) The monies provided for in Section 30 shall be paidinto the Illinois Thoroughbred Breeders Fund.

(f) The monies provided for in Section 31 shall be paidinto the Illinois Standardbred Breeders Fund.

(g) Until January 1, 2000, that part representing 1/2 of
the total breakage in Thoroughbred, Harness, Appaloosa,
Arabian, and Quarter Horse racing in the State shall be paid

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into the Illinois Race Track Improvement Fund as established in
 Section 32.

3 (h) All other monies received by the Board under this Act4 shall be paid into the Horse Racing Fund.

5 (i) The salaries of the Board members, secretary, stewards, mutuels, veterinarians, 6 directors of representatives, accountants, clerks, stenographers, inspectors and other 7 8 employees of the Board, and all expenses of the Board incident 9 to the administration of this Act, including, but not limited 10 to, all expenses and salaries incident to the taking of saliva 11 and urine samples in accordance with the rules and regulations 12 of the Board shall be paid out of the Agricultural Premium 13 Fund.

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(j) The Agricultural Premium Fund shall also be used:

(1) for the expenses of operating the Illinois State
Fair and the DuQuoin State Fair, including the payment of
prize money or premiums;

18 (2) for the distribution to county fairs, vocational 19 agriculture section fairs, agricultural societies, and 20 agricultural extension clubs in accordance with the 21 Agricultural Fair Act, as amended;

(3) for payment of prize monies and premiums awarded and for expenses incurred in connection with the International Livestock Exposition and the Mid-Continent Livestock Exposition held in Illinois, which premiums, and awards must be approved, and paid by the Illinois

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1 Department of Agriculture;

2 (4) for personal service of county agricultural
3 advisors and county home advisors;

4 (5) for distribution to agricultural home economic
5 extension councils in accordance with "An Act in relation
6 to additional support and finance for the Agricultural and
7 Home Economic Extension Councils in the several counties in
8 this State and making an appropriation therefor", approved
9 July 24, 1967, as amended;

10 (6) for research on equine disease, including a 11 development center therefor;

12 (7) for training scholarships for study on equine
13 diseases to students at the University of Illinois College
14 of Veterinary Medicine;

(8) for the rehabilitation, repair and maintenance of the Illinois and DuQuoin State Fair Grounds and the structures and facilities thereon and the construction of permanent improvements on such Fair Grounds, including such structures, facilities and property located on such State Fair Grounds which are under the custody and control of the Department of Agriculture;

22 (9) (blank); for the expenses of the Department of 23 Agriculture under Section 5-530 of the Departments of State 24 Government Law (20 ILCS 5/5-530);

(10) for the expenses of the Department of Commerce and
 Economic Opportunity under Sections 605-620, 605-625, and

1 605-630 of the Department of Commerce and Economic 2 Opportunity Law (20 ILCS 605/605-620, 605/605-625, and 3 605/605-630);

4 (11) for remodeling, expanding, and reconstructing
5 facilities destroyed by fire of any Fair and Exposition
6 Authority in counties with a population of 1,000,000 or
7 more inhabitants;

8 (12) for the purpose of assisting in the care and 9 general rehabilitation of veterans with disabilities of 10 any war and their surviving spouses and orphans;

(13) for expenses of the Department of State Police for
duties performed under this Act;

13 (14) for the Department of Agriculture for soil surveys14 and soil and water conservation purposes;

15 (15) for the Department of Agriculture for grants to
16 the City of Chicago for conducting the Chicagofest;

17 (16) for the State Comptroller for grants and operating
18 expenses authorized by the Illinois Global Partnership
19 Act.

(k) To the extent that monies paid by the Board to the Agricultural Premium Fund are in the opinion of the Governor in excess of the amount necessary for the purposes herein stated, the Governor shall notify the Comptroller and the State Treasurer of such fact, who, upon receipt of such notification, shall transfer such excess monies from the Agricultural Premium Fund to the General Revenue Fund.
