AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented 2 in the General Assembly: 3

ARTICLE 0.2 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and reappropriations for State fiscal years 2017 and 2018. Articles 1 through 10 are for fiscal year 2017. Articles 11

8 through 41 are for fiscal year 2018. Articles 0.5 and 0.8 apply to both fiscal years. 9

ARTICLE 0.5

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a 11 12 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made 13 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School 14 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the 15 16 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed 17 18 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by 19 the State.

Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

Section 20. 6 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond 8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for 9 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build 10 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such 11 purposes.

Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

19 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as 20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development 21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for 22 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,

architectural planning, development, alteration, installation, and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as 6 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development 8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for 9 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing, 10 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation, and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings, 11 12 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act 13 14 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as 11 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond 13 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants for acquisition, construction, renovation and equipping 14 15 new charter schools, to a silver certification from the United States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and 16 17 Environmental Design Green Building Rating System as 18 approximated below:
