SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017. Effective immediately.

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 0.5

It is the intent of the State that all or a Section 1. 6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made 7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation 9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the 10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed 11 12 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State. 13

14 ARTICLE 0.8

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES 15

Section 1. Appropriations to the Department of Natural 16 Resources including those in Article 4 and Articles 13 through 17 15 may be used for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2017. 18
