## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

305 ILCS 5/12-4.11

from Ch. 23, par. 12-4.11

Amends the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that grant amounts under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program may not vary on the basis of a TANF recipient's county of residence. Increases TANF grant amounts to: 30% of federal poverty guidelines beginning October 1, 2018; 40% of federal poverty guidelines beginning October 1, 2019; and 50% of federal poverty guidelines beginning October 1, 2020. Provides that beginning October 1, 2021, and each October 1 thereafter, TANF grant amounts shall be annually adjusted to remain equal to 50% of the most recent federal poverty guidelines for each family size. Provides that TANF grants for child-only assistance units shall be at least 75% of TANF grants for assistance units of the same size that consist of a caretaker relative with children. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by 5 changing Section 12-4.11 as follows:

6 (305 ILCS 5/12-4.11) (from Ch. 23, par. 12-4.11)

Sec. 12-4.11. Grant amounts. The Department, with due regard for and subject to budgetary limitations, shall establish grant amounts for each of the programs, by regulation. The grant amounts may vary by program, size of assistance unit and geographic area. <u>Grant amounts under the</u> <u>Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program may not</u> vary on the basis of a TANF recipient's county of residence.

Aid payments shall not be reduced except: (1) for changes in the cost of items included in the grant amounts, or (2) for changes in the expenses of the recipient, or (3) for changes in the income or resources available to the recipient, or (4) for changes in grants resulting from adoption of a consolidated grant amount.

20 <u>The maximum benefit levels provided to TANF recipients</u> 21 <u>shall increase according to the following schedule: (A)</u> 22 <u>beginning October 1, 2018, the Department of Human Services</u> 23 <u>shall increase TANF grant amounts in effect on September 30,</u> - 2 - LRB100 18980 KTG 34232 b

1 2018 to 30% of the most recent United States Department of 2 Health and Human Services Federal Poverty Guidelines for each 3 family size; (B) beginning October 1, 2019, the Department of 4 Human Services shall increase TANF grant amounts in effect on 5 September 30, 2019 to 40% of the most recent United States Department of Health and Human Services Federal Poverty 6 7 Guidelines for each family size; (C) beginning October 1, 2020, the Department of Human Services shall increase TANF grant 8 9 amounts in effect on September 30, 2020 to 50% of the most 10 recent United States Department of Health and Human Services 11 Federal Poverty Guidelines for each family size; and (D) 12 beginning October 1, 2021 and each October 1 thereafter, the 13 maximum benefit levels shall be annually adjusted to remain 14 equal to 50% of the most recent United States Department of Health and Human Services Federal Poverty Guidelines for each 15 16 family size. 17 TANF grants for child-only assistance units shall be at

18 least 75% of TANF grants for assistance units of the same size 19 that consist of a caretaker relative with children.

20 Subject to appropriation, beginning on July 1, 2008, the 21 Department of Human Services shall increase TANF grant amounts 22 in effect on June 30, 2008 by 15%. The Department is authorized 23 to administer this increase but may not otherwise adopt any 24 rule to implement this increase.

In fixing standards to govern payments or reimbursements for funeral and burial expenses, the Department shall establish

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a minimum allowable amount of not less than \$1,000 for 1 2 Department payment of funeral services and not less than \$500 for Department payment of burial or cremation services. On 3 January 1, 2006, July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, the Department 4 5 shall increase the minimum reimbursement amount for funeral and 6 burial expenses under this Section by a percentage equal to the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban 7 8 Consumers, if any, during the 12 months immediately preceding 9 that January 1 or July 1. In establishing the minimum allowable 10 amount, the Department shall take into account the services 11 essential to a dignified, low-cost (i) funeral and (ii) burial 12 cremation, including reasonable amounts that may be or 13 necessary for burial space and cemetery charges, and any 14 applicable taxes or other required governmental fees or 15 charges. If no person has agreed to pay the total cost of the 16 (i) funeral and (ii) burial or cremation charges, the 17 Department shall pay the vendor the actual costs of the (i) funeral and (ii) burial or cremation, or the minimum allowable 18 amount for each service as established by the Department, 19 whichever is less, provided that the Department reduces its 20 payments by the amount available from the following sources: 21 22 decedent's assets and available resources and the the 23 anticipated amounts of any death benefits available to the decedent's estate, and amounts paid and arranged to be paid by 24 decedent's legally responsible relatives. A legally 25 the 26 responsible relative is expected to pay (i) funeral and (ii)

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burial or cremation expenses unless financially unable to do so.

3 Nothing contained in this Section or in any other Section 4 of this Code shall be construed to prohibit the Illinois 5 Department (1) from consolidating existing standards on the 6 basis of any standards which are or were in effect on, or 7 subsequent to July 1, 1969, or (2) from employing any consolidated standards in determining need for public aid and 8 9 the amount of money payment or grant for individual recipients 10 or recipient families.
