1 SENATE RESOLUTION 2 WHEREAS, It is in the interest of the State of Illinois to 3 keep communities safe and to encourage crimes to be reported; 4 and 5 WHEREAS, Through information gathered from law enforcement 6 participation in programs like "Secure Communities", 62% of 7 people targeted have committed no crime or a minor infraction 8 with no serious threat to public safety or national security; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security has been arresting victims of and witnesses to crimes; and 11 12 WHEREAS, There has been a drop in the reporting of violent 13 crimes in the wake of United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) targeting the victims and witnesses of crimes 14 due to their immigration status; and 15 16 WHEREAS, The use of State resources for the purpose of 17 enforcing federal immigration law is voluntary; and 18 WHEREAS, Restrictions on spending State resources to

enforce immigration law does not hinder the prosecution of

those who break the law, whatever their immigration status; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security issues
- 2 detainers without probable cause and does not allow for
- 3 channels for individuals to challenge the detainers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security has issued
- 5 detainers against U.S. citizens and long-term permanent
- 6 residents; and
- 7 WHEREAS, These procedures violate the Fourth and Fifth
- 8 Amendments of the United States Constitution; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The federal government will not indemnify the
- 10 State for costs and liabilities incurred as a result of
- 11 enforcing federal immigration law; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Illinois is currently suffering through a budget
- 13 crisis; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Undocumented immigrants contribute \$758 million
- dollars in taxes to the State of Illinois; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Six percent of Illinois family households include
- 17 at least one undocumented immigrant; and
- 18 WHEREAS, 126,000 families with native born children have at

- least one undocumented parent; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The fear of deportation of family members leads
- 3 children to fear attending school; and
- WHEREAS, It is in the interest of the State of Illinois
- 5 that children remain in school and receive the best education
- 6 possible; and
- WHEREAS, A policy that will encourage children to remain in
- 8 school and residents to report criminal activity without fear
- 9 of deportation is beneficial for the health and welfare of the
- 10 State of Illinois and its residents; therefore, be it
- 11 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL
- 12 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the State of
- 13 Illinois to cease expending State resources on enforcement of
- 14 federal immigration law.
