4 (a-5) If the redevelopment project area is located within a 5 transit facility improvement area established pursuant to 6 Section 11-74.4-3, the estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to 7 8 finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds 9 under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of 10 the year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer, as 11 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act, is to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 35th 12 13 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving 14 the redevelopment project area was adopted.

15 (a-7) A municipality may adopt tax increment financing for 16 a redevelopment project area located in a transit facility improvement area that also includes real property located 17 within an existing redevelopment project area established 18 prior to August 12, 2016 (the effective date of Public Act 19 20 99-792). In such case: (i) the provisions of this Division shall apply with respect to the previously established 21 22 redevelopment project area until the municipality adopts, as 23 required in accordance with applicable provisions of this 24 Division, an ordinance dissolving the special tax allocation 25 fund for such redevelopment project area and terminating the 26 designation of such redevelopment project area as а

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redevelopment project area; and (ii) after the effective date of the ordinance described in (i), the provisions of this Division shall apply with respect to the subsequently established redevelopment project area located in a transit facility improvement area.

6 (b) The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to finance 7 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under 8 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the 9 10 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as 11 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 32nd 12 13 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving 14 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was 15 adopted on September 9, 1999 by the Village of Downs.

16 The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to finance 17 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under 18 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the 19 20 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is 21 22 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 33rd 23 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving 24 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was 25 adopted on May 20, 1985 by the Village of Wheeling.

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The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment

(f-3) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax 7 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8 8 9 only, shall be not more than 47 years for the redevelopment 10 project area that was established on December 20, 1986 by the City of Charleston; provided that (i) the City of Charleston 11 adopts an ordinance extending the life of the redevelopment 12 13 project area to 47 years and (ii) the City of Charleston 14 provides notice to the taxing bodies that would otherwise 15 constitute the joint review board for the redevelopment project area not more than 30 and not less than 14 days prior to the 16 adoption of that ordinance. 17

(f-5) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax 18 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8 19 20 only, shall be not more than 47 years for redevelopment project areas that were established on December 29, 1981 by the City of 21 22 Springfield; provided that (i) the City of Springfield adopts 23 an ordinance extending the life of the redevelopment project 24 area to 47 years and (ii) the City of Springfield provides 25 notice to the taxing bodies that would otherwise constitute the 26 joint review board for the redevelopment project area not more

1 than 30 and not less than 14 days prior to the adoption of that 2 ordinance.

3 (g) In consolidating the material relating to completion 4 dates from Sections 11-74.4-3 and 11-74.4-7 into this Section, 5 it is not the intent of the General Assembly to make any 6 substantive change in the law, except for the extension of the completion dates for the City of Aurora, the Village of Milan, 7 the City of West Frankfort, the Village of Libertyville, and 8 9 the Village of Hoffman Estates set forth under items (67), 10 (68), (69), (70), and (71) of subsection (c) of this Section.
