## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2310/2310-330

was 20 ILCS 2310/55.46

Amends the Department of Public Health Powers and Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Requires the Department of Public Health to require each sperm bank operating in this State to keep records of the name and contact information of each sperm donor for a period of 50 years following the donation of sperm. Provides that before any sperm donor makes a donation at a sperm bank, the sperm bank shall require the sperm donor to agree in writing that he has no expectation of anonymity with regard to his donation and that his biological child may be provided with his contact information upon request of the child or the child's parent or guardian if the child is under the age of 18. Provides that the sperm bank shall provide the sperm donor's contact information to the Department and to the biological child of the sperm donor upon request of the child or the parent or guardian of the child if the child is under the age of 18. Requires the Department to create and maintain a database of the sperm donors' names and contact information provided by the sperm bank. Requires the Department to make the name and contact information of a sperm donor available to that sperm donor's verified biological child upon request. Defines "sperm donor".

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and 5 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is 6 amended by changing Section 2310-330 as follows:

8 Sec. 2310-330. Sperm and tissue bank registry; <u>sperm donor</u>
 9 <u>records;</u> AIDS test for donors; penalties.

(a) The Department shall establish a registry of all sperm 10 11 banks and tissue banks operating in this State. All sperm banks and tissue banks operating in this State shall register with 12 the Department by May 1 of each year. Any person, hospital, 13 14 clinic, corporation, partnership, or other legal entity that operates a sperm bank or tissue bank in this State and fails to 15 16 register with the Department pursuant to this Section commits a 17 business offense and shall be subject to a fine of \$5000.

18 <u>(a-5) The Department shall require each sperm bank</u> 19 <u>operating in this State to keep records of the name and contact</u> 20 <u>information of each sperm donor for a period of 50 years</u> 21 <u>following the donation of sperm. The sperm bank shall provide</u> 22 <u>those records to the Department and to the biological child of</u> 23 <u>the sperm donor upon the biological child's request or upon the</u> HB2140

# request of the biological child's parent or guardian if the biological child is under the age of 18.

3 Before any sperm donor makes a donation at a sperm bank, the sperm bank shall require the sperm donor to agree in 4 5 writing that he has no expectation of anonymity with regard to his donation and that his biological child may be provided with 6 7 his contact information upon request of the child or the child's parent or guardian if the child is under the age of 18. 8 9 The Department shall create and maintain a database of the sperm donors' names and contact information provided by each 10 11 sperm bank. Upon request and the presentation of proof adequate 12 for the Department to determine the truth of the biological 13 child's identity, the Department shall make the name and 14 contact information of a sperm donor available to that sperm donor's biological child or the biological child's parent or 15 16 quardian if the biological child is under the age of 18.

17 All donors of semen for purposes of artificial (b) insemination, or donors of corneas, bones, organs, or other 18 human tissue for the purpose of injecting, transfusing, or 19 transplanting any of them in the human body, shall be tested 20 21 for evidence of exposure to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) 22 any other identified causative agent of acquired and 23 immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) at the time of or after the 24 donation but prior to the semen, corneas, bones, organs, or 25 other human tissue being made available for that use. However, 26 when in the opinion of the attending physician the life of a

recipient of a bone, organ, or other human tissue donation would be jeopardized by delays caused by testing for evidence of exposure to HIV and any other causative agent of AIDS, testing shall not be required.

5 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c-5), no 6 person may intentionally, knowingly, recklessly, or negligently use the semen, corneas, bones, organs, or other 7 8 human tissue of a donor unless the requirements of subsection 9 (b) have been met. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 10 (c-5), no person may intentionally, knowingly, recklessly, or 11 negligently use the semen, corneas, bones, organs, or other 12 human tissue of a donor who has tested positive for exposure to 13 HIV or any other identified causative agent of AIDS. Violation 14 of this subsection (c) shall be a Class 4 felony.

15 (c-5) It is not a violation of this Section for a person to 16 perform a solid organ transplant of an organ from an HIV 17 infected donor to a person who has tested positive for exposure to HIV or any other identified causative agent of AIDS and who 18 is in immediate threat of death unless the transplant is 19 20 performed. A tissue bank that provides an organ from an HIV infected donor under this subsection (c-5) may not 21 be 22 criminally or civilly liable for the furnishing of that organ 23 under this subsection (c-5).

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(d) For the purposes of this Section:

25 "Human tissue" shall not be construed to mean organs or 26 whole blood or its component parts.

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"Tissue bank" has the same meaning as set forth in the
 Illinois Anatomical Gift Act.

3 "Solid organ transplant" means the surgical 4 transplantation of internal organs including, but not limited 5 to, the liver, kidney, pancreas, lungs, or heart. "Solid organ 6 transplant" does not mean a bone marrow based transplant or a 7 blood transfusion.

8 <u>"Sperm donor" means a person who donates semen to a sperm</u> 9 bank for the purposes of artificial insemination.

10 "HIV infected donor" means a deceased donor who was 11 infected with HIV or a living donor known to be infected with 12 HIV and who is willing to donate a part or all of one or more of 13 his or her organs. A determination of the donor's HIV infection 14 is made by the donor's medical history or by specific tests 15 that document HIV infection, such as HIV RNA or DNA, or by 16 antibodies to HIV.
