1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Health in All Policies Act.
- Section 5. Definition. In this Act, "health in all policies framework" means a public health framework through which policymakers and stakeholders in the public and private sectors use a collaborative approach to improve health outcomes and reduce health inequities in the State by incorporating health considerations into decision-making across sectors and policy areas.

- 1 (e) To the extent practicable, the members of the workgroup 2 shall reflect the geographic, racial, ethnic, cultural, and
- 3 gender diversity of the State.
- 4 (f) Workgroup members shall serve without compensation but
 5 may be reimbursed for their travel expenses from funds
 6 appropriated for that purpose.
- 7 (g) A State agency or entity shall provide information 8 requested by the workgroup in a timely manner.
 - (h) The Department of Public Health shall provide administrative and other support to the workgroup.
- 11 (i) The workgroup shall meet at least twice a year and at 12 other times as it deems appropriate. The workgroup shall 13 report that summarizes its work and prepare a recommendations resulting from its study. The workgroup shall 14 15 submit the report of its findings and recommendations to the 16 General Assembly by December 31, 2020 and by December 31 of 17 each year thereafter.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2020.
