## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

50 ILCS 706/10-15 50 ILCS 706/10-25

Amends the Law Enforcement Officer-Worn Body Camera Act. Provides that all law enforcement agencies must use officer-worn body cameras subject to the Act. Provides that each law enforcement agency must provide an annual report on the use of officer-worn body cameras to the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Law Enforcement Officer-Worn Body Camera Act
- is amended by changing Sections 10-15 and 10-25 as follows:
- 6 (50 ILCS 706/10-15)
- 7 Sec. 10-15. Applicability. All Any law enforcement
- 8 agencies must use <del>agency which employs the use of</del> officer-worn
- 9 body cameras is subject to the provisions of this Act, whether
- or not the agency receives or has received monies from the Law
- 11 Enforcement Camera Grant Fund.

- 14 Sec. 10-25. Reporting.
- 15 (a) Each law enforcement agency which employs the use of
- 16 officer worn body cameras must provide an annual report on the
- use of officer-worn body cameras to the Board, on or before May
- 18 1 of the year. The report shall include:
- 19 (1) a brief overview of the makeup of the agency,
- 20 including the number of officers utilizing officer-worn
- 21 body cameras;
- 22 (2) the number of officer-worn body cameras utilized by

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- 2 (3) any technical issues with the equipment and how those issues were remedied;
  - (4) a brief description of the review process used by supervisors within the law enforcement agency;
    - (5) for each recording used in prosecutions of conservation, criminal, or traffic offenses or municipal ordinance violations:
- 9 (A) the time, date, location, and precinct of the incident;
- 11 (B) the offense charged and the date charges were
  12 filed; and
- 13 (6) any other information relevant to the administration of the program.
- 15 (b) On or before July 30 of each year, the Board must 16 analyze the law enforcement agency reports and provide an 17 annual report to the General Assembly and the Governor.
