## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 375/6.16 new 215 ILCS 5/356z.33 new 305 ILCS 5/5-40 new

Amends the State Employees Group Insurance Act of 1971, Illinois Insurance Code, and the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that pasteurized donated human breast milk shall be covered under health insurance and the medical assistance program under the Illinois Public Aid Code. Describes the requirements that must be met to have pasteurized human breast milk covered under health insurance and the medical assistance program. Effective January 1, 2020.

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AN ACT concerning regulation.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Employees Group Insurance Act of 1971
is amended by adding Section 6.16 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 375/6.16 new)

7 Sec. 6.16. Human breast milk coverage. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, pasteurized donated human breast 8 9 milk, which may include human milk fortifiers if indicated by a 10 prescribing licensed medical practitioner, shall be covered under a health plan for persons who are otherwise eligible for 11 coverage under this Act, if the covered person is an infant 12 under the age of 6 months, a physician prescribes the milk for 13 14 the covered person, and:

15 (1) the milk is obtained from a human milk bank that 16 meets quality quidelines established by the Human Milk 17 Banking Association of North America, or that is licensed 18 by the Department of Public Health;

19(2) a licensed medical practitioner has issued an order20for an infant who is medically or physically unable to21receive maternal breast milk or participate in breast22feeding or whose mother is medically or physically unable23to produce maternal breast milk in sufficient quantities or

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1	Sec. 5-40. Human breast milk coverage. Notwithstanding any
2	other provision of this Act, pasteurized donated human breast
3	milk, which may include human milk fortifiers if indicated by a
4	prescribing licensed medical practitioner, shall be covered
5	under a health plan for persons who are otherwise eligible for
6	coverage under this Act, if the covered person is an infant
7	under the age of 6 months, a physician prescribes the milk for
8	the covered person, and:
9	(1) the milk is obtained from a human milk bank that
10	meets quality guidelines established by the Human Milk
11	Banking Association of North America, or that is licensed
12	by the Department of Public Health;
13	(2) a licensed medical practitioner has issued an order
14	for an infant who is medically or physically unable to
15	<u>receive maternal breast milk or participate in breast</u>
16	feeding or whose mother is medically or physically unable
17	to produce maternal breast milk in sufficient quantities or
18	participate in breast feeding despite optimal lactation
19	support; or
20	(3) a licensed medical practitioner has issued an order
21	for an infant who meets any of the following conditions:
22	(A) a body weight below healthy levels determined
23	by the licensed medical practitioner;
24	(B) a congenital or acquired condition that places
25	the infant at a high risk for development of
26	necrotizing enterocolitis; or

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Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
1, 2020.
