

## 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 HB4249

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

735 ILCS 5/13-214.1

from Ch. 110, par. 13-214.1

Amends the Code of Civil Procedure. Provides that a 10-year limitation period for actions arising out of specified criminal acts is applicable to causes of action accruing on or after July 1, 2009.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Code of Civil Procedure is amended by changing Section 13-214.1 as follows:
- 6 (735 ILCS 5/13-214.1) (from Ch. 110, par. 13-214.1)
- 7 Sec. 13-214.1. Action for damages involving criminal acts.
- 8 (a) Actions for damages for an injury described in Section 9 13-202 or Section 13-203 arising out of first degree murder or 10 the commission of a Class X felony by the person against whom 11 the action is brought may be commenced no later than 10 years 12 after the person who inflicted such injury has completed his or
- 13 her sentence therefor.
- 14 (b) For an action for damages arising out of: theft of property exceeding \$100,000 in value under Section 16-1 of the 15 16 Criminal Code of 2012; identity theft under subsection (a) of Section 16-30 of the Criminal Code of 2012; aggravated identity 17 theft under subsection (b) of Section 16-30 of the Criminal 18 19 Code of 2012; financial exploitation of an elderly person or a person with a disability under Section 17-56 of the Criminal 20 21 Code of 2012; or any offense set forth in Article 16H or Section 17-10.6 of the Criminal Code of 2012, the action may be 22 commenced within 10 years of the last act committed in 2.3

- 1 furtherance of the crime. However, if any other provision of
- 2 law provides for a longer limitation period, then the longer
- 3 limitation period applies. This subsection applies to causes of
- 4 action accruing on or after July 1, 2009.
