SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates \$5,400,000 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for grants to specified police departments for the purpose of each department hiring 2 additional police officers in the mitigation of firearm-related violence. Effective July 1, 2020.
