SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-20.5

from Ch. 122, par. 27-20.5

Amends the School Code. Provides that, beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the teaching of the history of women must include instruction on the significant advancements, discoveries, and contributions made by women in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section 27-20.5 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/27-20.5) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-20.5)
- Sec. 27-20.5. Study of the History of Women. Every public 7 elementary school and high school shall include in 8 9 curriculum a unit of instruction studying the events of the history of women in America. These events shall include not 10 only the contributions made by individual women in government, 11 12 the arts, sciences, education, and in the economic, cultural, 13 and political development of Illinois and of the United States, 14 but shall also include a study of women's struggles to gain the right to vote and to be treated equally as they strive to earn 15 16 and occupy positions of merit in our society.
 - Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the teaching of the history of women must include instruction on the significant advancements, discoveries, and contributions made by women in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).
- The State Superintendent of Education may prepare and make available to all school boards instructional materials that may

- 1 be used as guidelines for development of a unit of instruction
- 2 under this Section. Each school board shall determine the
- 3 minimum amount of instructional time that shall qualify as a
- 4 unit of instruction satisfying the requirements of this
- 5 Section.
