1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. The following named sums, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
7 hereinafter named, are appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of the

 16 Department's various institutions are to include construction,
 17 reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of
 18 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials and
 19 all other expenses required for roof and other types of repairs
 20 and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase of land.

21 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
 22 for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from

2 Section 20. The amount of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of

5 to statewide hospitalization services.

6 Section 25. The amount of \$7,775,375, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2020, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made in Article 111, Section 25 of Public Act 101-0007, as
10 amended, is reappropriated to the Department of Corrections
11 from the General Revenue Fund for expenses related to the
12 necessary replacement of aging and unreliable telecommunication
13 systems.

14 Section 30. The amount of \$4,560,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for payment of late
17 interest penalties incurred on warrants issued from the General

10 Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender
 12 Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board for
 13 the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management Board
 14 Act including, but not limited to, sex offender evaluation,
 15 treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. Funding received
