4 Section 1. Legislative Intent. The General Assembly recognizes that there are historically underserved populations 5 in the State of Illinois who have been overlooked and 6 7 discriminated against over the course of this state's history. Today, as Illinois is confronted with an unprecedented public 8 9 health and economic crisis, these inequities appear more 10 starkly than ever - with our communities of color facing higher 11 infection rates, higher mortality rates, higher unemployment 12 rates, and the looming threat of continued exclusion in a time when equity and just distribution of resources are more vital 13 14 than ever. The General Assembly recognizes these injustices, 15 and seeks to address them here. It is the intent of this General 16 Assembly to assist our communities most in need with the funds 17 made available by the passage of the CARES Act. Like the 18 implementation of programs that feed our hungriest children, 19 care for our most vulnerable, and provide the services upon 20 which the residents across our state rely. It is the will of the General Assembly that every state agency, commission, and 21 22 board will work to use this funding to aid and empower historically and presently disproportionately underserved 23

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1 communities. For the purposes of this article, "disproportionately underserved communities" includes, but is 2 not limited to, children living in households that meet the 3 4 free lunch or breakfast eligibility guidelines established by the federal government pursuant to Section 1758 of the federal 5 6 Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758; 7 7 C.F.R. 245 et seq.), or those living at or below 133% of the Federal Poverty Level, or those eligible for the Supplemental 8 9 Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and those persons eligible

for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) assistance.
